

ORDINANCE NO. 64-13

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE ANNEXATION OF ADJACENT AND CONTIGUOUS TERRITORY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:


SECTION 1. That the following described territory be, and the same is, hereby annexed to and declared a part of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of the North half of the Southwest quarter of Section 35, Township 9 North, Range 1 West; running thence East 2639 feet along and with the South line of said North half of said quarter section to the Southeast corner of said North Half of said quarter section; thence North 225 feet and to the South line of the Illinois Central Railroad Company right of way; thence in a Westerly direction along and with the South line of said Railroad right of way for a distance of 2723 feet and to the West line of said North half of said quarter section; thence South 849 feet along and with the West line of said North half of said Quarter section and to the place of beginning, containing in all 35 acres, more or less, all in Monroe County, Indiana.


SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the boundaries of the City of Bloomington shall be, and the same are, hereby declared to be extended so as to include all the real estate hereinabove described as a part of the City of Bloomington, Indiana.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, promulgation and publication in accordance with the law.


