An Ordinance providing for Safety of Pedestrians where sidewalks are obstructed or blocked during razing, remodelling, or construction of buildings.'

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the owner of any property during the razing, remodelling or construction of any building or other facilities to see that proper safety is provided at all times for pedestrians using the sidewalk adjoining such building or facility.

SECTION 2. If it shall be necessary to obstruct or block a sidewalk for a period in excess of twenty-four hours, the owner of such property shall provide a walk-around for such area, which walk-around shall consist of a walk not less than four (4) feet wide and protected by railings five (5) feet high on each side and provided with electric lighting at night.

SECTION 3. Before causing any blocking or obstruction of a sidewalk, the provisions of Section 2 shall be accomplished by the owner and the same shall be approved by the Chief of Police of the City of Bloomington before such razing, remodelling or construction shall be commenced.

SECTION 4. Failure on the part of any owner to conform to these regulations shall cause any permit for such work to be revoked by the City of Bloomington.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, promulgation and publication in accordance with the law.
