

ORDINANCE NO. 5, 1956

An Ordinance authorizing the sale of personal property in amounts not exceeding the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

WHEREAS, by Section 50 of the Acts of 1905, Chapter 129, the Common Council has authority to sell and convey property belonging to a city, and

WHEREAS, by said section the Common Council has the authority to authorize the sale of personal property in the sum of not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) without an appraisalment, and,

WHEREAS, it would be to the advantage of the City to sell certain personal property without an appraisalment;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON:

Section 1. That hereafter any and all sales of surplus or obsolete personal property to be held by the City of Bloomington, when the sale thereof does not exceed in value the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) the same shall be sold without an appraisalment;

Section 2. The proceeds from all such sales shall be deposited to the department from which such personal property shall be sold.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and the approval of the Mayor of Bloomington.
