

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE
NO. 4, 1956

an Ordinance specially appropriating from the General Funds and Special Funds not otherwise appropriated of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, and reducing funds heretofore appropriated for the use of Departments of said City, to meet the extraordinary emergencies found to exist in the various Departments.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, Monroe County:

Section 1. That there be, and hereby is appropriated from the General Funds of said City, not otherwise appropriated, to meet the extraordinary emergencies found to exist for the expenditures of more money for the current year, 1956, than was set out in detail in the budget as finally adopted, and appropriations as finally made, the following sums to the Funds and Departments of the City of Bloomington, Indiana.
