APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE NO. 2, 1954

CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA

An Ordinance Specially appropriating from the General Funds and Special Funds not otherwise appropriated of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, and reducing funds heretofore appropriated for the use of Departments of said City, to meet the extraordinary emergencies found to exist in the various departments.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana:

Section 1. That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the General Funds of said City, not otherwise appropriated, to meet the extraordinary emergencies found to exist for the expenditure of more money for the current year, 1954, then was set out in detail in the Budget as finally adopted, and appropriations as finally made, the following sums to the funds and Departments of the City of Bloomington, Indiana:

(It was found necessary to purchase more record books than were anticipated at the time of preparing the 1954 Budget)

2. City Judge

(a) #721 - Furniture and Fixtures

(The equipment to be purchased cost more than was estimated at the time of preparing the 1954 Budget)

Section 3. That there be, and hereby is, reduced from certain funds of the various Departments of said City, hereinafter referred to, for the reason that the amounts previously appropriated are in excess of actual needs at this time, and these funds may be returned to the unappropriated funds of the General or Special Funds from which they were appropriated, as follows:

Parking Meter Fund - #61 - Interest -2.
