



APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE NO. 3, 1953

An Ordinance specially appropriating from the General Funds not otherwise appropriated of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, and reducing funds heretofore appropriated for the use of Departments of said City, to meet the extraordinary emergencies found to exist in the various Departments.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana:

Section 1. That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the General Funds of said City, not otherwise appropriated, to meet the extraordinary emergency found to exist for the expenditure of more money for the current year, 1953, than was set out in detail in the Budget as finally adopted, and appropriations as finally made, the following sums to the funds and Departments of the City of Bloomington, Indiana:

1. Department of Law

(a) #38 - General Supplies	\$265.00
#55 - Dues - National Institute of Municipal Law Officers	57.50

The emergencies which require additional appropriations in the above items were brought about because it has been found necessary to purchase books and other supplies for the legal department and at the time of preparing the annual budget the item of dues for the National Institute of Municipal Law Officers was overlooked.

2. Board of Health

(a) #11 - Salary for City Nurse	\$600.00
(b) #214 - Telephone	50.00
(c) #361 - Official Records	60.00

The additional appropriation for salaries is needed because of the addition of a nurse to the Board of Health Staff. Additional amounts are required for telephone and official records because the costs and amounts needed are greater than anticipated in the annual budget.

3. City Administration

(a) #251 - Repairs to Building	\$500.00
(b) #57 - Taxes	10.00
(c) #72 - Equipment for City Hall	100.00

The items for repairs to buildings and equipment for City Hall are required because of unforeseen repairs to the building and replacement of equipment. The taxes were found to be delinquent in checking the County Records and had not been anticipated in the annual budget.

Section 2. That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the Special Funds of the respective department of said city, not otherwise appropriated:

1. Rosehill Cemetery

(a) #11 - Salaries	\$175.00
(b) #216 - Travel Expense	25.00

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| (c) #221 - Electric Current | \$ 50.00 |
| (d) #38 - General Supplies  | 29.55    |
| (e) #725 - Office Equipment | 35.00    |

The emergency which requires these appropriations is that these items in the annual budget were estimated lower than the actual expenditures, also it was found necessary to buy a typewriter for this department.

## 2. Park Maintenance

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| (a) #24 - Printing and Advertising                     | \$100.00    |
| (b) #251-2 - Repair Building and Streets               | 300.00      |
| (c) #261 - Abstracts of Title - Bryan Park Lots        | 450.00      |
| (d) #262 - Court Costs - Sales                         | 27.50       |
| (e) #263 - Engineering, Grading, Seeding<br>Bryan Park | \$12,000.00 |
| (f) #33 - General Supplies                             | 300.00      |
| (g) #41 - Materials for building furnace               | 100.00      |

The emergency which requires the major part of these appropriations is the beginning of the development of Bryan Park and the cost of the sale of lots to help finance this development. The other items are necessary because the estimate of these costs in the annual budget were lower than the actual expenditures due to increases in costs.

## 3. Aviation Department

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| (a) #44 - Seed and Fertilizer | \$200.00 |
| (b) #57 - Taxes               | 120.00   |

The emergency requiring the appropriation for seed and fertilizer is that a newly opened field at the Airport requires protection from erosion. An additional amount is needed for taxes because a check of the County Records discloses taxes due which were not anticipated at the time the annual budget was prepared.

## 4. Parking Meter Fund

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| (a) #11 - Salaries   | \$6,000.00 |
| (b) #241 - Advertising and Publication Notices                                 | 100.00     |
| (c) #261 - Grading, Surfacing, Engineering, and<br>Miscellaneous - Parking Lot | 28,000.00  |

An additional appropriation is required for salaries because this item has exceeded the anticipated amount. The appropriation for advertising and publication notices is required because this item was overlooked in the annual budget. The appropriation for the development of the parking lot was omitted at the time the annual budget was prepared.

Section 3. That there be, and hereby is, reduced from certain funds of the various departments of said City, hereinafter referred to, for the reason that the amounts previously appropriated are in excess of actual needs, and these funds may be returned to the unappropriated funds of the General of Special Funds from which they were appropriated, as follows:
