ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, COUNTY OF MONROE, STATE OF INDIANA, SPECIAL APPROPRIATION No. 1, 1950

An Ordinance specially appropriating from the general funds of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, not otherwise appropriated and appropriating said sums to the following funds in the following departments of said City, and transferring from the funds of the department of said City hereinafter named, here-tofore appropriated to said department and appropriat-ing said sums to the following funds of the said de-partment of said City, to meet the extraordinary emergency found to exist for the various purposes more specifically set out in said Ordinance.

Be It Ordained, by the common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana;

Section 1: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general funds of said City, not otherwise appropriated, to meet the extraordinary emergency found to exist for the expenditure of more money for the current year, 1950, than was set out in de-tail in the budget as finally adopted and appropriations as finally made, the following sums to the following funds in the following departments of the City of Bloomington, Indiana:

The emergency which required the additional appropriation in the above item was incident to Cause No. 27277 in the Monroe Cir-cuit Court entitled In the Matter of the Appraisement and Sale of Surplus City Property of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, as a result of which legal proceedings there was sold at public sale, according to law, surplus property for which the City realized cash proceeds in the sum of \$3,695.50. When the 1950 budget was prepared, these legal proceedings had not been concluded (they prepared, these legal proceedings had not been concluded (they were concluded on November 19, 1949) and since these proceedings had not been concluded it was impossible to anticipate the exact amount of court costs which would be owing in the same.

The emergency which required the additional appropriations in the above two items was brought about by the reason of the fact that Rosehill Cemetery was required to hire extra men during the summer months of 1949 because of extra wet weather to keep the grass down and under control, and the waterrates were increased during the year, 1949, which water rate increase was not taken into a ccount when the 1950 appropriation was made.

The emergency which required the additional appropriations in the above three items was brought about by reason of the fact that during the year, 1949, more garage and motor repairs and clothing allowance were required than was anticipated when the 1950 budget was adopted.

The emergency which required the additional appropriations in the bove items came about as a result of the fact that by Resolution by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, and by authorization of the United States Government on November 1, 1949, Bruner Courts, a veterans' housing facility located south of the City of Bloomington which had theretofore been operated by the United States Government, although located on City real estate, was turned over to the City of Bloomington with the right of the City of Bloomington to receive all income, and to pay all costs of operation, of said Bruner Courts from and after said date of November 1, 1949. For this reason it was im-possible, when the 1950 budget was being prepared, to anticipate the need for budgeted items of expenditure incident to the operation of Bruner Courts.

Section 2: That there be, and hereby is, transferred from the funds of the department of said City hereinafter named, heretofore appropriated to said department, and appropriating the sums to said department of said City to meet the extraordinary emergency found to exist, for the expenditure of more money for the current year, 1950, than was set out in detail in the budget as finally adopted and appropriations as finally made, the following sums to the following funds in said department of the City of Bloomington, Indiana:

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The emergency which required the transfer and a dditional appropriations in the above items was brought about by reason of the fact that when the 1950 budget was prepared it was thought that the items originally budgeted would be utilized as expenditures on a city-owend automobile, whereas, it has now been determined that the travelling to be done by the Enforcement Health Officer will be dones in his own automobile which he is leasing to the City for use during the year, 1950.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and a fter its passage by the Common Council and its approval by the Mayor, subject to the approval of the same by the State Board of Tax Commissioners.
