

**RESOLUTION 02-08**

**RECOGNIZING NSWC CRANE AS A MAJOR INFLUENCE ON THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON AND MONROE COUNTY, AND URGING STATE AND FEDERAL OFFICIALS AS WELL AS CITIZENS TO SUPPORT PRESERVING, STRENGTHENING, AND EXPANDING THIS FACILITY**

- WHEREAS, Crane Division, Naval Surface Warfare Center has been a core resource for Southern Indiana in paying higher wages, advancing education, protecting the environment, and strengthening the social fabric in its sixty-year history; and
- WHEREAS, Crane has one of the highest concentrations of technical and scientific communities in the state of Indiana; and,
- WHEREAS, Crane invests \$4.7 million annually in workforce training, and about \$600,000 annually to Indiana colleges and universities; and
- WHEREAS, Crane provides over \$22 million in state and local tax revenue, including over \$6 million to Monroe County; and
- WHEREAS, Crane provides over 6,700 jobs and \$241 million in wages to citizens of Southern Indiana, including 1300 jobs and \$51 million in wages annually to citizens of Monroe County; and
- WHEREAS, Monroe County employees of Crane earn an average of \$55,000 dollars, compared to \$26,000 dollars for the average Monroe County worker; and
- WHEREAS, 38.1% of Crane employees have attained a BA or higher, compared to Monroe County, 32.9%, Indiana, 15.6%, and U.S.A., 26%; and
- WHEREAS, Crane actively participates in Green Practices, Wildlife Preservation and Research, and National Resources Management and Research; has the largest forest block in Indiana; has allowed Indiana University to conduct a number of significant research projects in the undisturbed habitat found at the base; and has reintroduced the Ruffed Grouse, Wild Turkey, Great Blue Heron, Bald Eagle and Indiana Bat into the wildlife; and
- WHEREAS, Crane employees strengthen the social fabric by providing school tutoring, hosting 50,000 visitors annually, collecting Toys for Tots, donating over 1500 pints of blood annually, supporting minority and handicap awareness programs, serving local service organizations, such as school boards; and
- WHEREAS, Crane provides local, premium jobs that entice succeeding generations to stay in the area; and
- WHEREAS, Crane is under threat of the base realignment and closure authorized for execution in 2005


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Bloomington City Council recognizes NSWC Crane as a major influence on this community, in the revenue it generates, in the quality jobs it provides to Monroe County citizens, and in the diversity of its workforce.

SECTION 2. The Bloomington City Council beseeches state legislators and federal representatives to be proactively involved in preserving, strengthening, and expanding Crane.


SECTION 3. The Bloomington City Council urges Bloomington citizens to actively support efforts to preserve, strengthen, and expand Crane.


