- II. <u>Personnel Update:</u> (Hensley) Dispatch currently has 14 vacant spots. There are currently 4 new hires that are working in the room with trainers as of this week. We have a new hire process going now and have received 40 applications, two of which have experience.

- IV. <u>Statistics:</u> (Hensley) Call volume is staying pretty true to last year. Fire calls increased over last year due to lift assists now being done by the fire department.
- V. Old Business:

Kick off dates have been set for the week of September 12 for Police Protocols.

Chief Diekhoff presented to the Board that he would like to present an amended budget adding \$85.000. This would add a Social Worker in Dispatch starting in 2023. This amount is for salary and benefits. This position would be staffed at peak times with the hope of diverting mental health calls from law enforcement. Angie Purdy with the County has already been consulted on the budget change with no objection. Jeff Underwood, the City Controller, has been consulted as well with approval to add the \$85,000 to the 2023 Central Dispatch budget. Mayor Hamilton has expressed he would like a review committee to study how calls are dispatched from our center.

Motion made to add \$85,000 to the 2023 Central Dispatch Budget for a Social Worker for Dispatch made by Washel and seconded by Brummett. Passed unanimously.

VI. <u>New Business:</u>

Claims – motion made by Brummett and seconded by Washel to accept the claims as presented by City and County. Passed unanimously.
