# Two Items Ready for Discussion at the Committee of the Whole on Wednesday, July 28<sup>th</sup>

There is a resolution (Item One) and an ordinance (Item Two) ready for discussion at the Committee of the Whole next Wednesday. The resolution, related memo and agreement are included in this packet and summarized herein. The link to the ordinance is provided at the beginning of this memo.

# **Revised Budget Schedule – Conforms with Annual Schedule**

The Schedule of Budget-Related Hearings distributed on July 9<sup>th</sup> has been revised and is being distributed in this packet. The primary reason for the revision is to conform the proposed date for final adoption of the budget to the Annual Schedule. Usually the Council adopts the budget legislation at a Special Session on the second Wednesday in September. However, this year, the second Wednesday falls on Rosh Hashanah (the Jewish New Year). Because of Rosh Hashanah, and because the Council can skip that evening and still meet for the usual four evenings during the month (due to a fifth Wednesday), the Annual Schedule set the final adoption of the budget legislation on the third Wednesday (September 15<sup>th</sup>). The Revised Schedule makes that change along with:

- Stating that the public hearing on the budget legislation will be held during the Committee of the Whole on September 1<sup>st</sup>;
- Changing the names of Council members who chair meetings based upon the vacation plans of members; and
- Correcting some clerical errors.

# Item One – <u>Res 10-13</u> – Authorizing Execution of an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with the County Regarding Disbursal of a 2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) to Purchase Two Vans for the Multi-Jurisdictional Critical Incident Response Team

**<u>Res 09-11</u>** authorizes the execution of an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with the County regarding the disbursal of an Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funds for 2010. The \$43,446 award of federal Office of Justice Program JAG funds is available this year to the City and Monroe County and will be used to purchase two 15-passenger vans for the Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT). The

CIRT is a multi-jurisdictional group with members from a number of local emergency service agencies that handle "critical incidents"- which has been loosely defined as situations that exceed the likely capabilities of "normal" policing methods.

You may recall that the Council approved two JAG awards in 2009. The first award came forward as part of the Federal Recovery Act and was for \$209,379. With that award, the City purchased about 26 Mobile Data Terminals, an Automatic Vehicle Locator system and associated MapTrack software, and the County purchased two motor vehicles. The second award, like the one proposed at this time, came forward under the usual annual grant schedule and was for \$41,900. With that award, the City purchased and installed digital audio-visual recording systems for its Interviewing and Breath-Test rooms as well as in-car cameras for its two canine units, and the County purchased and installed a new telephone/intercom/radio recording and logging system.

# <u>Grant</u>

The grant would replace one unreliable, 18-year old Ryder-style van, which has about 112,000 miles on the odometer, with two new American-made 15-passenger vans for the Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT). The CIRT was established in 1986 and has grown over the years to include members from the Bloomington Police Department, Monroe County Sheriff's Office, Bloomington Fire Department, Bloomington Hospital Ambulance Service and the Monroe County Central Emergency Dispatch Center. These members form units that provide special weapons and tactics (SWAT), paramedic, fire suppression, crisis negotiation, crisis dispatch, and evidence collection capabilities in the event they are asked to address critical incidents. CIRT's primary responsibilities include:

- handling violent or potentially violent situations (including the arrest of violent offenders and any terrorist threat) that exceeds the likely capabilities of "normal" policing methods; and
- protecting visiting dignitaries.

The new vans will be more reliable, efficient and functional than the existing windowless van.

# Agreement

As a requirement for an award, the City and the County must enter into a "Memorandum of Understanding" (Agreement) which is attached to the resolution. In brief, the Agreement:

- "reflects the commitments and understandings ... of the governmental entities in order to efficiently and effectively utilize proceeds" from this award;
- gives the entire award of \$43,446 to the City, who will use it to purchase two 15-passenger vans for the multi-jurisdictional Critical Incident Response Team;
- makes each party solely responsible for its own actions in furnishing services under this agreement;
- requires each party to communicate and cooperate with each other and to make good-faith efforts to obtain all necessary funds and otherwise comply with the Agreement;
- conditions performance of the duties under the Agreement on the receipt of sufficient JAG funds; and
- is to be narrowly construed in regard to the obligations of the parties and does not create rights for persons who have not signed it.

## TO APPROVE AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON AND MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA IN REGARDS TO 2010 EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) (To Purchase Two Vans for the Critical Incident Response Team)

WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington and Monroe County are authorized by I.C. 36-1-7-1, *et seq.*, to enter into agreements for the joint exercise of their powers for the provision of services to the public; and

WHEREAS, this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement reflects the commitments and understandings agreed to by the governmental entities in order to efficiently and effectively utilize proceeds received from the 2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG).

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Bloomington and Monroe County, Indiana in regards to 2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby approved.

SECTION 2. If any sections, sentence or provision of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any of the other sections, sentences, provisions, or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington and approval of the Mayor.

## SYNOPSIS

This resolution approves the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Bloomington and Monroe County, Indiana regarding the use of the 2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant. The Interlocal Agreement provides that the City will utilize all of the available funds to purchase two vans to be utilized by the Critical Incident Response Team.

Re: Resolution 10-13

The City and the County were jointly awarded \$43,446.00 in grant funds from the federal government. The funds are to be utilized for public safety purposes. The County Sheriff's Department and the City's Police Department have determined that the best use of the funds will be to purchase two new vans to be utilized by the Critical Incident Response Team ("CIRT"). CIRT is a multijurisdictional critical incident and counterterrorism unit comprised of members from the following: City of Bloomington Police Department, Monroe County Sheriff's Department and the Indiana University Police Department. In order for the City to utilize all of the \$43,446.00 to purchase the two CIRT vehicles, the County and the City need to enter into an interlocal wherein the County agrees to waive its right to any of the funds and the City agrees to use the funds for the sole purpose of purchasing the two CIRT vans.

### INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON AND MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA IN REGARDS TO 2010 EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG)

WHEREAS, Indiana Code § 36-1-7-1 *et seq.* permits governmental entities jointly exercise powers through Interlocal Cooperation Agreements; and

- WHEREAS, each governmental entity, in performing their governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party; and
- WHEREAS, each governmental entity finds that the performance of this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement is in the best interests of both entities, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement; and
- WHEREAS, this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement reflects the commitments and understandings agreed to by the governmental entities in order to efficiently and effectively utilize proceeds received from the 2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG).

NOW, THEREFORE, City of Bloomington and Monroe County, Indiana, hereby agree as follows:

#### Section 1. Payment

Monroe County, Indiana (hereinafter, "County") agrees that it will not collect any of the \$43,446.00 of funds received from the 2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (hereinafter, "JAG") and that the City of Bloomington, Indiana (hereinafter, "City") shall collect and deposit all of the \$43,446.00 in JAG funds into its own account.

#### Section 2. Use of Funds

City agrees to use all of the \$43,446.00 for the purchase of two fifteen passenger vans to be utilized by the Critical Incident Response Team, said team being a multijurisdictional critical incident and counter-terrorism team comprised of members from the City Police Department, the County Sheriff Department and the Indiana University Police Department.

#### Section 3. Liability

Nothing in the performance of this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement (hereinafter, "Agreement") shall impose any liability for claims against either governmental entity other then claims for which liability may be imposed by the Indiana Tort Claims Act.

#### Section 4. Responsibility

Each entity to this Agreement shall be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this Agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by the other party.

#### Section 5. Commitment

The entities shall communicate and cooperate with one another to ensure that the purposes of this Agreement are achieved on behalf of and to the benefit of the publics they serve.

#### Section 6. Third Parties

The entities to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

#### Section 7. Intent

Be entering into this Agreement, the entities do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

#### Section 8. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement is declared, by a court of competent jurisdiction, to be invalid, null, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall not be affected and shall have full force and effect.

#### Section 9. Appropriation of Funds

The entities acknowledge and agree that the performance of this Agreement is subject to the appropriation of sufficient funds by JAG. The parties agree to make a good faith effort to obtain all necessary appropriations and to comply with all provisions of this Agreement to the extent feasible under current or future appropriations.
