- 4. Approval of Minutes
  - 1. Don from Env. Commission -- chair for air quality working group will be addressing council, reactivating water quality group that will mostly focus on surface water due to recent reports of increased water quality complaints/issues
  - 2. Brooklynn Hall -- specializes in media/advertising, could potentially help with social media for BCOS to improve outreach

  - 1. BCOS Neighborhood Grant Program Details
    - i. \$10,000 for small neighborhood grants, grants up to \$1,000/pc
    - Neighborhoods can submit an initial application, what CAP goal it aligns with, will go to city staff to approve eligibility,

Emma will receive and review grants, BCOS will decide together

- BCOS will make funding recommendations, city staff will review and send out final funding decisions to applicants
- 2. Will potentially be posted next week
- 3. Grants will be reimbursements, will the exception of up-front funding for low income neighborhoods
- 2. BCOS Working Group Grant Program Details
  - i. Funding for BCOS members
  - ii. Similar projects and application to the neighborhood grants
  - iii. Shawn making these funding decisions, with BCOS voting as a group
  - iv. Funding pot of \$10,000

  - i. Up until October, ~55 people have taken it so far
  - ii. Encourage everyone to share for more numbers
- 4. CAATS Earthkeepers presentation to city council on 8/2
  - Earth Keepers gave final presentation on their work, available through link above
- 5. Greenhouse Gas Inventory presentation with Gnarly Tree Sustainability Institute 8/9 at 6:30pm
- 8. Report from Council Ex-Officio
  - 1. Sanitation fees ordinance before the council
    - Concerns about equity and how sanitation services are funded
    - ii. Looking at options to tackle it, not any political support right now
    - iii. One time fee increase as an alternative ordinance that council is considering
  - 2. Cascades park multiuse path corridor
    - i. Challenge is that the space is tight, concerns about amounts of tree removal and bank stabilization
    - ii. Exploring policy options: Build a multi-use path, shut vehicle traffic down to one lane, close section of road to vehicle traffic entirely to convert into multiuse path
    - iii. Many mixed opinions, looking for a resolution that balances cost and environmental issues

- iv. Transit ordinance that would expand transit boundaries
  - 1. Federal policy changes may leave limitations that cause service gaps
- v. Working on a resolution to give policy recommendations r.e. traffic signals, especially in high pedestrian areas
  - 1. Leading pedestrian interval has huge safety benefits
- 9. Reports from Commissioners
  - 1. Just Transition Working Group
    - i. Meeting with Duke Energy
      - 1. Goal to achieve net zero methane emissions by 2023 and carbon dioxide emissions by 2050
      - 2. Duke has a presentation that they can do for BCOS about their mission and interest in renewable energy
      - 3. Duke has programs for low income customers and to make homes more weather efficient
      - 4. Will continue to work with BCOS to align goals
    - ii. Meeting with S.A.F.E Cities based out of Oregon
      - 1. Help cities stay safe from harms of climate change
      - 2. Will be connecting BCOS to network of other cities that share same goals/interests
  - 2. Community Outreach
    - i. Some work done on spreadsheet for community outreach
  - 3. Waste Management
    - i. Community members concerned about where their food waste can go now that Earth Keepers is done
      - 1. Community Orchard has been asked
    - ii. Federal grant out for support of commercial composting biodigester, requires matching
      - 1. City and county could partners on this
    - iii. No report on Compost Captains
- 10. Nathan Ferraria from BHA's SHCDC report
  - 1. Arlington Park with builders H4H and Clear Creek
  - 2. Growing affordability gap, on average in Bloomington housing prices went up 5% per year, driving up market prices while average incomes more or less stay the same
  - 3. Homeowners buys structure, not land, which is key component to driving down price
    - i. Land Trust retains ownership of property (land)

- ii. Housing prices will remain affordable by using a formula that ensures that fact, despite turnover, most external market pressure, etc.
- 4. This shared-equity model provides many benefits to the community
- 5. Neighborhood is 100% non-gas, all electric
- 11. Discussions Not Resolutions
  - 1. CAPS Commission Alternative Public Safety Report
    - Kamala Brown-Sparks in attendance, co-writer of CAPS report
    - ii. CAPS report recommends that Bloomington take an alternative approach to public safety by creating a new Department of Community Safety and Resilience
    - iii. Process is evidence-based, consent-driven, and community-led
      - 1. Uses principle of harm-reduction
    - iv. Report found 3 problem areas:
      - 1. Barriers to access of housing, addiction treatment, and mental healthcare, and emergency services
      - 2. Conflicting goals and priorities within city departments
      - 3. Institutional gap in coordinating responses
  - 2. Endorsement of Letter to the Mayor in Community Handout
  - 3. This initiative connects to multiple SDG's (poverty reduction, socio-environmental well-being, etc.)
