  - *a.* MPO Citizens Advisory Committee Mary Jane Hall (proxy for Sarah Ryterband) provided update that CAC recommended approval of the two FY 2024-2028 TIP Amendments.
  - b. MPO Technical Advisory Committee Pat Martin provided an update the TAC approved the annual performance measures, and recommended approval of all FY 2024-2028 TIP Amendments. They would like to reiterate and add language to the safety performance measures to indicate that zero is the actual goal (instead of just adopting the measures).

- VI. Reports from the MPO Staff
  - *a.* BMCMPO 2050 MTP Status Update & Public Survey (<u>https://arcg.is/jfPb50</u>): *Pat discussed that the MTP is two-thirds complete. The public survey will close 4pm today. There have been over 200 responses so far.*
  - b. INDOT Call for Local Safety Projects: Pat presented about the memo included in the packet for the Call for Local Safety Projects with INDOT. They are accepting applications between September 3 and October 11 for "low-cost systemic safety projects." There are 21+ different types of projects. They include projects within existing right-of-way (no land acquisition), less than \$200,000. Staff includes City of Bloomington, Town of Ellettsville and Monroe County to apply for these projects.
  - c. Indiana Department of Transportation is conducting a Public Involvement Survey (bit.ly/indot-publicsurvey). *The PC is encourage to complete the survey.*
  - *d.* INDOT Charging the Crossroads Round 1 Partner Network (<u>https://chargingthecrossroads.com/</u>): *INDOT has awarded EV (electric vehicle) charging station grants – there is one located in Bloomington. This is only round 1 with 100 million dollars total for round 1. These are all public-private partnerships and all charging stations are privately operated, though LPAs may be able to apply if they wanted.*

- a. INDOT Annual Performance Measures CY 2025 Safety Target Declaration\* (https://www.nhtsa.gov/highway-safety-grants-program/state-performancetargets): Pat summarized the staff memorandum which discusses the details of the INDOT annual performance targets, which are a mandatory requirements by congressional legislation. The performance targets that the committee is voting on today are for the 2025 calendar year. Discussion ensued with the notation that fatalities are unacceptable and that INDOT should pursue a "Vision Zero" goal.
  \*\*Jillian Kinzie moved to adopt CY 2025 Indiana Department of Transportation and Indiana MPO Safety Performance Targets with the notation that Geoff Morris seconded. Motion carried by a voice vote (10-0).\* Approved.
- b. BMCMPO FY 2024-2028 TIP Amendment\*
  - (1) DES#2200146 Eagleson Ave RR Bridge: Pat shared that Monroe County has submitted a TIP Amendment for their Eagleson Ave Bridge over the Indiana Railroad project. There was an acquisition of right-of-way so costs increased for right-of-way acquisition. Funding will come from INDOT's local bridge project money. Discussion ensued.

Re: Notice of Funding Opportunity - INDOT Special Call for Local Federal Safety Fund Projects

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) will be accepting applications for a special call just for federal safety funds for local projects. These funds are available for Local Public Agencies (LPAs) who are interested in safety projects that can be completed in two (2) years. The Office of Traffic Safety will determine eligibility. *This application period will be from September 3, 2024, to October 11, 2024.* Applications will only be accepted from certified Local Public Agency Employees in Responsible Charge (LPA ERC) through INDOTs online application (Local Call Application) accessed through INDOT Technical Applications Pathway (ITAP). <u>Click here</u> for more application details and requirements or note the following information. The Indiana Department of Transportation, Office of Traffic Safety will determine project application(s) eligibility.

## **Application Information and Deadlines**

This application period will be from <u>8:00 AM EST September 3, 2024, to 5:00 PM EST October</u> <u>11, 2024</u>.

Applications will only be accepted from certified Local Public Agency Employee in Responsible Charge (LPA ERC) through INDOTs online application (Local Call Application) accessed through INDOT Technical Applications Pathway (ITAP). To get access to ITAP, the ERC must have an Access Indiana account. Applicants must not be in arrears to INDOT for more than 60 days

# **Requirements for Applications**

In addition to the online project application, the following additional supporting documents are required to be uploaded for all applications.

- The LPA must submit a Financial Commitment Letter on the LPA's letterhead, signed by the fiduciary body of the LPA, containing the amount, source, and year of expenditure of the LPA project match.
- The Systemic Project Short Form Updated 2024 Version 2 must be completed and submitted if a Low-Cost Countermeasure work type is selected.
- The application should include a <u>map at sufficient scale to clearly identify beginning and</u> <u>ending points of project</u>. Include photographs of project area and required work, if possible.
- A well-defined scope of work and a detailed independent cost estimate prepared by the LPA; current traffic counts and crash data are recommended.
- Road projects must be on the Federal-aid system.

## **Selection Process**

Each application will be scored by a team of INDOT experts in their related fields. In addition, projects will be evaluated on ability to be let within the time frame for the call (now through FY 2026).

The project includes the replacement of the existing structurally deficient one lane bridge carrying Dillman Road over Clear Creek and improve the geometrics of the approach roadway leading up to the bridge. The new bridge will be structurally adequate to carry all Legal Loads and Emergency vehicles. Due to evidence of the bridge and approach roadway overtopping during flood events, the proposed structure will have a larger waterway area that incorporates the loss in waterway area going over the road. The new bridge is anticipated to be built at the location of the existing structure with a skew to match the channel. The horizontal curves on the approaches will be eliminated and a raise in the grade of the roadway will be required to provide adequate freeboard for the structure. A multi-use path will be incorporated along the south side of Dillman road and bridge. The bridge and roadway will be closed during construction and traffic detoured.
