I. Call to Order and Introductions

Meeting convened at 5:34 p.m. with Kennedy, Chair presiding.

II. Approval of Meeting Agenda*

**Hall moved for approval of the meeting agenda. Ryterband seconded. Motion carried by a voice vote (4-0).* APPROVED.

III. Approval of Minutes* a. February 26, 2025

> **Tobin-Hoschstadt moved to approve the February 26, 2025 minutes. Hall seconded. Motion carried by a voice vote (4-0).* APPROVED.

- IV. Communications from the Chair and Vice Chair
 - a. Kennedy, who also serves as the Vice Chair of the Policy Committee, shared that the Policy Committee, at their March 14th 2025 meeting, approved the items we recommended for approval at our previous meeting.
 - b. Tobin-Hoschstadt shared that INDOT will be examining future grants that fund bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure and may not [be able to] approve them - the only acceptable priorities will likely be congestion reduction and safety improvements. He noted that that includes a significant portion of the projects that we approve in the TIP.

- V. Reports from Officers and/or Committees
 - a. Ryterband shared that April is distracted driver awareness month she stated that it's one of the biggest reasons for crashes and asked us to consider what we could do about that. Discussion ensued.
- VI. Reports from the MPO Staff
 - a. <u>BMCMPO FY 2026-2030 Transportation Improvement Program</u> update/resolution to fiscal constraint and agency summary tables
 Gandhi, MPO Staff shared the updates that have been made to the fiscal constraint table from FY2026-2030 TIP since it was approved. Discussion ensued.
 - b. <u>Crash Hub/Crash Dashboard</u> introduction Gandhi shared an overview of this new data tool available to the public. Members discussed 17th and the bypass, SR 45 and Smith, Weimer and Bloomfield, Adams and Bloomfield, and other intersections. Members requested that the dashboard show traffic volumes and asked if INDOT fatality/serious injury accident investigation reports could be shared with committees. Staff asked if writing a letter to INDOT about 17th and bypass would be possible. Discussion ensued.
 - c. Local Government Stakeholder Session for the <u>INDOT Design Manual</u> update Gandhi shared information about a recent stakeholder session with INDOT (attended by Cibor and Gandhi) regarding potential upcoming updates to their design manual and transportation safety in Indiana.

 - (1) City of Bloomington Gandhi shared project updates that were provided by the Engineers at the TAC meeting:
 - (a) N Dunn St Multiuse Path Project (between bypass and Griffy): a public meeting is scheduled for March 27 (in-person only) at Lower Cascades Park <u>project website</u>; <u>calendar event</u>. The first step is choosing which side of the road to place the path on.
 - (b) 1st Street: currently finish asphalt surfacing at the Fairview intersection. Project should wrap up this spring.
 - (c) High St multi-use path: High St is continuing to work with INDOT on ROW acquisition; construction hopefully to start in early 2026
 - (d) 2nd Street: is currently waiting on environmental approval from INDOT; contractor bids will be accepted starting in August.

- (e) B-Line Trail extension (west of Adams): work is mostly complete but a block of it adjacent to the railroad was delayed for environmental remediation should wrap up this spring
- (2) Monroe County Gandhi shared project updates that were provided by the Engineers at the TAC meeting:
 - (a) Pedestrian Trail Crossing Improvements Project: this is for the installation of rapid flashing beacons/warning lights at crossings to be installed at <u>7</u> <u>locations</u> along limestone greenway, Bloomington Rail Trail and Clear Creek Trail will be starting this spring and should finish by June
 - (b) Karst Farm Trail: traffic signals and pedestrian crossing lights are functional; a walk through should occur soon

 - (d) Fullerton Pike Project: working on a soundwall for the next month; clean up and opening of phase 1 from Wickens to Rockport should occur by early May

Note: Monroe County was awarded \$418,500 and City of Bloomington was awarded \$860,940 for the HSIP Special Call in December 2024. The money is being applied toward projects in 2026.

The following BMCMPO FY 2026-2030 TIP summary funding tables outline the projected multimodal expenditures for the urban area. These programmed expenditures tables demonstrate a constrained list of proposed expenditures for the first three (3) years of the FY 2026-2030 period. FY 2029-2030 shall remain "illustrative" and therefore not subject to federal fiscal constraint requirements.



Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)

Public Primer

The STIP is a document that identifies the funding and scheduling of transportation projects and programs. It includes projects on the federal, state, city, and county transportation systems, multimodal projects (highway, passenger rail, freight, public transit, bicycle and pedestrian), and projects in the National Parks. The goal of this STIP Primer is to describe a few fundamentals regarding the STIP as well as how to get involved.

Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)

Public Primer

What is the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)?

The Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) is a federally mandated 4-year funding and scheduling document for surface transportation projects (road, highway, pedestrian trails, bicycle facilities, bridge facilities and transit projects in Indiana). The STIP is important because federal and state money cannot be spent on projects unless they are listed in the STIP. The STIP is <u>NOT</u> a plan; it is a budget document that is used to schedule and fund projects. The projects listed in the STIP typically come from local and/or state-approved plans. Only projects which construction and operating funds can reasonably be expected to be available are included in the STIP.

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) develops the STIP in accordance with the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act) and applicable federal regulations. Projects are developed in coordination with the state's metropolitan planning and rural planning organizations. Projects are listed in the STIP by county. The STIP verifies that transportation revenues are available and sufficient to finance the improvements. When is the STIP is Prepared?

The STIP is completely updated every two years, typically during the odd year. The process is very involved and must be coordinated with various partners; entities at the local, state, and federal levels; and must adhere to our public participation/involvement policy at http://www.in.gov/indot/2366.htm before approved. The update process can take up to 9-months.

Outreach and Public Involvement

Two-way information sharing and stakeholder involvement is critical to the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) in the development of a STIP that best meets the ongoing transportation needs of the state.

Public involvement provides Indiana a road map for assuring everyone's voice is not only heard, but makes sure it makes a difference in moving the Hoosier State forward.

How is the STIP Document Organized?

The STIP is organized in four sections.

• Section 1: STIP Overview – Provides an introduction and overview of the STIP and the process used to develop or amend the document and the coordination efforts (MPOs, RPOs, stakeholders, and the general public)



- Section 2: Requirements Describes state and federal requirements and how INDOT meets these requirements (public involvement, environmental justice, ADA, and agreements/coordination between states).
- Section 3: Financial Information/Permits– Describes and defines funding programs, revenue history/trends, financial summaries, risk management/mitigation strategies, financial plans for major capital projects (i.e. Ohio River Bridges, I-69 corridor), tables, and related information
- Section 4: Project Listing Projects are listed by project sponsor: state, local, transit, by county, funding

source, and phases:

- a. **Preliminary Engineering (PE)** Engineering analysis and design work to develop specifications, cost estimates to get a project to physical construction. PE can bring plans to 30% complete or lead to final design plans that are 100% complete.
- Right of Way (RW) Land acquisition activities, right of way costing, and related activities
- c. **Construction (CN)** This will include physical building activities approved roadway and transit construction activities and costs.

Who participates in the STIP Development Process?

A multi-disciplinary team participates in the development of the STIP from metropolitan/rural planning organizations, federal partners, freight advisory committees/stakeholders, transit providers, marine ports, local elected officials, and the general public.

How are Projects Chosen for the STIP?

Transportation projects begin through the identification of transportation needs, opportunities, or challenges and can be displayed in the STIP in phased development (e.g. PE, RW, and/or CN). Potential projects for the STIP can come from a number of sources from regional metropolitan plans, corridor studies, environmental studies, technical asset/engineering analysis, and transit providers just to name a few (See Sources for Projects in the STIP table in this document).


Each summer, INDOT District Offices open a 6-month Call for State Projects for proposed new projects on state facilities (interstates, U.S. Highways, and State Roads) and a separate Call for Local Projects. Proposed projects from the call are not fiscally constrained. All submitted projects are presented internally, reviewed, adjusted as needed, ranked and prioritized through state and local processes designed to assure the broadest participation in meeting the state's transportation needs. Funding estimates are established and the proposed projects are fiscally constrained based on their performance impacts. These new funded projects are approved by INDOT leadership and programmed into a scheduling system. Once these projects are programmed, they are amended into the STIP.

How are Projects Maintained in the STIP?

The STIP does undergo various amendments and modifications between complete updates (roughly an amendment occurring monthly). INDOT Transportation Planners, Project Managers, and Engineers work closely with Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) and non-metropolitan local officials to address needed changes between formal STIP update cycles. The updated document and amendments are publically listed on our website at: http://www.in.gov/indot/2348.htm.

Two Types of STIP Changes:

- **STIP Amendment** is a formal process that must be approved by FHWA, FTA, and must be associated with the MPO's TIP and formally approved by the MPO Policy Board. Amendments may include changes to phases of work, major project scope changes or project work type (e.g. bridge replacement to bridge repair).
- **STIP Modification** is not as formal and does not require formal approval from FHWA, FTA or the MPO Policy Board. Examples of modification include project advancement or deferment without changes to the project scope or cost or splitting a project.



INDOT Monthly STIP Revision Process

How Can You Get Involved with

the STIP Development Process?

There are multiple opportunities along the way for the public and stakeholders to have a voice in the STIP process. The most effective way to get involved is to participate in the project discussion early, frequently, and strategically.

1. Attend local MPO Council Meetings in your area of interest. INDOT planners, engineers, and project



managers often meet with MPO Board members, and Technical Advisory members to discuss and present project concepts, and answer questions from regional and local officials. Depending on the MPO, these opportunities may come every 2-4 months.

- 2. INDOT will have two opportunities for early involvement during our annual call process.
 - a. Local officials outside of MPO areas should meet with their INDOT District to discuss transportation needs and challenges. District Contact Information: https://entapps.indot.in.gov/dotmaps/districtmaps/

City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Ellettsville, and Stinesville Secure More Than \$3.7 Million for Infrastructure Improvements

Bloomington, Ind. – The City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Town of Ellettsville, and the Town of Stinesville have collectively secured more than \$3.7 million in state and federal funding to support road safety and infrastructure improvements throughout the region.

The grants, awarded through two competitive programs—the <u>Federal Highway</u> <u>Administration's Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)</u> and <u>INDOT's Community</u> <u>Crossings Matching Grant</u>—support projects aimed at improving accessibility, increasing pedestrian safety, and upgrading critical roadway infrastructure. "These are the kinds of wins residents deserve to hear about," said Mayor Kerry Thomson. "They demonstrate that we are leveraging outside resources to improve local infrastructure, expand access, and increase safety—without asking more from local taxpayers."

Through the Highway Safety Improvement Program, awarded in December 2024, the City of Bloomington received \$860,940 to modify or reconstruct curb ramps throughout the downtown area to meet current ADA accessibility guidelines.

The project will prioritize areas with lower compliance and high pedestrian-vehicle interaction and may include new bump-outs, improved transit connections, and other context-specific safety enhancements.

Monroe County was also awarded \$418,500 through the HSIP for targeted safety improvements along Fairfax Road, specifically addressing several high-risk curves near the following locations: Schacht Rd, Sanders, Bernice Dr, and Cleve Butcher Rd.

In March 2025, the Community Crossings Matching Grant Program awarded \$760,262 to the City of Bloomington for maintenance upgrades along North Walnut Street, stretching from the Bypass to just past Old 37. Planned improvements include paving, guardrails, and ADA-compliant curb ramps.

Monroe County received \$1.5 million from the same program to support 28 miles of paving projects across the county.

The Town of Ellettsville was awarded \$258,182 and the Town of Stinesville received \$69,778 to support their local infrastructure improvement efforts.

These awards reflect an ongoing regional effort to strengthen transportation infrastructure through shared goals and collaborative planning.
