Bloomington Housing Authority

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BHA Snapshot



Fully converted 320 BHA owned units through RAD



Operates in accordance with Indiana Code § 36-7-18



BHA is 90% federally funded



Section 8 serves 1,700 households/3,400 individuals



Residents pay no more than 30% of their income toward housing

Housing Choice Voucher Program

- Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8) 1721
 - Includes Specialty Vouchers
 - 143 PBV (Project Based Vouchers)
 - 55 VASH (Veterans)
 - 12 SRO (Single Room Occupancy)
 - 13 EHV (Emergency Housing Vouchers)
 - 12 HOP (Homeowners)
- Over \$18 million invested in our community through housing assistance payments
 - 226 active landlords receive payments
 - 42 apartment complexes
 - 81 investment companies/real estate brokers
 - 103 "mom and pop"
- Need is far greater than or resources
 - RAD waiting list
 - 1 BD=930, 2 BD=732, 3 BD=560
 - HCV waiting list
 - 1969
