In the Council Chambers of the Showers City Hall, Bloomington, Indiana on Wednesday, September 27, 2017 at 6:32pm with Council President Susan Sandberg presiding over a Special Session of the Common Council.

Council President Susan Sandberg gave a summary of the agenda.

There were no minutes for approval at this meeting.

Councilmember Steve Volan moved and it was seconded that <u>Resolution 17-31</u> be introduced and read by title and synopsis only. The motion was approved by voice vote. City Clerk Nicole Bolden read the legislation by title and synopsis.

Volan moved and it was seconded that <u>Resolution 17-31</u> be adopted.

Alex Crowley, Economoic and Sustainable Development Director, presented the legislation to the Council. He said it was a \$17.5 million investment with 146 total units, of which 70% would be affordable housing. He said that affordable housing was defined as being 60% or less of the AMI (Area Median Income). Crowley said that 20% of the remaining units would be at market rate, with the last 10% determined by market forces. The first 30 years of the project would be 70% affordable units, and for years 31-99 it would be 50% of the units. The resolution, if approved, would be followed by a memorandum of understanding. He noted the resolution would cover the designation of the Economic Revitalization Area (ERA) as well as the tax abatement. He reviewed the local incentives, which included home incentives for \$300,000 and \$500,000 from the Housing Development Fund, of which half would be a loan and half would be a grant.

Councilmember Isabel Piedmont-Smith asked Crowley what terms accompanied the loan from the Housing Development Fund.

Crowley said it was a low interest loan with an amortization of 35 years, but a term of 15 years. He said it would effectively function as a balloon, with full repayment expected by year 15 at 0.5%.

Sandberg called for public comment.

Piedmont-Smith thanked Crowley and the petitoners for the lengthy negotiations. She said it was an exciting project and it was great that it would have affordable and market-rate housing. She looked forward to seeing it progress.

Sandberg said that everyone was excited about the project and that affordable housing was a priority for the administration and the Council. She noted that the Council did not like to give tax abatements away readily, but the proposal was the type of project that had a clear public benefit that warranted the tax abatement. She said it was a desirable development and she looked forward to similar types of public investment.

The motion to adopt <u>Resolution 17-31</u> received a roll call vote of Ayes: 7, Nays: 0, Abstain: 0.
