BLOOMINGTON BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Bloomington Board of Public Safety held its regular monthly meeting on **Tuesday, December 19**, **2017**, **at 5:00 p.m.**, in the City of Bloomington City Hall McCloskey Conference Room located at 401 N. Morton Street, Bloomington, Indiana.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Susan Yoon called the meeting to order. Board members present were Marsha Bradford, Luis Fuentes-Rohwer, Kimberly Gray and Martin McCrory. Others attending are listed on the attached sheet. Yoon certified that the Board had just met in Executive Session to interview Police Department Employees for promotions.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Bradford moved to approve the minutes of the November 21, 2018 meeting. Gray seconded the motion and the motion carried. Youn and McCrory abstained since they did not attend the November meeting.

PROMOTIONS

Bradford moved that Officer Ben Burns be promoted to Sergeant effective January 1, 2018. McCrory seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Gray moved that Sergeant Ryan Pedigo be promoted to Lieutenant effective January 1, 2018. McCrory seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Fuentes-Rohwer moved that Detective Josh Taylor be promoted to Sergeant effective January 1, 2018. The motion carried unanimously.

The Board took a few moments to allow each candidate to make a few comments. The Board then congratulated the newly promoted employees.

FIRE CHIEF'S DISCIPLINE

Outside Counsel Darla Brown conducted this portion of the meeting. This was in regards to Chief Jason Moore's recommendation that Chauffer Richard Garvin continue his Administrative Leave without pay until the outcome of his hearing. The Board must then agree to adopt a comparable set of findings that support the vote. A <u>very</u> lengthy discussion occurred. Gray made a motion to continue Administrative Leave without pay for Richard Garvin. Fuentez-Rohwer seconded the motion. The motion carried. Bradford abstained. Yoon liked the Finding of Facts that Mike Rouker, City Attorney and Attorney for Police and Fire presented and wanted to add the portion of Richard Garvin's Attorney Joe Lazano's Finding of Facts which stated that there was "significant conflict of evidence" on the last page. Brown went into great detail amending Paragraphs 26-28 and read it back to the Board several times to make sure they understood what she was suggesting. Gray moved that they accept the City of Bloomington's

proposed Findings of Facts as amended. Fuentes-Rohwer seconded the motion. The motion carried. Bradford abstained. McCrory had a problem with a paragraph in section 24. The last sentence starting with "while" should be removed. Yoon would like to remove what is in parenthesis as well. McCrory would like the second sentence in paragraph 26 be removed. This area repeats itself several times and is not necessary. Brown mentioned the further amendments which was the language in the parenthesis in the last paragraph of 24 is being removed. In old paragraph 26, the words "Convicted Domestic Batterer" as well as the second sentence in paragraph 26 is being removed. McCrory moved that they adopt the findings for the City of Bloomington as further amended. Fuentes-Rohwer seconded the motion. The motion carried. Bradford abstained. Brown stated that this will be on the next meeting agenda and the Board will receive a clean copy of the findings to be reviewed and signed and adopted.

POLICE DEPARTMENT BUSINESS

Training and Incident Reports and Statistics; Letters of Appreciation and Commendation

Deputy Chief Joe Qualters reported on the monthly statistics and training. After reporting the monthly incident reports and statistics, Fuentes-Rohwer wanted to know how the Department is REALLY doing. The numbers don't mean anything to him and he just wanted to know how the things are going in the Department. A detailed discussion occurred. Police will work on better accommodating the needs of the Board.

General Business

None.

Personnel Issues

There are two people on extended leave; four people in the academy. Two certified officers that are going for psychiatric and medical exams. Interviews were conducted three weeks ago. Several candidates will be going on for background checks for anticipated openings, retirements and two new approved positions for 2018. Rouker had presented to the Board last month the Police Pension Board process for an officer who had been off of work for an extensive period of time. The Board had agreed to have the Officer's case presented to the Police Pension Board. Today, Rouker reported that the Officer has returned to work and the Police Pension Board will not be meeting on this particular matter.

FIRE DEPARTMENT BUSINESS

Training and Incident Reports and Statistics; Letters of Appreciation and Commendation

Chief Jason Moore reported on the monthly statistics and training. There was discussion on some of the Reports and Statistics.

General Business

Deputy Chief Jayme Washel reported that the ladder truck is back in service. The cost of repairs was just under \$70K. The residual value of that truck is around \$500K. Engine #1 is also currently being repaired and should be back by the end of the month. Engine #4 is a new Engine that should be complete in the Spring. A ladder truck to replace Engine #1 has been ordered. At the IU Men's Basketball Game during half time, Bloomington Fire Department played Indiana University Police Department in a "pickup game". Although the score was unfavorable, it was fun event! Another community outreach program is "Shop with a Fire Fighter". This year there was \$10K for needy families to spend. 38 families and 95 kids were able to participate in this event which happened at Kmart west. The money comes from Union Dues and fund raising events that the Department does. Santa's Sleigh is another outreach program that BFD participates in on Christmas Eve. As part of this event, BFD delivers presents. Currently, at Fire Headquarters, BFF was doing the Bike Giveaway. Ken Nunn Sponsors this event. 30 bikes are given away. Washel wanted to give kudos and piggy back off of the comments earlier to the Police Department. There have been incidents where BFD has asked BPD to pull footage off of the body cameras and they have been very cooperative and very good at working with us to get us the information that is needed.

Personnel Issues

Six employees on light duty. In the month of December, there are generally six people off on vacations. Four in the academy. We are down 20 people with vacations and everything.

BOARD BUSINESS

Review of BPS Payroll

a. Deputy Chief Qualters and Chief Moore agreed the payrolls were correct.

OTHER BUSINESS

The Board looked at the calendar for Spring Break. There is no need to reschedule the meeting during Spring Break. The regular scheduled meeting time was confirmed by the Board.

There has been an issue getting the bi-weekly claims signed by the Board Members. Board Attorney Chris Wheeler came up with several ideas in an email to help accommodate the Board Member's need to feel more comfortable in signing the claims. A lengthy discussion was held. The Board would like for Chris to look at the language on the signature page to see if it can be changed to indicate that they are relying on the duties of the people in charge that the expenses are correct. They would also like Police and Fire to let them know in advance when a large/unexpected or "out of the ordinary" expense is going to hit and what it is so when the Board sees it in the claims, they are aware of it.

Gray moved to adjourn the meeting.
