Re: FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Funding

Background

As of February 2018, INDOT has changed its policy regarding the spending deadline for Prior Year Balance (PYB) funds. The current FY 2018 – 2021 TIP was originally programmed and adopted with the understanding that the PYB funds absolutely had to be spent by the end of FY 2021. INDOT has, as of February 2018, changed its policy regarding this deadline. The new deadline for spending down the PYB funds is FY 2020.

Unfortunately, this new deadline does affect one project with PYB funds currently programmed in FY 2021; the Jackson Creek Trail project sponsored by the City of Bloomington. This project currently has a total of \$900,199 of PYB funds programmed in FY 2021 (*see table below*). Since those funds are no longer eligible to be spent in FY 2021, we as an MPO must find another use for these funds or risk losing the funds altogether. Fortunately, these funds can be moved up to FY 2020. Additionally, \$79,053 in PYB funds were left un-programmed (a recent discovery) which brings us to a total of \$979,252 (\$900,199 + \$79,053) to be programmed for FY 2020.

Finally, due to the updated PYB deadline, the Jackson Creek Trail project is unlikely to let for construction in FY 2021. Therefore, \$755,801 (TAP = \$155,801 and STP = \$600,000) from our normal annual allocation will need to be re-programmed as well.

PYB Funds

1. MPO staff has outlined for your consideration, the following funding options for re-programming the PYB funds (\$979,252).

- a. If possible, the Jackson Creek Trail project, for which the funds are originally programmed, could accelerate its timeline and be moved up to FY 2020. However, this option is not necessarily a viable one due to inherent risk in key schedule drivers such as, right-of-way acquisition and environmental phases that could prolong the process into FY 2022.
- b. The PYB funds could be re-distributed amongst the projects currently programmed for construction in FY 2020. Those projects are: Rogers Rd. Multiuse Path, Winslow Rd. Multiuse Path, Henderson St. Multiuse Path, Sare Rd. Multiuse Path and the School Zone Enhancement Project.
