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#### UTILITIES SERVICE BOARD MEETING March 4, 2019

# Utilities Service Board meetings are recorded electronically and are available during regular business hours in the office of the Director of Utilities.

Board President Roberts called the regular meeting of the Utilities Service Board to order at 5:00 p.m. The meeting was held in the Utilities Service Board room at the City of Bloomington Utilities Service Center 600 East Miller Drive, Bloomington, Indiana.

Board members present: Julie Roberts, Jim Sherman, Jason Banach, Amanda Burnham, Jean Capler, Sam Frank, and Jeff Ehman.

Staff members present: Chris Wheeler, James Hall, Michelle Waldon, Kriste Lindberg, Brandon Prince, Brad Schroeder, Nolan Hendon, Kevin White, Phil Peden, Kelsey Thetonia, Mike Hicks, Holly McLauchlin, Laura Pettit, and Vic Kelson.

#### AMEND AGENDA

Board member Capier moved and Board member Frank seconded the motion to approve amending the agenda to add an item between items six and seven. Motion carried, 7 ayes.

#### MINUTES

Board Vice President Sherman moved and Frank seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the February 18th meeting. Motion carried, 7 ayes.

#### CLAIMS

*Sherman moved and Frank seconded the motion to approve standard claims as follows:* Vendor invoices submitted included \$311,834.36 from the Water Utility, \$194,020.49 from the Wastewater Utility, and \$37,543.13 from the Stormwater Utility. Total Claims approved: \$543,397.98. *Motion carried, 7 ayes.* 

Sherman moved and Frank seconded the motion to approve the utility claims as follows: Utility invoices submitted included \$9,212.32 from the Water Utility, \$22,388.12 from the Wastewater Utility, and \$0.00 from the Stormwater Utility. Total Claims approved: \$31,600.44. *Motion carried, 7 ayes.* 

# Sherman moved and Frank seconded the motion to approve the wire transfers, fees, and payroll in the amount of \$348,195.16. Motion carried, 7 ayes.

*Sherman moved and Frank seconded the motion to approve customer refunds as follows:* Refunds submitted included \$0.00 from the Water Utility, \$174.85 from the Wastewater Utility, \$0.00 from the Stormwater Utility, and \$0.00 from Sanitation. Total Claims approved: \$174.85. *Motion carried, 7 ayes.* 

#### APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

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CBU Director Kelson presented the following agreements recommended by staff for approval: SSI Services - \$11,580.00 - MWTP Pipe Removal and Deckard - \$10,500.00 - Land Survey at WT. As they weren't removed from consent agenda by the Board, agreements approved.

# REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT WITH EVERETT J PRESCOTT FOR ADVANCED METERING

# Sherman moved and Frank seconded the motion to approve agreement. Motion carried, 7 ayes.

Assistant Director - Finance Pettit presented an agreement with EJP for meter hardware, software install, and 5 years of software support for the Advanced Metering Infrastructure project. The agreement is for \$6,765,551.00. There will be about 27,000 iPERL and Omni Sensus meters ordered which CBU will own. There is no installation fee for customers; the funds are from the 2016 rate increase. New meters are generally more accurate than old meters, so slight increased revenue is anticipated. The meters' batteries are warrantied for 20 years. CBU has been doing some public outreach with bill inserts and a website. The installer (UMS) will also be doing public outreach with door hangers and press releases as installation nears. Capler suggested a map showing approximate dates for different neighborhoods.

#### **REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT WITH SWOVA FOR GIS**

# Sherman moved and Frank seconded the motion to approve agreement. Motion carried, 7 ayes.

Assistant Director - Engineering Schroeder presented an agreement to hire Swova to create the web portal for CBU for ArcGIS. Chuck Winkle the GIS Coordinator at CBU has been working already to upload all of CBU's data into ArcGIS and started to maintain this as the GIS platform. Swova will design the look and feel of the web portal and deploy to all users. The new GIS will be accessible via tablets to employees in the field. The contract is for \$27,050.00.

#### **REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF 3rd AMENDMENT WITH BRUCE WILDS SECURITY** *Sherman moved and Frank seconded the motion to approve agreement. Motion carried, 7 ayes.*

Wheeler with City Legal presented the third amendment to the Bruce Wilds Security contact for 24/7 security at the decommissioned Griffy water treatment plant. People continue to be turned away daily so that they do not go into the plant and undo all the good work VET and CBU are doing to clean up the plant. This amendment extends the contract to the end of August, adding \$130,272.00 making the new not-to-exceed total \$247,272.00. This is all under the CBU Water budget and cannot be charged to other City funds.

OLD BUSINESS: None.

NEW BUSINESS: None.

SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS: Burnham reported that the Rules & Regulations subcommittee reviewed the application and review process for the residential stormwater grant program. Burnham says it is a good project with an ambitious timeline. There will be a review committee; anyone who wants to volunteer or has a recommendation contact Vic Kelson. The subcommittee recommends approval of Resolution 2019-03 which expresses Board support of the grant program.

#### **REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2019-03**

Sherman moved and Board member Ehman seconded the motion to approve resolution. Motion carried, 7 ayes.

STAFF REPORTS: Kelson reported that Jason Wenning has filled the Pretreatment Coordinator position.

Kelson also thanked Board for attending the annual retreat.

PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS: Capler asked if there was a recent main break. Kelson confirmed that there had been a break in a 12 inch main at the roundabout near Goat Farm but it was now repaired. ъř.

- WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency reviewed and provisionally approved the proposed Revised Enforcement Response Plan, pending approval of the same by this Board; and
- WHEREAS, this Board has reviewed the Enforcement Response Plan and finds it to be acceptable.

#### Statement of Authority

This document is the City of Bloomington, Indiana Utilities' Enforcement Response Plan (ERP) for its Pretreatment Program. Federal regulation (40 CFR 403.8(f)(5)) requires the City of Bloomington Utilities (CBU) to develop an ERP as part of its Pretreatment Program. Where applicable, this plan will be consulted in the event enforcement action against Industrial Users becomes necessary.

The regulation as stated in 40 CFR 403.8(f)(5) is as follows:

The POTW shall develop and implement an enforcement response plan. This plan shall contain detailed procedures indicating how a POTW will investigate and respond to instances of Industrial User noncompliance. The plan shall, at a minimum:

(i) Describe how the POTW will investigate instances of noncompliance;

(ii) Describe the types of escalating enforcement responses the POTW will take in response to all anticipated types of Industrial User violations and the time periods within which responses will take place;

(iii) Identify (by title) the official(s) responsible for each type of response;

(iv) Adequately reflect the POTW's primary responsibility to enforce all applicable pretreatment requirements and standards, as detailed in 40 CFR 403.8(f)(1) and (f)(2).

The Pretreatment Program was developed as required by 40 CFR 403.8(a). The Director has the legal authority to:

i) Deny or condition new or increased contributions of pollutants, or changes in the nature of pollutants, to the POTW by Industrial Users where such contributions do not meet applicable Pretreatment Standards and Requirements or where such contributions would cause the POTW to violate its NPDES permit;

ii) Require compliance with applicable Pretreatment Standards and Requirements by Industrial Users;

iii) Control through permit, order, or similar means, the contribution to the POTW by each Industrial User to ensure compliance with applicable Pretreatment Standards and Requirements. In the case of Industrial Users identified as significant under 403.3(v), this control shall be achieved through individual permits.

This plan is tailored as recommended by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) to include a range of enforcement responses available to the City of Bloomington Utilities in the event Industrial Users violate its rules and regulations. This ERP complies with federal and state regulations governing Industrial User discharges as set forth in the federal **Clean Water Act** and the **General Pretreatment Regulations (40 CFR Part 403)**. Additionally, this plan is to be consulted in the enforcement of local laws and regulations governing discharges to the POTW and collection systems. Local laws and regulations are found in Title 10 of the "**Bloomington Municipal Code**" (BMC) and in the CBU's "**Rules, Regulations, and Standards of Service.**"

The City of Bloomington Utilities intends to adhere to these guidelines when appropriate; however, enforcement responses may differ from those specified in this plan when unusual or extenuating circumstances exist. Variance from these guidelines may depend upon considerations such as degree of variance from Pretreatment Standards, duration of violations and the enforcement history of the violator. In no case shall this ERP be construed as to limit the enforcement discretion of the CBU.

**Right of Appeal:** Any person or entity aggrieved by any enforcement action taken by the Director of CBU may appeal to the Utilities Service Board for relief. The appellant must file a written request outlining the nature of the grievance within 14 days of being notified of the CBU enforcement action. The appeal shall be directed to the President of the Utilities Service Board and mailed to PO Box 1216, Bloomington, Indiana, 47402-1216. Appeals may also be delivered to the Office of the Director, City of Bloomington Utilities, 600 E. Miller Drive, Bloomington, Indiana 47401 (see Title 10, Chapter 10.30 of the "Bloomington Municipal Code").

**Other Governmental Enforcement Authority:** The Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) and the USEPA have separate and distinct authority to pursue entities that violate federal and state regulations and local pretreatment program rules. Nothing in this ERP shall be construed as to limit or diminish the enforcement authority of IDEM or USEPA. Both federal and state governments may pursue penalties against CBU in the event CBU fails to take appropriate enforcement action against violators.

CBU will notify the IDEM Office of Water Management regarding an enforcement action taken against any violator determined to be in Significant Noncompliance status.

#### THE ENFORCEMENT PROCESS

Title 10 of the "Bloomington Municipal Code" and CBU's "Rules, Regulations, and Standards of Service" state that the Director of CBU, or his/her designee, is responsible for enforcement of CBU rules and regulations. The CBU Director (hereafter the Director) shall carry out informal enforcement actions. In most cases, the Director relies upon the Pretreatment Coordinator and program staff to fulfill this obligation. The Utilities Service Board (USB), upon the recommendation of the Director and the City's attorney(s), direct enforcement actions that require legal action. Below is a list of enforcement responses and typical responsibilities for Pretreatment Program staff:

Pretreatment Coordinator – The Pretreatment Coordinator (PC) is responsible for the day to day implementation and enforcement of the City's Industrial Pretreatment Program. Other Pretreatment Program staff may also participate with enforcement responses similar to the PC's responsibilities. Enforcement responses carried out by the PC include:

- 1. Informal notices (verbal and written)
- 2. Site visits
- 3. Notices of Violation
- 4. Compliance Schedules
- 5. Pretreatment Equipment Installations

- 6. Informal Meetings
- 7. Press Releases
- 8. Referrals to the city attorney for civil litigation (Judicial Enforcement)
- 9. Referrals to the state or EPA for criminal action (Additional Remedy)

Director – The Director has the responsibility to monitor the PC's actions and to initiate the following enforcement actions at the recommendation of the PC:

- 1. Revocation of permit
- 2. Administrative fines
- 3. Compliance schedules, when issued by the City
- 4. Administrative Orders
- 5. Emergency suspensions of discharge
- 6. Termination of discharge
- 7. Referrals to the city attorney for civil litigation (Judicial Enforcement)
- 8. Referrals to the state or EPA for criminal action (Additional Remedy)

City Attorney – The City Attorney will provide legal consultation as requested by the Director on enforcement actions and will take the lead on referrals for civil litigation.

The Director shall evaluate the response required by this ERP. The ERP provides uniform and equitable treatment to all violators. The Director may vary from the ERP requirements when unusual or extenuating circumstances exist.

This ERP outlines the type of noncompliance and the range of responses available to the Director. In promulgating the ERP, the CBU intends to accomplish four primary objectives:

- 1. The ERP shall recommend enforcement responses that are appropriate to the nature, severity and impact of the violation.
- 2. The ERP shall promote uniform responses to violations.
- 3. The ERP shall serve as advance notice to CBU customers that enforcement action is contemplated in the event federal, state or local rules are violated.
- 4. The ERP shall communicate the importance of adherence to federal, state and local regulations.

#### Violation Categories

This ERP groups violations into two categories:

- 1. Industrial User violations.
- 2. Food Service Establishment violations.

Violations are typically investigated through record reviews, site visits, inspections, and sampling. These actions are typically performed by the Pretreatment Coordinator and program staff. Pretreatment staff reviews data to determine its reliability and conformance to EPA standards for analysis. Pretreatment records, including enforcement records, are kept for a minimum of 3 years.

#### Enforcement Response Actions

Typical enforcement response actions include telephone/email notices (TXN), site visits (SV), Notice of Violation (NOV), Compliance Schedule (CS), Administrative Order (AO), Pretreatment Equipment Installation (PEI), Compliance Schedules (CS), Administrative Fines (AF), Emergency Suspension of Discharge (ES), Termination of Discharge (TD), Revocation of Permit (RP), Press Release (PR), Judicial Enforcement (JE), and Additional Remedy (AR) against violators. These actions are more fully discussed below. All enforcement response actions may require a response from the violator.

**Telephone Notices (TXN)** are utilized for instances where very minor violations have occurred and/or continue to occur. The Director may provide notice of said violations by telephonic or electronic mail (email) to any User so violating. TXN may be used in conjunction with other enforcement responses. TXN should be performed within 30 days of the City becoming aware of the violation.

Site Visits (SV). The Director may conduct site visits of any User, and shall have the right to enter the premises of any User, to determine whether the User is complying with all requirements of this ordinance and any individual wastewater discharge permit or order issued herein. SV may also be used to discover violations. A SV may or may not include a sampling event(s). A SV report is placed on file in the Pretreatment Coordinator's office. SVs may be used in conjunction with other enforcement responses. SVs should be performed within 30 days of the City becoming aware of the violation.

**Notice of Violation (NOV).** An NOV is a written notice to the User which clearly identifies the nature of the violation and directs the User to come into compliance within a specified period of time. The NOV may also require the User to provide a written response to the violation and/or corrective action measures within a specified period of time typically ranging from 24 hours to 30 days.

**Compliance Schedules (CS).** Compliance Schedules may be required when a User has violations. Such a document shall include specific action to be taken by the User to correct the noncompliance within a time period specified by the document. Such documents shall have the same force and effect as an Administrative Order pursuant to Section 10.30.030 (g) of the BMC and shall be judicially enforceable. The Director may, at his discretion, issue a CS or allow the User to propose a Compliance Schedule for approval. Compliance Schedules are typically required to be submitted or issued within 30-60 days of notice to the User and are typically completed within 12-18 months of approval.

Administrative Orders (AO). AOs are enforcement documents that direct Industrial Users to undertake and/or cease specified activities by specified deadlines. The terms of an AO may or

may not be negotiated with Industrial Users. AOs may incorporate compliance schedules, administrative penalties, termination of service and show cause orders. AOs are typically issued within 60 days of CBU becoming aware of the violation.

**Pretreatment Equipment Installation (PEI).** The Director may require an industrial user or food service establishment to install approved pretreatment equipment, such as a grease interceptor, within a specified timeframe. All equipment installations must include the submittal of adequate engineering and/or plumbing plans. PEIs may be used in conjunction with other enforcement responses. The requirement for PEIs should be issued within 30 days of the City becoming aware of the violation. The Director shall require the PEI to be installed within a reasonable timeframe.

Administrative Fines (AF). Any User that has violated, or continues to violate, any provisions of BMC Title 10, wastewater discharge permit, or order issued in accordance with BMC Title 10, or any other pretreatment standard or requirement, shall be subject to a fine of not more than two thousand five hundred dollars. Such fine shall be assessed on a per-violation, per-day basis, and in accordance with BMC Title 10. Factors which may be taken into account when assessing AFs include, but are not limited to, the type and severity of the violation, number of violations cited, duration of noncompliance, impact of the violation on the receiving water, sludge quality, and POTW operation, whether the violation threatened public health, the economic benefit or savings the industrial user gained from the noncompliance, compliance history of the industrial user, and the whether the industrial user is making a good faith effort to comply. AFs may be used in conjunction with other enforcement responses. AFs should be issued within 30 days of the City becoming aware of the violation.

**Emergency Suspension of Discharge (ES).** The Director may immediately suspend a User's discharge whenever actual or threatened discharge reasonably appears to present or cause an imminent or substantial endangerment to the health or welfare of persons, whenever discharge presents, or may present, an endangerment to the environment, or whenever discharge threatens to interfere with the operation of the POTW. The Director shall notify the User that an Emergency Order for Suspension of Discharge has been issued before suspension occurs. ESs should be issued within 60 days of the City becoming aware of the violation, depending on the severity of the violation.

**Termination of Discharge (TD).** The Director may terminate the discharge of any User who commits fails to comply with any wastewater discharge permit conditions, fails to accurately report the wastewater constituents and characteristics of its discharge, fails to report significant changes in operations or wastewater volume, constituents and characteristics prior to discharge, refuses access to the User's premises for the purpose of inspection monitoring or sampling, or fails to comply with any of the pretreatment standards in Chapter 10.12 of the BMC. TDs may be used in conjunction with other enforcement responses and should be issued within 60 days of the City becoming aware of the violation, depending on the severity of the violation.

**Revocation of Permit (RP).** The Director may revoke the permit of any industrial discharger for good cause, including, but not limited to the following reasons:

- (1) Failure to factually report the wastewater constituents and characteristics of its discharge;
- (2) Failure to report significant changes in wastewater constituents or characteristics prior to changed discharge;
- (3) Misrepresentation or failure to fully disclose all relevant facts in the wastewater discharge permit application;
- (4) Falsifying self-monitoring reports and certification statements;
- (5) Tampering with monitoring equipment;
- (6) Failure to meet effluent limitations;
- (7) Failure to pay fines;
- (8) Failure to pay sewer charges;
- (9) Failure to meet compliance schedules;
- (10) Failure to complete a wastewater survey or the wastewater discharge permit application;
- (11) Failure to provide advance notice of the transfer of business ownership of a permitted facility;
- (12) Refuses reasonable access to the industrial discharger's premises by representatives of the City for the purpose of inspection or monitoring;
- (13) Violates the conditions of any Pretreatment Standard or Requirement, its permit, or this title, or any final judicial order entered with respect thereto;
- (14) Causes the POTW to violate its NPDES permit; or
- (15) Failure to adhere to the terms of a special agreement.

RPs may be used in conjunction with other enforcement responses. RPs should be performed within 60 days of the City becoming aware of the violation.

**Press Release (PR).** When the Director finds that a User has violated, or continues to violate, any provision BMC Title 10, a wastewater discharge permit or order issued in accordance with BMC Title 10, or any other pretreatment standard or requirement, the Director may issue a press release to a local paper providing information regarding any and all violations. This information may also be included in any annual wastewater performance report to IDEM. PRs may be used in conjunction with other enforcement responses. PRs should be issued within 1 year of becoming aware of the violation.

**Judicial Enforcement (JE).** When the Director finds that a User has violated, or continues to violate, any provision of BMC Title 10, a wastewater discharge permit, any order issued in accordance with BMC Title 10, or any other pretreatment standard or requirement, the Director may seek judicial enforcement remedies through the City Legal Department in a court of competent jurisdiction, including injunctive relief or civil penalties.

Additional Remedy (AR). Violations of BMC Title 10, a wastewater discharge permit or order issued in accordance with BMC Title 10, or any other pretreatment standard or requirement may be referred for further enforcement, investigation, and/or prosecution.

#### SIGNIFICANT NONCOMPLIANCE

Significant Industrial Users (SIUs) and Industrial Users who commit violations that meet one or more of the criteria below are in Significant Noncompliance (SNC) status:

- 1. Chronic violations of discharge limits where 66 percent or more of all measurements taken for the same pollutant parameter during a six-month period exceed (by any magnitude) a numeric Pretreatment Standard or Requirement, including instantaneous limits, as defined by 40 CFR 403.3(1);
- 2. Technical Review Criteria violations where 33 percent or more of all measurements taken for the same pollutant parameter during a six-month period equal or exceed the product of the numeric Pretreatment Standard or Requirement including instantaneous limits, as defined by 40 CFR 403.3(1) multiplied by the applicable TRC (1.4 for BOD, TSS, fats, oils and grease, and 1.2 for all other pollutants except pH);
- 3. Any other discharge violation that the Director believes has caused alone or in combination with other discharges, interference or pass through, including endangering the health of POTW personnel or the general public;
- 4. Any discharge of a pollutant that has caused imminent endangerment to the public or to the environment, or has resulted in the Director's exercise of its emergency authority to halt or prevent such a discharge;
- 5. Failure to meet, within 90 days after the schedule date, a compliance schedule milestone contained in a wastewater discharge permit or enforcement order for starting construction, completing construction, or attaining final compliance;
- 6. Failure to provide, within 45 days after the due date, any required reports including baseline monitoring reports, 90-day compliance reports, periodic self-monitoring reports, and reports on compliance with compliance schedules;
- 7. Failure to accurately report noncompliance;

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8. Any other violation or group of violations, which may include a violation of Best Management Practices, which the Director determines will adversely affect the operation or implementation of the local Pretreatment program.

SIUs and Industrial Users found to be in Significant Noncompliance status (SNC) are required to submit a draft compliance schedule for review and approval by the Director, within 45 days of the date of receipt of notification of SNC status. The Director may order emergency suspension of service in any circumstance where the SNC status may create damage to human health, the environment or the POTW.

In addition to conventional penalties required in this ERP, the Director is required to publish a legal notice of the SNC status, in a newspaper of general circulation that provides meaningful

public notice within the jurisdictions served by the POTW, a list of all SIUs and Industrial Users in SNC status for the reasons listed above. This notice shall include a definition of SNC status, the reason for being designated as significantly noncompliant, and the time period required for the correction of the problem. The Director shall approve this notice prior to publication.

In some cases, the Director may require Industrial Dischargers in SNC status to submit a formal pollution prevention audit prepared by a qualified consultant or employee. In-house personnel may perform this audit if they are deemed qualified by the Director.
