### **Understanding Adverse Childhood Experiences (Building Self-Healing**

- A. **ACE Study** → Trauma is overwhelmingly linked to behavioral/physical health, some topics (ACES) of the study include:
  - 1. Divorce
  - 2. Witnessing domestic violence
  - 3. Neglect/lack of resources
  - 4. Sexual abuse

- 5. Someone in the hope using drug and alcohol
- 6. Family/caregiver death

## B. Study concluded 13% of initial respondents had witness domestic violence in the home

- 1. Linked specific instances to higher levels and increased potential for physical health issues and substance abuse
- C. Early exposure toxic stress → create flight or fight responses, which can cause behavioral issues in youth/children (such as rage in response conflict) → hardwired physical changes in the body
  - 1. Exposure to ACES can cause nuero and brain issues, causing difficulty in learning as well.
  - 2. Creating ways to engage kids in healthy emotional outlets can help reduce the effects
  - 3. Generational Trauma → generations of low socio-economic and racial disparities can be passed through genetically
  - 4. Individuals with disabilities are more vulnerable to ACEs
  - 5. Healing (brain changes) can effectively happen in toddlers and after birth
