The first order of business was the election of officers.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

It was moved by Kiesling and seconded by Gardner that Register be nominated for Council President. Register was elected by a unanimous roll call vote.

PRESIDENT

It was moved by Service and seconded by Gardner that Kiesling be nominated for Council President Pro-Tem. Kiesling was elected by a unanimous roll call vote.

PRESIDENT PRO-TEM

It was moved by Fernandez and seconded by Kiesling that Olcott be nominated for Council Parliamentarian. Olcott was elected by a unanimous roll call vote.

PARLEMENTARIAN

Kiesling's message was hope for a good year in 1989. Hogan wished everyone a Happy New Year. Gardner hoped for a happy and safe new year, as did Olcott.

MESSAGES FROM
COUNCILMEMBERS

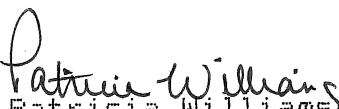
