COMMON COUNCIL JULY 26, 1989 SPECIAL SESSION

Roll Call: Kiesling, Hogan, Gardner, Olcott, Regester, ROLL CALL Young, Service, White, Fernandez.

Council President Regester announced that this was a special session of the Council in order to pass the various budget and salary ordinances recently reviewed by the Council in budget committee hearings.

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89--24 be ORD. 89--24 introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read ELECTED OFFICIALS the ordinance.

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89-24 be adopted.

White said that this is just a regular inflation adjustment that we have allotted for all city employees.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:1 (Hogan).

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89-25 be ORD. 89-25 introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance. SALARIES It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89-25 be

There was no discussion or public comment. The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:1 (Hogan).

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89-26 be ORD. 89-26 introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read UTILITIES the ordinance. SALARIES It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89-26 be adopted.

There was no discussion or public comment. The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:1 (Hogan).

Olcott asked that with the agreement of the Council that Ordinance 89-25 be reintroduced and read by the Clerk by title only. It was so moved. An amendment was offered to add the position of crew leader for the Sanitation Department for the Salary Ordinance. Doris Sims explained the need for additional personnel to handle the increased work load created by the recycling program. Kiesling said that this option was discussed in the regular recycling committee meeting and this was approved as a way of alleviating some of the pressure on the regular staff.

The amendment received a roll call vote of Ayes:9, Nays:0.

The ordinance, as amended, received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:1 (Hogan).

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89-27 be ORD. 89-27 introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read SALARIES FOR the ordinance. POLICE*FIRE It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89-27 be adopted.

There was no discussion or public comment. The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes:9, nays:0.

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89-28 be $$\tt ORD.~89-28$$ introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read $\tt PTC$ the ordinance.

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance 89-28 be adopted.

White said that the added increase of the tax levy brings it back to the 1987 level (levy was decreased in 1989). The PTC plans to add additional service so the levy will go back up.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes:9, Nays:0.

It was moved and seconded that Appropriation Ordinance 89-3 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance.

APP. ORD. 89-3 1990 CIVIL CITY BUDGET

It was moved and seconded that Appropriation Ordinance 89-3 be adopted.

White proposed an amendment to the Capital and Equipment budget to reduce #431, Building Improvements by \$49,000 and the General Fund Capital and Equipment budget add to #451 out of capital outlay \$30,000. The amendment was seconded. The building improvements line calls for \$30,000 to replace the City Hall roof, remodeling Controllers Office, \$25,000 and carpet for Redevelopment, \$4,000, as well as \$10,000 for general maintanance, bringing the total to \$69,000. This amendment reduces that line by \$49,000 and leaves \$20,000 in #431. Kiesling, Fernandez and White hoped that building maintenance could be done with the \$10,000as the administration suggested, leaving an additional \$10,000 in an emergency fund in the interim before an anticipated move to new quarters. We should do all we can do to conserve funds. He said he appreciated the administration amendment to appropriate \$30,000 to sidewalks and curbs. Kiesling said she appreciated meeting with the Mayor and the efforts to build a concensus for this budgetary change.

Mayor Allison agreed with the Council requests and said that it was agreed that monies would not be spent unless absolutely necessary and funds should be channeled to areas that people in the community feel strongly about.

Regester complimented the administration on the street and sidewalk program.

Gardner asked about an estimate on the roof replacement. Patterson said that roof really needs to be replaced and \$30,000 was already a conservative estimate. Repairs can probably be kept to a minimum.

The amendment received a roll call vote of Ayes:9, Nays:0.

The ordinance, as amended, received a roll call vote of Ayes:7, Nays:2 (Kiesling, Hogan).

It was moved and seconded that Appropriation Ordinance APP. ORD. 89-4 89-4 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance. It was moved and seconded that Appropriation Ordinance
