IX. ADJOURNMENT In the Council Chambers of the Municipal building held on Wednesday, September 2, 1987, at 7:30 P.M. with Council President Pro-Tem presiding over a Regular Session of the Common Council.

Roll Call: Service, Porter, Regester, Olcott, Gross, Murphy, Foley, Young. Absent: Mayer.

Service gave the agenda summation.

Olcott noted the Parks Bond Petition Drive to collect signatures for the bond issue. Gross announced the forthcoming publication of Services' new novel to be on the bookshelves next month. Foley congratulated the Bloomington All-Stars and their big win in Missouri. Our team placed 4th in the nation.

 Murphy announced that he was speechless and Service called attention to the art display
in the Council C hambers by Rosemary Miller.

John Freeman, representing the Mayor also offered congratulations to the Bloomington baseball team.

Clerk Williams reported to the Council that the recent petition to abolish the USB has been defeated. Attached is a certification. Williams also passed out park bond petitions for the Councilmembers to carry.

Oldott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 87-41 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded the motion that Ordinance 87-41 be adopted.

Tim Mueller gave an extensive description of the tract, the restrictions that MQ tendered, and the amalgam of conditions that was finally approved by the Plan Commission after numerous hearings.

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Jim Ferguson, representing the petitioner, requested approval by the Council. Clarenace Frank, representing Harvey Sudbury (sp) a property owner on Wapahani Road requested clarification of the Weimer Rd./Wapahani Rd triangle. Long discussion continued as to extending buffer zones, increasing the density of the buffer zone and finally John Porter suggested the following amendment:

> In #3 of the conditions for development north boundary should be substituted for the Wapahani title

The amendment, after considerable discussion received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:0

Richard Petermichaelopposed the development and said that 282 residents in that area also opposed the development. "The plans are speculative and a lot of high traffic generators will create another South Walnut St.", he said.

Service asked about buffering along the Wapahani tract and Regester asked about PCD buffer requirements. Miller said that with the PCD, 35 feet of buffered space is required.

Murphy reminded the council to be consistent and that we will see this type of development request from Mr. Gates and the north corridor project.

The ordinance, as amended, received a roll call vote of Ayes:8, Nays:0.
