Murphy paid tribute to Jerry Kister, a member of our community and a Congressional Medal of Honor holder who died this past week. Kister honored our community as he honored our country with his valor and courage and Murphy noted that he certainly made a vital contribution to the corner of 10th and Dunn Streets and will be truly missed.

Service said that we often take for granted the good things we already have and the downtown is one of them. Last week the IACT officials were taken on a tour of the downtown and Service remarked that she was impressed that "they were impressed" with our downtown. "Things like this don't just happen". easily without people really working at it".

There was no Mayoral message.

Service remarked that some standardization of definitions might be helpful (last week the committee discussion revealed that the staff had not recommended approval of the ERA and tax abatement because the staff felt that construction had already begun and the work was more than cosmetic) Attorneys for the petitioner said that no permit had been secured because they were under the impression that "cosmetic" type repairs were not required for minor repairs.
