Regester gave the agenda summation.

The minutes of October 15, 1986 and November 5, 1986 were approved by a voice vote.

Olcott said he was hopeful that the County would accept Frank Ragan's proposal for salvaging the City-County Parks Program, avoiding a duplication of facilities and services and maintaining this very "low level" of cooperation.

Regester agreed with Olcott and invited people to attend the Parks Board Meeting on Thursday, Nov 20 at 4:15 P.M. if interested.

Mayor Allison noted the recent death of Myrtle Jackson who passed away on Sunday. Myrtle was a strong advocate for the west side and the many activities implemented there over the years and was a long time member of the Housing Authority. Allison also remarked on the text of a letter to be sent to TCI regarding Channel 4 and the intended move to Channel 24. This change to a different band willgreatly affect our local emergency warning system, virtually eliminating it for people without cable TV or at least forcing them to purchase a converter.

There was a unanimous voice vote in favor of the Mayor expressing those concerns, by letter, to TCI.

The Mayor also addressed the question of parks funding and a statement pertaining to that is attached to these minutes.

Jerry Gates in asking for the use variance said that many of the original concerns and objections are not issues. There are no major traffic problems drainage, or school/pupil associated problems.

Tim Mueller said the Plan Commission has supported the request and outlined the history of the controversy surronding Mr. Gates rezoning problems

Murphy informed the Council that the Plan Commisson approved the plan and there was no remonstrance. He did note, for the record, that approval was contingent upon \underline{NO} drive-in facilities on the premises.

Gross asked how the trip numbers are generated and Mueller said that manuals are available that indicate how many trips are generated by certain types of businesses and often the planning staff visits local businesses and make the necessary enquiry.

Gates then suggested that the Council might want to form a study committee to look into the Plan Department's practices and procedures, noting "a change has to be made". Service suggested tha Mr. Gates quit while ahead and praised the Planning Department for providing information and guidance over the years.
