In the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building held on Wednesday, July 17, 1985, at 7:30 P.M. with Council President Gross presiding over a Regular Session of the Common Council.

Roll Call: Service, Porter, Regester, Olcott, Gross, Mayer, Murphy, Foley, Young.

Gross gave the agenda summation.

The minutes of June 19, 1985 were approved by a voice vote.

Service commended the persons involved in the Mid-America Festival of the Arts taking place in Bloomington this month as well as Dale Enochs, the sculptor, and the dedication of his work "AXIS" that took place last Saturday at the MillerShowers Park. Service also called attention to the photography exhibit in the Council Chambers by David Sutton and announced that Town Theatre was offering the production of HARVEY this week.

Olcott said that today's issue of the Herald-Telephone said that the police/sheriff dispatchers in the new Justice Building would be separate departments. Olcott said that he was disappointed that this merger would not take place and that he hoped that the newspaper account was incorrect. He urged both departments to go with the original intent of the cooperative venture and that was to coordinate services so that the taxpaper was not paying for duplicate services.

Mayor Allison said that the City's position was unchanged and that we would continue to be willing to expedite the dispatching for the Sheriff's department. The Mayor said that on next Thursday, July 25, 1985, there would be hearings at the Courthouse (Room 315) regarding the extension of College Avenue. The afternoon hearings will be informal information hearings and the evening session will be announced at a later time.

It was moved and seconded that Eric Schneller and Ralph Staples be appointed to the Housing Quality Appeals Board. The motion was approved by a voice vote. Both appointments fill vacancies due to resignation and therefore Schneller's term will expire 1/86 and Staples' term will expire 1/87.

Olcott moved and Foley seconded a motion to introduce and read by title only Resolution 85-23. Clerk Williams read the resolution by title only.

\$200 per year and that all meters in municipal garages/lots would cost five cents for 30 minutes and ten cents for 60 minutes.

The amendment was defeated by a vote of Ayes: 1 (Service), Nays: 8.

The Mayors Office proposed an amendment that would create an Public Employee Parking designation on Morton from 8th to 9th Street. This would create about 55 parking spaces, for County employees primarily. No fee has yet been established for this particular permit.

Murphy said that he hoped that the parking issue could be resolved to everyone's satisfaction as that area is extremely congested. A start might be to cut the weeds on the lots under discussion.

O. Russell Curry, the petitioner, said that he hoped to buy an ajacent lot to be used for parking within the next few weeks. Meanwhile, Lot #19 is only rented to Kilroys on a 30 day option arrangement.

Mayer said the problem of parking is a crucial one for this area and we have granted the petitioner a lot of leeway with this proposal. Murphy agreed saying that the Council is backing the administration on this one and hopes that we aren't creating more problems for the businesses located in that area.
