In the Common Council Chambers of the Municipal Building held on November 16, 1983, 7:30 P.M. at a Regular Session of the Common Council with Council President Dilcher presiding.

Councilmembers present: Porter, Towell, Service, Dilcher, ROLL CALL Murphy, Olcott, Gross, Hogan. Absent: Morrison (Business Trip).

Porter announced the Festival of Trees to be held in Bloomington on December 1-4 at the old Hunter School. The event is sponsored by the Bloomington Hospital Fund, the Hospital Auxillary and the Owen-Monroe Hospital Auxillary. Thirty-three trees will be decorated and auctioned at the event.

Olcott congratulated his cohorts on the election and the recent campaign, "a class election", and wished his colleagues well in the coming four years.

Dilcher said that the Council would meet at 12:00 P.M. noon on Wednesday, November 23, 1983 to vote on the resolution regarding the joint City-County Law Enforcement Facility. She also announced a vacancy on the Environmental Quality Conservation Commission.

There was no Mayoral message.

There were no Petitions or Communications.

Olcott moved and Murphy seconded a motion that Ordinance 83-57 be introduced and read by title only. Clerk Williams read the Ordinance by title only.

Olcott moved and Murphy seconded a motion that Ordinance 83-57 be adopted. Dilcher read the synopsis. There was no committee report.

Tim Mueller informed the Council that changes in state law have dictated the need for this particular ordinance. The board would be reduced by one (from six to five), it would still review and grant variances, issue special variances and review and override any action of any board.

Towell asked about the makeup of the new advisory board. Mueller said that the current board members would fill out their terms and be replaced as attrition occurs.

The ordinance received a roll call vote of Ayes: 8, Nays: 0.

Olcott moved and Murphy seconded a motion to introduce and read Resolution 83-37 by title only. Clerk Williams read the resolution by title only.

Olcott moved and Murphy seconded a motion to adopt Resolution 83-37. Dilcher gave the synopsis. No Committee Report.

Steve Szostek noted an error in the address of the property under discussion. It should read 532 North Walnut Street. (Correction noted and made in the original resolution). The tax abatement will only apply to Mr. Tracy's improvements. He will renovate the main floor for business use and finish the upstair as a small apartment for his own personal use.
