Council President Murphy read the agenda summation.

Allison thanked the Theta Chi fraternity for the weekend clean-up of Lake Griffy. Allison also announced the All America City Banquet to be held on April 29, 1982 at 7:00 P.M. at the Alumni Hall, Indiana University Memorial Union. She also thanked Paul Mahlberg for his recent letter regarding sidewalk rebuilding.

Olcott moved and Morrison seconded a motion to introduce and read Ordinance 82-19 by title only. Clerk Williams read the ordinance by title only. Service read the legislative synopsis and the following amendments submitted by the petitioner's counsel.

- 1. In the fourth WHEREAS clause on page 1, the date March 25 should be filled in the two blanks.
- In Section III of page 1, the date of the underwriting agreement should be April 1.
- 3. In subsection (e) of Section IV on page 3, the interest rate should be 12½.
- In Section V on page 5 "the State of Ohio" should instead read "State of Indiana".

Olcott moved and Morrison seconded a motion to adopt the amendment:

Olcott moved and Morrison seconded a motion to adopt Ordinance 82-19 as amended.

Service addressed the issue of overdevelopment in this particular area and that the emphasis should be in the downtown area and not in one that is already overdeveloped. She also expressed concern about dereliction of the existing Kroger Eastland site.

Allison expressed concern about Kroger's littered parking lots. and wondered what the Kroger management had done about the problem. Lynn Coyne said that all the landlords and renters were notified. Richard Mospems, of the Kroger company; assured Allison that the littered parking lots were in fact being cleaned up and that Krogers would see that it continued.

Service asked who owned the Seminary Square property. Jerry Gates was named as the owner.
