Mayor Hooker commented that it was twenty years ago that the first local zoning ordinance was enacted. A great deal has occurred in Bloomington with its continued growth, and the growth of Indiana University, to Waive First Reading of and industries. It has long been the thought New Zoning Ordinance of the Plan Commission the 1950 Zoning Ordinance should be brought up to date. In 1968 the Plan Commission with the help of Clifford Curry, began consulting with citizens active in zoning, and serious work was started approximately a year ago to compile a new zoning ordinance. He commended the Chamber of Commerce, Home Builders, League of Women Voters, Sign Dealers, Bar Association, Mr. Frank BArnhart, Tom McDonald, Board of Realtors, Bloomington Hospital Board, FHA, East Central Neighborhood Association and Miller Drive Association for their help in considering the new ordinance.

He said this was an instrument which was de-veloped by, with and for the citizens of Bloomington, and called it a "hallmark" ordinance during his seven years.

Mr. James Cotner, City Attorney said the purpose of the amended ordinance is to effect a way to inform the public to a general degree than merely reading the ordinance. Due to the voluminous size of this ordinance it would be in effect meaningless and fail to inform the public and by framing an amended Ordinance, if entire council is present and unanimously agrees, the reading may be waived and in the place and stead of such reading the Clerk shall read such ordinance by title only and shall within 24 hours deposit for the purpose of the public, copies of said ordinance in the office of the Mayor, two copies in theoffice of the Clerk, of the City of Bloomington, three copies in the Monroe County Library and three copies in the office of the Chamber of Commerce of the City of Blooming-ton, and such copies shall be available for examination by the public.

Councilman Fee moved that proposed Ordinance No. 71-28 be introduced and read by the Clerk. Councilman Clegg seconded the motion and it carried by unanimous voice vote.
