

REGULAR MEETING

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in the Municipal Building on Thursday, October 21, 1965, at the hour of seven thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M.) E.S.T. in regular session with Mayor John H. Hooker, Jr. presiding.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Hooker.

A roll call of the Councilmen was taken by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Mayor Hooker stated that Councilman H. Day was on University business in Arizona and Councilman Johnson was unable to be here this evening.

Meeting opened with invocation by Councilman Moulden.

Councilman Faris moved, seconded by Councilman Fee, that the minutes of the October 7, 1965 meeting be approved as published and distributed. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Moulden, that proposed Ordinance 65-29 be advanced to second reading and read by title only. Motion carried unanimously.

Clerk-Treasurer read proposed Ordinance 65-29 by title only.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Faris, to amend proposed Ordinance 65-29 by striking the last sentence pertaining to the type of fuel for the motors. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Faris, that proposed Ordinance 65-29 be adopted as amended. Upon a roll call vote the motion was carried unanimously.

Councilman Moulden moved, seconded by Councilman Fee, that proposed Ordinance 65-30 be presented for first reading and read by the Clerk-Treasurer. Motion carried unanimously.

Clerk-Treasurer read proposed Ordinance 65-30.

Councilman Faris gave the following report from the Bloomington Traffic Commission.

The following have been approved by the Bloomington Traffic Commission and are now being presented to the Common Council Traffic Committee for further action:

Article XII Schedules
Sec. 17-193 One way streets and alleys

1. Be amended to exclude Grant Street, south between Tenth Street and First Street. (Grant becoming a two-way street again)
2. Prow Avenue, south from Tenth Street to Ninth Street.

3. Harold Avenue, south from Ninth Street to Eighth Street.

Councilman Faris moved, seconded by Councilman Fee, that the recommendations of the Bloomington Traffic Commission be approved and the City Attorney instructed to prepare the proper ordinance for first reading at the next regularly scheduled Council meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Tom McDonald asked if it were possible to have proposed Ordinance 65-30 advanced to second reading this evening as it was very urgent. Mr. McDonald stated that Dr. E. F. Hartke has given notice that he will vacate his present office on November 1st, and if we held second reading on this proposed Ordinance it would be November 4th. He further stated that Dr. Hartke has entered into an agreement with the University not to change the structure of the building, and if he does the University has the option to purchase the property from Dr. Hartke.

Councilman Moulden moved, seconded by Councilman C. Day, that rules and regulations of the Common Council be suspended. Upon a roll call vote the motion was carried unanimously.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Faris, that proposed Ordinance 65-30 be advanced to second reading and read by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was carried unanimously.

Councilman Derge and Councilman Fee both stated this rezoning is a special exception to a special case and our vote must not be interpreted as an invitation to any other property owner to make a similar request.

Marvard Clark, Assistant Engineer, stated that the University appeared on behalf of Dr. Hartke on the rezoning issue.

Clerk-Treasurer read proposed Ordinance 65-30 by title only.

Councilman Fee moved, seconded by Councilman Moulden, that proposed Ordinance 65-30 be adopted. Upon a roll call vote the motion was carried unanimously.

Councilman C. Day stated that he had a request for a street light in the area between North Woodburn and North College Avenue on West 15th Street. He further stated that he had explained to the residents that the City cannot install a light in the middle of a block, only at an intersection. He wanted to know if this was still the policy and if so, he would inform the people that it was their responsibility.

Mayor Hooker stated this was the correct policy.

Councilman Fee requested that the City Attorney and the Street Commissioner prepare an ordinance for the council's consideration in regard to snow removal.

Mayor Hooker stated that the City is still working on a proposed rate structure and exhibits to be presented before the public through the Common Council.

Mayor Hooker stated that we have received official notice from the United States Census Bureau, that the census that was requested by the City of Bloomington will begin December 1, 1965 and we should have an unofficial numeration by January 1, 1966.

Councilman C. Day asked about the \$11,850.00 payment to Louisville Paving Company by the Parks and Recreation Department.

Mr. J. T. Femal, Director of Parks and Recreation stated that this was for the two new tennis courts at Bryan Park.

Councilman Moulden moved, seconded by Councilman C. Day, that claims presented for payment on October 20, 1965 and October 22, 1965 be allowed. Motion carried unanimously.

No further business to come before the Common Council, Councilman Fee moved meeting be adjourned.

Meeting adjourned at the hour of eight fifteen o'clock (8:15 P.M.) E.S.T.
