THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chamber in City Hall, on Monday, January 2, 1956, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M.) in statutory session, with Mayor Lemon presiding.

Members present: Cook, Engleman, Miller, Sikes, Simpson, and Van Meter

Members absent: Chitwood

Mayor Lemon stated the purpose of this Statutory Neeting was for the organization of the Council. He appointed Councilman Sikes as chairman of the Committee of Rules, Ordinances and Printing and other members of the Committee, Councilmen Cook and Engleman. The Mayor declared a recess so the Committee might have a meeting and prepare their report.
