THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY of Bloomington, Indiana, met in adjourned session at 6:30 P. M. Central Standard Time on Monday August 28, 1950, with Mayor Lemon presiding.

Roll Call-Present: Black, Chitwood, Dunn, Parks, Shank, Sikes, Woolery. Absent: None.

Councilwoman Woolery introducted Resolution #7, 1950.

The Common Council now finds that pursuant to notice by publication on July 21, and July 28, 1950, in The Bloomington Star-Courier and in the Daily Herald-Tellephone, two newspapers of general circulation printed and published in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, giving notice that on August 1, 1950, at 6:30 0° clock P.M., Central Standard Time, the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, would in the Council Chamber in the City Hall in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, hold a public hearing in reference to whether federal rent control should, or should not, be continued in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, a public hearing was held on s aid date of August 1, 1950, at the place indicated in reference to whether federal rent control should, or should not, be continued in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, a public hearing

The Common Council further finds, as a result of said hearing, that there no longer exists such a shortage in rental housing accommodations in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, as to require rent control in said City of Bloomington, Indiana, and based upon the facts hereinbefore found to exist the following Relolution was introducedby Councilman Woolery:

"BE IT RESOLVED, That the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, find, and it does hereby find that there no longer exists such a shortage in rental housing accommodations in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, as to require rent control in said City of Bloomington, Indiana, and based upon said finding,

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That rent control in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, be, and the same hereby is, terminated"

The above findings of fact and the above Resolution were submitted to a vote, and a vote upon such findings of fact, and upon said Resolution, were as follows:

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Said findings of fact and Resolution now found to be adopted this 28th day of August, 1950.

A suit by Sarkes Tarzian was brought against the City of Bloomington, to have an Alley vacated running East and West long side of his place of business at 537 South Walnut Street.

Councilman Shank moved this petition be referred to the Streets, Alley and Bridges Committee for study and report back to the Council whether they wish to have the City Attorney instructed to contest this suit for vacating the alley referred to, seconded by Councilman Dunn; Motion carried.

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Appropriation Ordianace #4, 1950 providing for Budgets for all departments of the Civil City for 1951, was adopted on first reading under suspension of rules, Motion for suspension of rules was made by Councilwoman Woolery, seconded by Counilman Sikes; Upon roll call vote the vote was unamious. Motion for adoption of Ordinance \$4, 1950 was made by Councilwoman Woolery, seconded by Councilman Sikes. Roll call vote was unamious.

Mayor Lemon declared Ordinance #4, 1950 adopted.

ORDINANCE FOR APPROPRIATIONS Ordinance No. 4 1950

An ordinance appropriating moneys for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the several departments of the city government of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 1951, and ending December 31, 1951, including all outstanding claims and obligations, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

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Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, That for the expenses of the city government and its institutions, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1951, the following sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same. Such sums herein appropriated shall be held to include all expenditures authorized to be made during the year, unless otherwise expressly stipulated and provided by law.
