## Committee of the Whole and Special Session to Close Out the Year Next Wednesday, December 10<sup>th</sup>

The Council will hold two meetings and, in all likelihood, close out its business for the year next week. The first meeting is a Committee of the Whole to consider the one ordinance introduced at the last meeting. The legislation and related information for that ordinance can be found online as indicated above. The second meeting is a Special Session to consider two ordinances forwarded from the last meeting, the one ordinance discussed at the Committee of the Whole, and an Interim Report from the Council Sidewalk Committee. The legislation and information for those ordinances can be found online as indicated above and the Interim Report is enclosed with this packet and briefly mentioned below.

### 2015 Council Sidewalk Committee Request to Amend 2014 Funding Recommendations

In the course of working through its funding recommendations for 2015, the Council Sidewalk Committee reviewed funding for 2014 and learned that some projects did not move forward and that some funds remain unspent. Rather than have the funds revert to the Alternative Transportation Fund at the end of the year, the Committee adopted two motions. The first motion requested that the Council amend the funding recommendations of the 2014 Council Sidewalk Report to shift use of unspent funds to move existing projects forward and to fund design for a new project initially intended to be done in-house. The second motion recommended that the Council respectfully request that the Mayor consider proposing an additional appropriation in 2015 to allow the Committee to make use of the balance of the unspent 2014 allocations in its 2015 recommendations. ## Request from 2015 Council Sidewalk Committee for the Common Council to Amend the 2014 Committee Report

The 2015 Council Sidewalk Committee<sup>1</sup> adopted a motion at its meeting on December 2, 2014 to request that the Council amend the funding recommendations of the 2014 Sidewalk Report by December 10, 2014.<sup>2</sup> That Report was approved by the Council on January 15, 2014 and recommended allocation of \$298,301.78 of Alternative Transportation Funds in 2014 toward six sidewalk projects and a possible traffic-calming project.<sup>3</sup>

Since that time, two sidewalk projects were completed in their entirety; phases of two more projects were finished; but, for various reasons, two sidewalk projects and a possible traffic-calming project did not move forward. All told, approximately \$124,104.47 in Council Sidewalk Committee allocations <sup>4</sup> will be left unspent in 2014 unless further action is taken. The following is a break-down of unspent funds:

Two Projects Completed - Construction of Sidewalks -\$28,762.67 Unspent

- Maxwell Lane from Jordan to Sheridan (north side) Construction \$28,762.67 (Unspent funds after construction was completed.)
- Leonard Springs Road from Wal-Mart entrance to Tapp Road (east side) Construction (Contribution Toward County Project) - \$0 (Unspent)

Phases of Two Projects Finished - Design - \$5,198.80 Unspent

- Kinser Pike from West 17<sup>th</sup> north to existing sidewalk (east side) Design \$5,198.8 (Unspent after design.)
- West 17<sup>th</sup> Street from Maple to Madison Street (south side) Design \$0 (Unspent)

Two Sidewalk Projects Without Progress - \$75,143 (Unspent)

- 7<sup>th</sup> Street Ramp from SR45/46 Bypass to East 7<sup>th</sup> Street (west side) Design and Construction -\$20,000 (unspent)
- Sheffield from Morningside Drive to Providence (west side) Design and Construction -\$55,143 (unspent)

#### Possible Traffic-Calming Projects - None Pursued - \$15,000 (Unspent)

• Possible Traffic-Calming Projects – including one by Fairview School - \$15,000 (unspent)

For a more detailed view of the recommended, actual, and proposed adjustment in allocations for each project, please see the attached Status of 2014 Council Sidewalk Committee Recommendations and Recommended Adjustments (December 2014).

Rather than have this money revert to the Alternative Transportation Fund at the end of the year, the Committee recommends that approximately \$69,530 be reallocated to move each unfinished project on the 2014 funding list forward. Please note that this does not include any traffic-calming projects because none were pursued this year. These next steps typically involve appraisals and designs (some of which were initially to be done in-house).

In addition, the Committee agreed with staff that \$26,320 be used for the design of a currently unfunded project that appears on the Committee's List of Prioritized Projects. It is a sidewalk/storm water project on Fairview near Dodds. (See Map of the Fairview area [attached] and the Evaluation Sheet in last year's Report.<sup>5</sup>)

Lastly, the Committee recommends that the Council respectfully request that the Mayor consider offering an additional appropriation in 2015 of unspent 2014 funds. This would amount to about \$55,000 and be available for allocation by the Committee next year. The motion was proposed after the Chair informed the Committee that the Mayor was favorably inclined to offer such legislation in 2015. Approval of the Report would formalize that request.

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO COUNCIL SIDEWALK COMMITTEE FORMAL RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 2014 - FUNDS AVAILABLE: \$300,000

- Alternative Transportation Fund (ATF) Use the \$300,000 of Alternative Transportation Funds appropriated in 2014 for sidewalk and traffic-calming projects.
- **CBU Assistance with Storm Water Component of Council Sidewalk Projects** While no longer setting aside funds for the storm water component of Council sidewalk projects, CBU continues to look at proposed projects and see whether it can provide some in-kind contributions.
- Note: The Committee is also recommending that the Council Respectfully Request that the Mayor Consider an Additional Appropriation Equaling Unspent 2014 Funds in 2015. That amount would be between \$54,575 (if using total recommended funding of \$298,301.48) and \$56,273 (if using total appropriation of \$300,000)
