One Appropriation Ordinance Ready for Introduction at a Special Session Three Items for Discussion at the Committee of the Whole

The agenda for next Wednesday includes one item for introduction at a Special Session and three items for discussion at the Committee of the Whole. The item scheduled for introduction is a year-end appropriation ordinance. The appropriation ordinance and two pieces of legislation related to solicitors, food trucks, and pushcarts (<u>Ord 14-24</u> and <u>Ord 14-25</u>) will be discussed at the Committee of the Whole immediately following the Special Session. The legislation and background material for <u>Ord 14-24</u> and <u>Ord 14-25</u> was issued in last week's packet, as cited above. The appropriation ordinance and supporting material are contained herein.

Special Session – First Reading

Appropriation Ordinance 14-06 (End-of-Year Appropriation Ordinance)

<u>App Ord 14-06</u> is scheduled for introduction and discussion this Wednesday. Otherwise referred to as the typical end-of-year appropriation ordinance, this legislation proposes to make a number of inter-departmental transfers from those departments with a surplus to those who anticipate shortages. The measure also appropriates \$282,551 in additional monies from the following funds: the Risk Management Fund, BMFC Showers, BMFC 1998 Street Lease, Golf Course, 2001 Park Bond and 1998 Street II Bond Funds, Art Commission Non-reverting Fund, and the Rental Inspection Program Fund. The nature of the transfers and the additional appropriations are described below.

General Fund Transfers- Zero Net Impact

<u>App Ord 14-06</u> transfers \$234,400 in General Fund monies from departments which have a surplus to departments which may have a shortfall. According to the memo submitted by Controller Underwood, these transfers are made to cover the difference between the initial budget prepared for 2014 and the actual operational results. Departmental surpluses are typically due to budgeting for positions that become vacant. Departmental deficits stem from overtime expenses, additional hours for temporary employees, additional staff, salary increases, and payout for departing employees. As Controller Underwood makes clear, these transfers simply shift money between departments – the transfers will have a "zero net impact" on the total budget.

Fire Pension Fund – Zero Net Impact

As described in the memo from Underwood, this is a transfer of 200,000 from one line (Category 2 – supplies) to another (Category 3 – services and charges) within the Fire Pension Fund. The transfer is necessary to cover the pension costs paid to widows and widowers of deceased firefighters. The net impact of this appropriation is zero.

Risk Management Fund – \$150,000 additional appropriation

Unlike the General and Fire Pension fund appropriations, this request is for an additional appropriation of \$150,000 to cover the increasing costs associated with worker compensation. As communicated by Underwood, the increased costs are due to "several higher cost injuries coupled with higher medical and pharmacy costs." As required by the DGLF, Underwood explains that the cash balance in the fund will support the additional appropriation.

Bond Appropriations -- \$951 additional appropriations

The Controller provisions for the City's bonds. As communicated by Controller Underwood, the funds budgeted for five bond funds in 2014 will not be sufficient to cover the bank fees charged for the administration of these funds. For that reason, this appropriation ordinance appropriates additional money to the following funds in the following amounts:

BCAC Non-Reverting Fund -- \$1,600 additional appropriation

The enabling legislation for the Bloomington Community Arts Commission requires the approval of the Council for expenditures greater than \$5,000. (Ord 02-38). In 2014, the BCAC expects to expend \$1,600 over the \$5,000 limit.

HAND Rental Inspection Program -- \$130,000 additional appropriation

In 2012, the Indiana General Assembly enacted a new law to require that rental inspection fees be deposited in a separate fund (I.C. §36-1-20-3). Locally, the Rental Inspection Program Fund is the fund into which local inspection fees are deposited. As of 31 October 2014, \$130,000 in inspection fee revenue has been deposited into the fund. While revenue is deposited into this designated fund, the expenses for the rental inspection program are appropriated in the General Fund. This appropriation ordinance reimburses the General Fund \$130,000 for program expenses.

TO SPECIALLY APPROPRIATE FROM THE GENERAL FUND, PARKS GENERAL FUND, FIRE CAPITAL FUND, RISK MANAGEMENT FUND, AND RENTAL INSPECTION PROGRAM FUND EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED (Appropriating Various Transfers of Funds within the General Fund, Fire Pension Fund; and, Appropriating Additional Funds from the Arts Commission Operating Fund, Risk Management Fund, BMFC Showers Bond, 1998 Street Bond II, Golf Course Bond, BMFC 1998 Street Lease and Rental Inspection Program Fund)

WHEREAS,	various Departments desire to transfer within the General Fund amounts in Categories 1, 2 & 3 amounts to cover expenses not originally included in the adopted budget; and
WHEREAS,	the Fire Department desires to transfer funds from its Category 1 to its Category 3 in its Fire Pension Fund to fund payments due to widows/widowers of deceased firefighters; and
WHEREAS,	the Risk Management Department desires to increase its budget in Category 3 to pay for additional claims related to workers compensation; and
WHEREAS,	the Controller's Department desires to increase its budget in Category 3 to pay for bank fees for the BMFC Showers Bond, 1998 Street Bond II, Golf Course Bond, BMFC 1998 Street Lease and 2001 Parks Bond; and
WHEREAS,	the Bloomington Community Arts Commission desires to increase its budget in Category 3 to pay for expenditures greater than \$5,000; and
WHEREAS,	the Housing & Neighborhood Development Department desires to increase its budget in Category 3 in its Rental Inspection Program Fund to reimburse the General Fund for program expenses;

It also appropriates additional funds from the Risk Management Fund, BMFC Showers, BMFC 1998 Street Lease, Golf Course, 2001Parks Bond and 1998 Street II Bond Funds, Art Commission Non-reverting Fund and Rental Inspection Program Fund.

Memorandum

Appropriation Ordinance 14-06 is our comprehensive 2014 year-end appropriation. The total "net" additional appropriation is \$282,551.00. In addition, there are appropriations that are simple transfers between departments that have zero net impact on the total budget.

- 1. **General Fund Various.** The majority of this ordinance transfers appropriations between departments and categories in order to cover changes between initial budget prepared and actual operational results. As in previous years, the net effect on the actual appropriation from the General Fund is Zero.
- Fire Pension Fire. This is a transfer between classifications to cover pension costs related to
 payments made to widow/widowers of deceased firefighters. The cash balance in the fund will
 support the additional appropriation.
- 3. **Risk Management Risk.** This is a request for an additional appropriation in this fund to cover increased costs related to worker compensation. This is due primarily to several higher cost injuries coupled with higher medical and pharmacy costs. The cash balance in the fund will support the additional appropriation.
- 4. **Bond Appropriations.** Five bond funds budgeted 2014 appropriations were not sufficient to cover the bank fees charged by the financial institutions to administer these funds. In all cases the cash balance in the fund will support the additional appropriation.
 - a. BMFC-Showers. Additional appropriation of \$125.00.
 - b. 1998 Street Bond II. Additional appropriation of \$350.00.
 - c. Golf Course Bond. Additional appropriation of \$350.00.
 - d. BMFC-1998 Street Lease. Additional appropriation of \$125.00.
 - e. 2001 Parks Bond. Additional appropriation of \$1.00.
- Bloomington Community Arts Commission Non-reverting BCAC. The ordinance establishing this fund requires approval from the City Council for any expenditure's greater than \$5,000.00. It is estimated that the Commission will expend an additional \$1,600.00. The cash fund in the fund is sufficient will support these expenditures.
- 6. Rental Inspection Program HAND. In 2012 the state legislature created new rules regarding rental inspection programs. This requires the City to deposit receipts from the program in a designated fund. As of October 31, that fund has collected approximately \$130,000.00 for 2014. Although the revenue is now accounted for in the new fund, expenses for the program are still appropriated in the general fund. As such, we will be creating an invoice to reimburse the general fund from the rental inspection program fund.
