One Item Ready for Second Reading But No Items Ready for Introduction at the Regular Session on Wednesday, May 21st

There is one item ready for second reading, but no items ready for introduction at the Regular Session next Wednesday. The item for second reading can be found online as indicated above.

Second Readings – Proposed Reasonable Conditions for <u>Ord 14-06</u> (Cohousing PUD)

Two Council members have approached the Council Office about three Reasonable Conditions for <u>Ord 14-06</u> (Cohousing PUD). The sponsors and summaries for these proposed reasonable conditions are listed below (with the understanding that copies will be released once drafts are approved by the sponsors):

- RC-01 (Sponsor, Cm. Sturbaum) would require traffic calming devices to be installed on the connecting segment of Short Street;
- RC-02 (Sponsor, Cm. Rollo) would make a connected Short Street safer for children at the Montessori School; and
- RC-03 (Sponsor, Cm. Rollo) would provide for the City and petitioner to share the cost of connecting Short Street. *Please note that, while the City has worked in concert with developers regarding public investments, I don't recall formally incorporating a cost-sharing agreement into a rezoning approval. I'll be working with the sponsor and City officials on how to arrange for cost-sharing at this point in the project.*
