NEW BUSINESS

According to Kerry, the business called The Warehouse is circulating a petition claiming that the city has closed it until refurbishments to its parking lots meet the landscaping/tree planting requirements. Erin said the DNR has mandated remediation planting, and the city has told the business that work on the parking lot cannot be continued until the remediation planting has been done. Whether that is equivalent to 'closing the business' is unclear.

Erin had submitted an initial draft of a 'walk map' for Bryan Park (attached). She said the city already has a contract with an app developer who could develop a phone app to guide people who wanted to know about the trees on the walk.

- 1: Young grove of Blackgum (Nyssa sylvatica), 2-4" DBH
- 2: Young grove of Tulip Trees (Liriodendron tulipifera), 2-4" DBH
- 3: Young Yellowwood (Cladrastis kentukea), ~2" DBH
- 4: Mature Bald Cypress (Taxodium distichum), 24" DBH
- 5: Maturing Yellowwood (Cladrastis kentukea), 16" DBH
- 6: Young Bald Cypress (Taxodium distichum), 5" DBH
- 7: Maturing Tulip Tree (Liriodendron tulipifera), 7" DBH
- 8: Mature Tulip Tree (Liriordendron tulipifera), 29" DBH
- 9: Mature Red Oaks (Quercus rubra), 17-21" DBH
- 10: Maturing Red Oak (Quercus rubra), 13" DBH
- 11: Young Red Oak (Quercus rubra), 7" DBH
- 12: Maturing Bald Cypress (Taxodium), 13" DBH
