BLOOMINGTON BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Bloomington Board of Public Safety held a Regular Session on Tuesday, March 22, 2022, at 6:00 p.m., in person in the City of Bloomington McCloskey Conference Room located at 401 N. Morton Street, Bloomington, Indiana.

CALL TO ORDER

Board President Kim Gray called the meeting to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. Board members Luis Fuentes-Rohwer and Shruti Rana were present.

Board members Maqubé Reese was not present.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

Board member Luis Fuentes-Rohwer moved to approve the meeting minutes from February 15, 2022. Board member Shruti Rana seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, 3-0.

POLICE DEPARTMENT BUSINESS

Report on Monthly Statistics, Training and Incident Reports:

Deputy Police Chief Joe Qualters presented the monthly statistics and training.

General Business:

Deputy Police Chief Joe Qualters provided an update.

Purchases: Expenditures/Procurements:

Deputy Police Chief Joe Qualters said there will be some expenditures for body cams.

Personnel:

Deputy Police Chief Joe Qualters and Captain Ryan Pedigo provided an update, noting that they are short staffed. 

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


2021-2022 Calls For Service Totals




March 2022 Nuisance Calls for Service











2021-2022 Adult Arrests


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2021-2022 Juvenile Referrals
