## Two Items Ready for Final Action and One Item Ready for Introduction at the Regular Session on Wednesday, February 29th

There are two items ready for final action and one item ready for introduction at the Regular Session next Wednesday. The two items ready for final action can be found online at the links noted above, and the one item ready for introduction can be found in this packet and is summarized herein.

## **Special Session on March 7<sup>th</sup>**

You may remember that next Wednesday begins the Spring Break Legislative Cycle of the Council. That starts with a Regular Session on February 29<sup>th</sup>, continues with a Committee of the Whole on March 7<sup>th</sup>, skips a meeting during Spring Break, and concludes with a Regular Session on March 21<sup>st</sup>. As you've read about in the paper

and heard about otherwise, there is a package of incentives being offered to a software company (Citigal), which is scheduled to come to the Council as resolution for discussion at the Committee of the Whole on March 7<sup>th</sup>. At the request of the petitioner and staff, Deputy Mayor Maria Heslin is asking that the Council consider this matter at one hearing on that date. This could be arranged with a vote next Wednesday to hold a Special Session on March 7<sup>th</sup>, prior to the Committee of the Whole.

#### **First Readings:**

## Item One – <u>App Ord 12-01</u> (Appropriating Funds to Purchase the Black Lumber Rail Spur)

App Ord 12-01 appropriates \$10,000 from the Parks Land Acquisition Fund<sup>1</sup> to purchase the 1/3 mile long Black Lumber Rail Spur between Henderson and Walnut Street. According to the Memo from Mick Renneisen, Director of the Parks and Recreation Department, the City has been evaluating this acquisition since 2005 when it wasw contacted by Black Lumber about its purchase.

**Proposed Multi-Use Trail.** The spur appears on the 2008 Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation and Greenways System Plan as a medium-priority project and "create(s) a strategic bicycle and pedestrian multi-use trail connection from Henderson to Walnut (with proximity to Bloomington South High School) ... and connectivity to the B-Line Trail and future Switchyard Park property."

**Environmental Assessment.** As you know, the City has experience acquiring rail corridors and took the step of commissioning a Phase 1 (in 2005) and Phase 2 (in 2007) Environmental Assessment. Those studies revealed "some remnant railroad and vehicle waste (tires, coal ash and cinder, vehicle fluid spills)" which the City's environmental consultants assure can be "remediated and made safe for a public trail use."

**Steps Toward Purchase.** The City has negotiated with Black Lumber which announced its intent to convey the property via a quit claim several years ago. While the property was appraised at \$145,000 in 2005, the seller began by offering to sell it for \$25,000 and then agreed upon \$10,000.

**Improvement, Management, and Maintenance.** At some point in the future, if all goes well, the City intends to construct a multi-use path along the spur and a crossing at Walnut Street. The improvements would cost over \$500,000 and appear on the 2014/2015 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) (yet to be adopted). Prior to construction of the trail, the memo indicates the costs for maintenance should be "incidental and on an as-needed only basis."

**Conclusion.** Given its cost, proximity to trails, parks and schools, ease of conveyance, and the City's familiarity with the associated environmental remediation, the Parks and Recreation Department "feels this is a high priority and very strategic acquisition."

#### **APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 12-01**

# TO SPECIALLY APPROPRIATE FROM THE PARKS LAND ACQUISITION FUND EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED

(Appropriating Funds for the purchase of the Black Lumber Rail Spur)

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation department wishes to expend \$10,000 from the Parks Land Acquisition Fund for the purchase of the Black Lumber Rail Spur;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

#### **SYNOPSIS**

This ordinance appropriates \$10,000 from the Parks Land Acquisition Fund for the purchase of the Black Lumber Rail Spur.

**Proposed Land Acquisition:** *Black Lumber Abandoned Rail Corridor – E. Walnut to W. Henderson – approx. .32 mile.* 

The land acquisition evaluation of the aforementioned property, also known as the *Black Lumber Rail Spur*, has been ongoing since 2005 when the City was first contacted re: possible interest in purchase of the corridor from the Black Lumber Company.

#### **Environmental Assessment**

The Parks and Recreation department commissioned Phase I (2005) and Phase II (2007) Environmental Site Assessments of the property as a customary due diligence step in our land acquisition evaluation process. The corridor has some remnant railroad and vehicle waste (tires, coal ash and cinder, vehicle fluid spills) but we have been assured by our environmental consultants that the site can be remediated and made safe for public trail use.

#### **Acquisition Considerations**

Acquisition would create a strategic bicycle and pedestrian multi-use trail connection from Henderson St. to Walnut and connectivity to the B-Line Trail and future Switchyard Park property. The Black Lumber abandoned railroad spur is listed as a medium priority on the 2008 *Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation and Greenways System Plan*. The Black Lumber Co. legally noticed their intent to Quit Claim the property several years ago. There are no claims of ownership by adjoining property owners, allowing the City to deal with one property owner for the entire 1/3 mile length of the abandoned rail corridor.

#### Cost

Through ongoing negotiations with Black Lumber, the purchase price has been lowered from a starting point of \$25,000 to the current purchase offer of \$10,000. The property was appraised in January 2005 with an estimated fair market value of \$145,000.

#### **Priority**

The department feels this is a high priority and very strategic acquisition due to its cost, location in proximity to Bloomington High School South, B-Line Trail, and future Switchyard Park, one deed ownership of the entire 1/3 mile corridor, and because environmental remediation can be accomplished using the same methods employed for cleanup of the B-Line Trail corridor.

#### **Management/ and Maintenance**

If the corridor is acquired it is unknown when construction of a multi-use trail with Walnut St. crossing would occur. The project is currently listed in the 2014/2015 State *Transportation Improvement Program* (not adopted) with estimated funding allocations totaling over \$500,000. Until trail construction is completed, maintenance responsibilities for the property are assumed to be incidental and on an as-needed only basis.
