Lauren discussed the climate change assessment that Monroe County participated in. The county did reasonably well on floodplain management response. There were a few deficiencies (Communication specifically). Unfortunately, many counties in Indiana didn't participate in this assessment. The county

i. October Plan Commission cases

The Plan Commission meeting this month will have three cases that we have already discussed. They are the following: Ivy Chase subdivision, Johnson Creamery, and Ridge Field section five. There is one new case which is a simple subdivision. It is on West Third Street. It is a request for a preliminary plat approval, and it is a mixed corridor zoning district. The lot is 2 and a half acres and a third of it was developed as an assistant living facility. The petitioner wants to subdivide it. The site originally had two sink holes on it, but those were removed once the assistant living facility was built. There are no environmental impediments. The petition is just for a sub-division.
