BLOOMINGTON BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Bloomington Board of Public Safety held a Regular Session on **Tuesday, June 21, 2022, at 6:00 p.m.**, in person in the City of Bloomington Allison Conference Room located at 401 N. Morton Street, Bloomington, Indiana.

CALL TO ORDER

Board President Kim Gray called the meeting to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. Board members Maqubé Reese and Isak Nti Asare were present in person.

Board members Shruti Rana and Natalia Galvan were not present either in person or via zoom.

CERTIFICATION OF EXECUTIVE SESSION

Board President Kim Gray certified the executive session held earlier that evening.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

Board member Isak Nti Asare moved to approve the meeting minutes from the March 22, 2022 regular session. Board member Maqubé Reese seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, 3-0.

Board attorney Chris Wheeler provided information on Roberts Rules of Order. Board member Maqubé Reese seconded the motion. Discussion ensued and ultimately lead to a unanimous vote, 3-0.

Discipline of Firefighter Deon Walton:

Board member Maqubé Reese moved to suspend firefighter Deon Walton without pay effective until the next board meeting if he did not pass the EMT exam prior to the next meeting. Board member Isak Nti Asare seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, 3-0.

A Resolution to Posthumously Promote Robert Lee Loviscek, Jr. to the Rank of Captain

WHEREAS, Robert Lee Loviscek, Jr. (“Bob”) was hired as a firefighter with the Bloomington Fire Department on the 23rd day of March, 2003; and

WHEREAS, Bob represented the City of Bloomington and the Bloomington Fire Department with integrity, dedication and professionalism throughout his 19+ years of service; and

WHEREAS, Bob served as Union President for the Bloomington Metropolitan International Association of Fire Fighters Local 586 for 11 years; and

WHEREAS, Bob held the merited rank of Sergeant and for the last 3 years was the Logistics Officer for the department; and

WHEREAS, the position of Logistics Officer is equivalent in roles and responsibilities to that of a Captain; and

WHEREAS, Bob’s performance of his duties and dedication to the job until his unexpected passing on July 5, 2022 warrant recognition; and

WHEREAS, Chief Jason Moore has recommended that the Board of Public Safety posthumously promote Bob to the rank of Captain to honor his career long dedication to the professional life and service of a firefighter with the Bloomington Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Safety finds that it is appropriate and fitting to make this posthumous promotion to honor the memory, life and service of Robert Lee Loviscek, Jr.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

Commencing forthwith, Robert Lee Loviscek, Jr. shall be and is promoted to the rank of Captain in the Bloomington Fire Department.

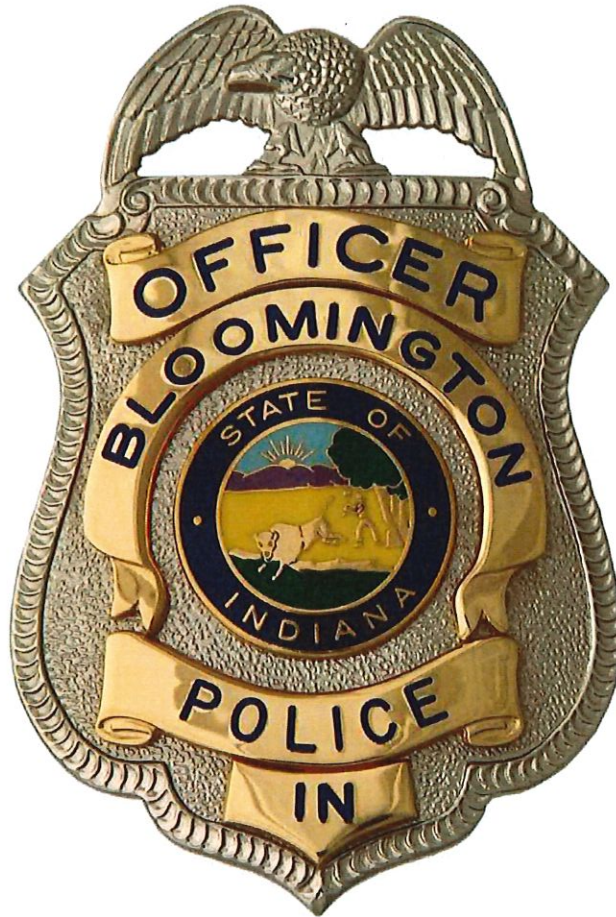

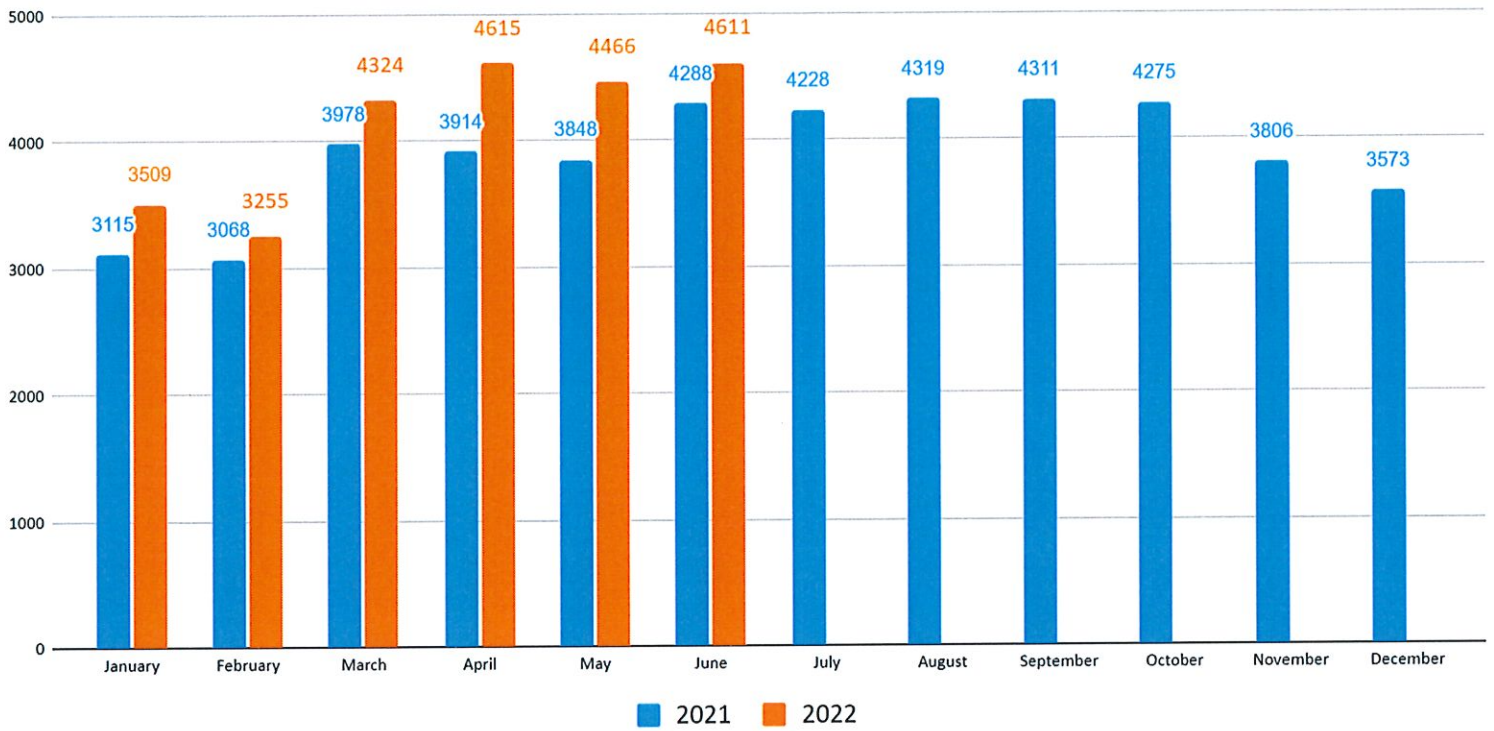

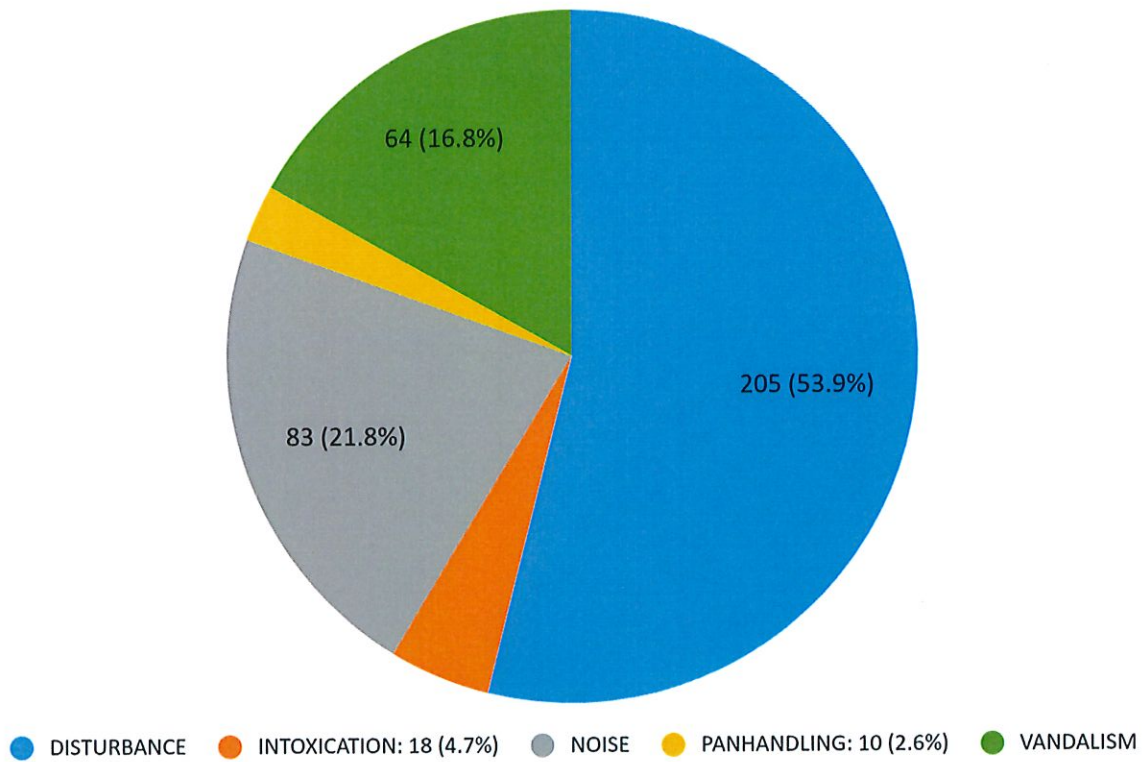

2021-2022 Calls For Service Totals

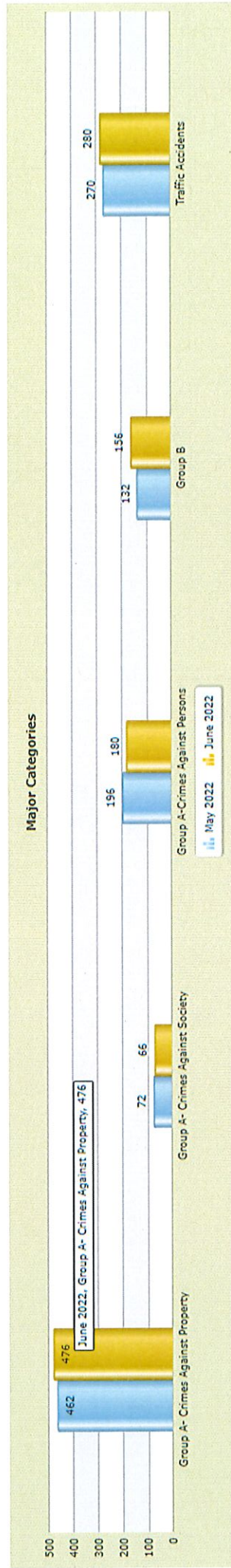


June 2022 Nuisance Calls for Service

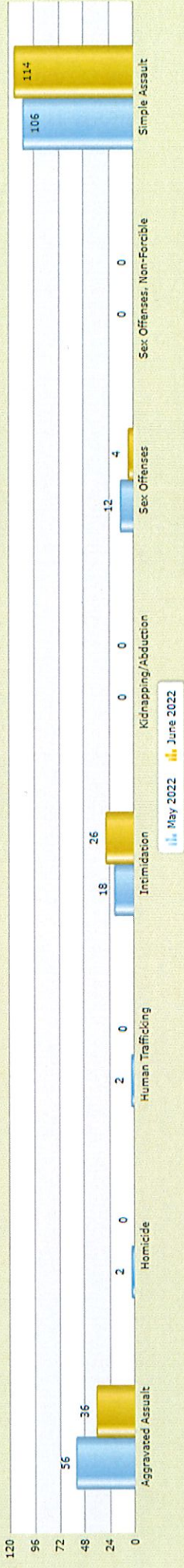

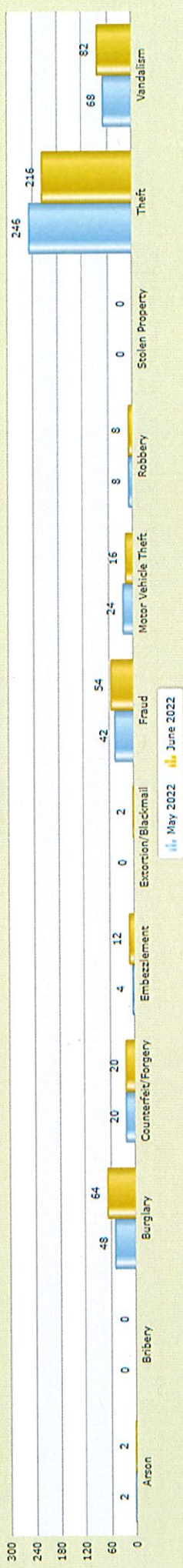

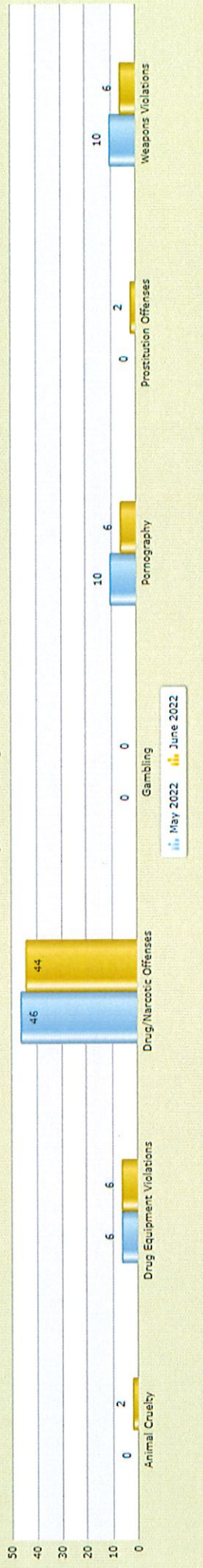

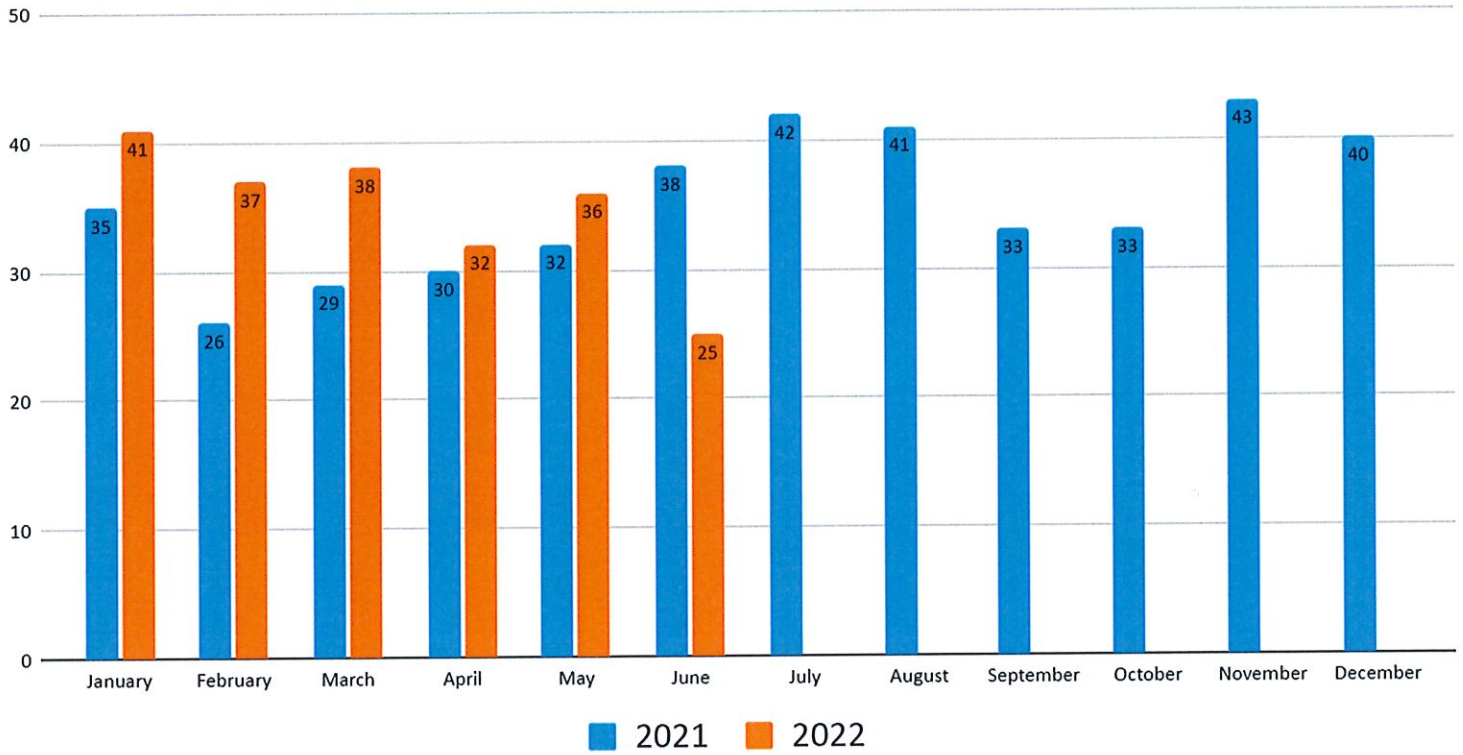
2021-2022 Adult Arrests
