**New Business:**

- A. **Remembrance Day Event Debrief:** Discussed the remembrance event (book conversation/speech small group discussions), commissioners shared their experiences and thoughts that it would be a great event to repeat. It was a partnership with NAACP, Morgenstern Bookstore, and MLK Commission. Gloria shared that Morgenstern was excited to partner for future events.
- B. **Future of Policing Task Force:** Malik has been a part of this task force and shared an update. There was a public forum last week, one of several small group activities hosted. There were about 10 participants, a cross section of residents including some from the Crestmont community where there were several shooting incidents in the past year. At this stage the task force is working on fact finding and community outreach. They want to make sure to move forward with informed discussion and accountability to having as much community input as possible. They would like community input from all different neighborhoods in the county. There has been recent concern about gun violence and how to better address this going into the summertime. There are questions about enforcement but also responsiveness so that when residents have concerns they are addressed in a timely manner, not after a problem has already occurred, and that this responsiveness is equitable in all neighborhoods.
- C. **Next Year's Speaker:** Michael received rates and availability for 2 of the 3 speakers discussed last month. Wisdom O. Cole is interested in talking with us but did not send details yet. By the next meeting we will have prices and availability for all 3 (Cole, tbd. Park Cannon: \$4,000, from Georgia. Ericka Huggins: \$6,000, from San Francisco).

**Public Comments (non-MLK Commissioners):** Dan spoke about the importance of addressing the Ukraine situation, particularly noting the impact on world food availability due to Ukraine's importance for wheat production. He encouraged the commission to take action.
