Request: Anticipated Fiscal Impact–Title 15 Amendments

REPORT

The anticipated fiscal impact statement describes the impact of the changes in Title 15 Amendments on the city's finances, including but not limited to revenues, expenditures, and any new debt obligations based on local code (BMC 2.04.290).

Generally, anticipated expenditures are covered by the 202 Budget to add or remove signs, poles, etc. related to the Title 15 changes proposed. For pay-by-phone parking changes, signs are provided by the vendor, ParkMobile, for free. For adding two signalized intersections, Walnut Street at 11th Street and 14th Street, there are no anticipated expenditures. These signals are already funded at approximately \$750,000 total.

Regarding anticipated revenues, adding pay-by-phone parking spaces and the Garden Hill Residential Neighborhood Permit Parking Zone, will depend on demand. Adding a \$25 administrative fee for towing vehicles, also depends on demand or the number of cases. In both instances the total revenue is not anticipated to be significant compared to all parking revenues.
