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## **BLOOMINGTON BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY**

The Bloomington Board of Public Safety held a Regular Session on **Tuesday, July 19, 2022, at 6:00 p.m.**, in person in the City of Bloomington Allison Conference Room located at 401 N. Morton Street, Bloomington, Indiana and also via Zoom.

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Board President Kim Gray called the meeting to order at approximately 6:28 p.m. Board members Maqubé Reese and Isak Nti Asare were present.

Board member Natalia Galvan was present via Zoom.

Board member Shruti Rana was not present.

### **CERTIFICATION OF EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Board President Kim certified the executive session held earlier that evening.

### **APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES**

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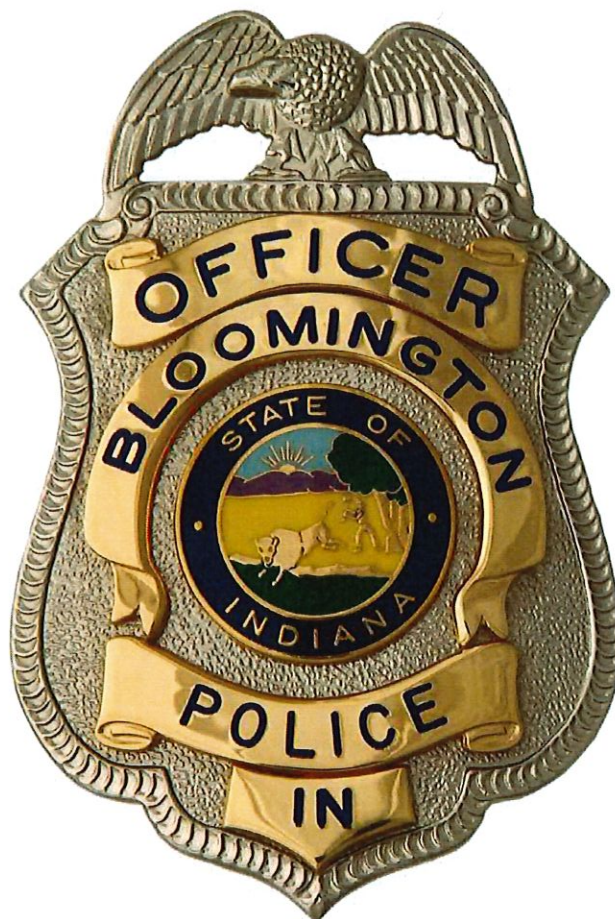

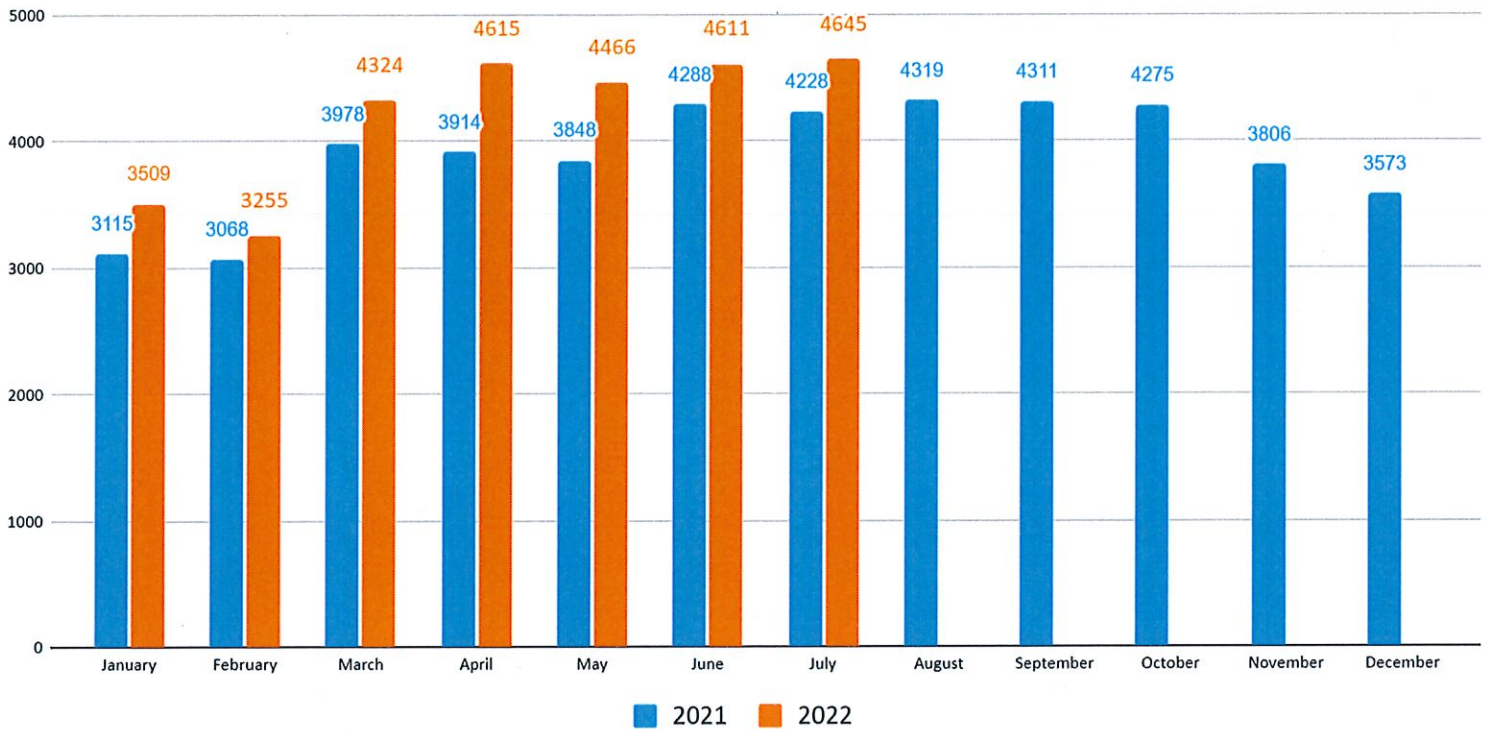

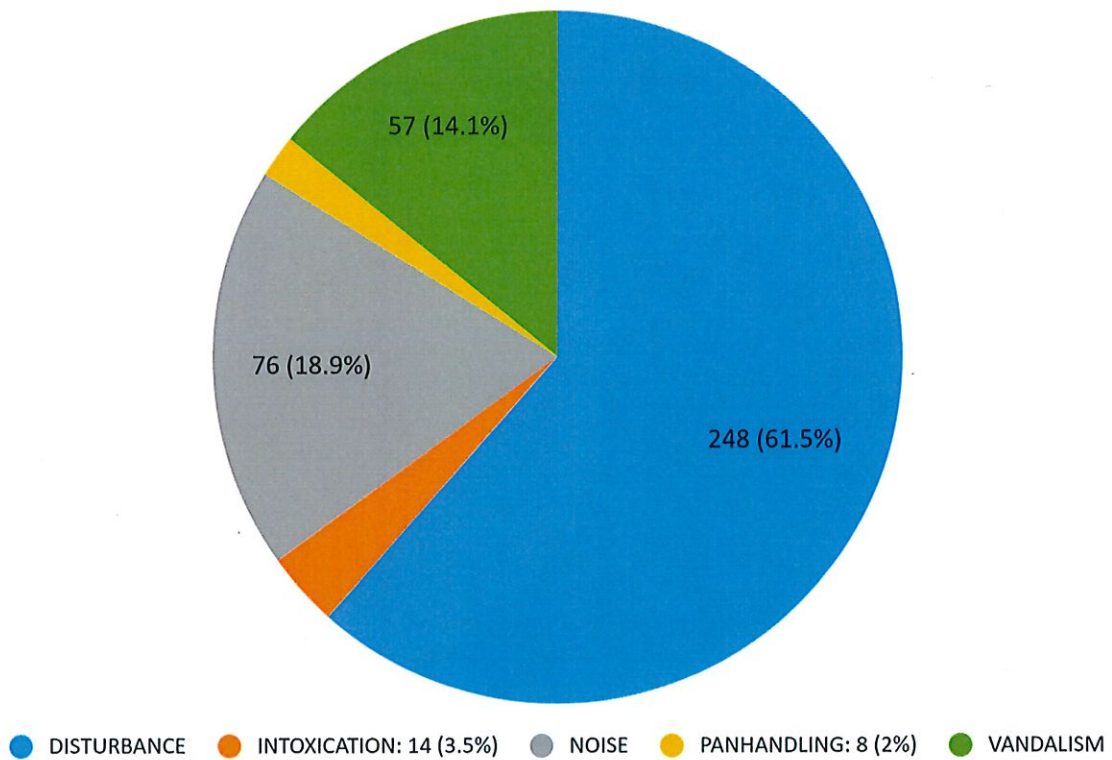

### 2021-2022 Calls For Service Totals

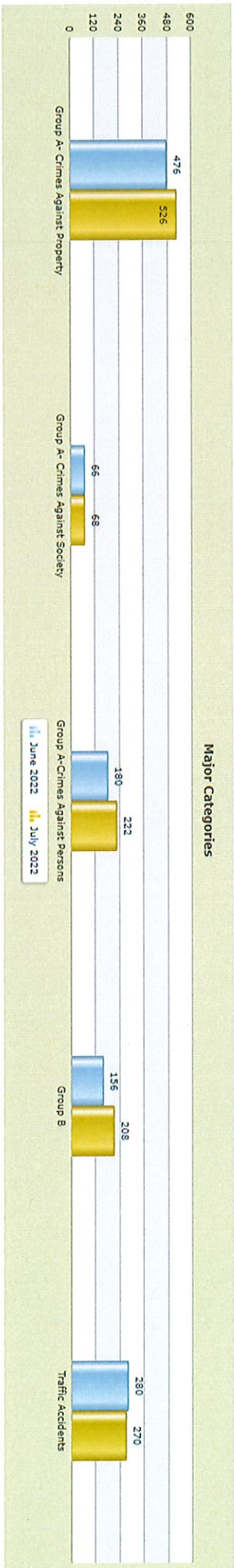


### July 2022 Nuisance Calls for Service



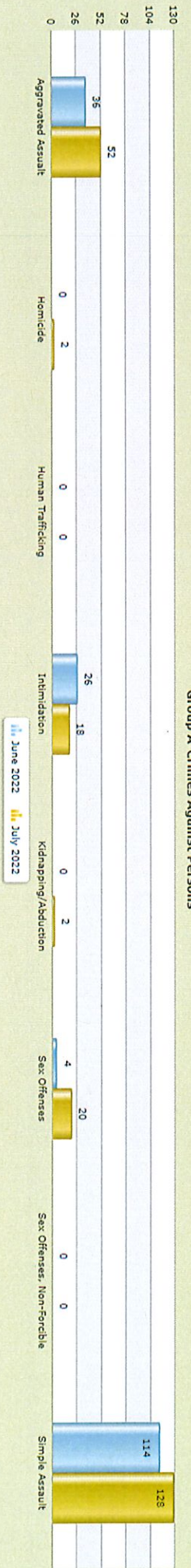

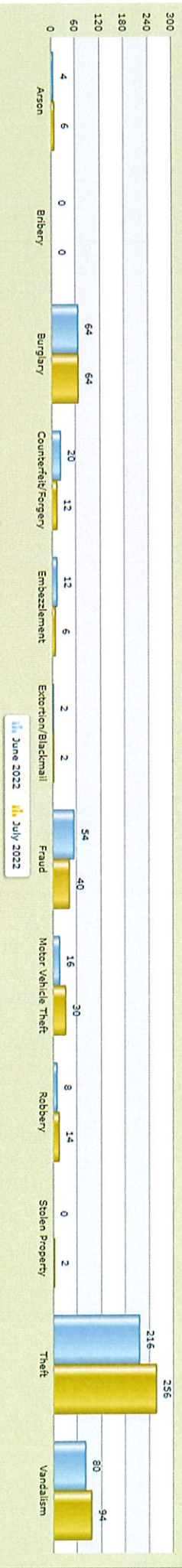

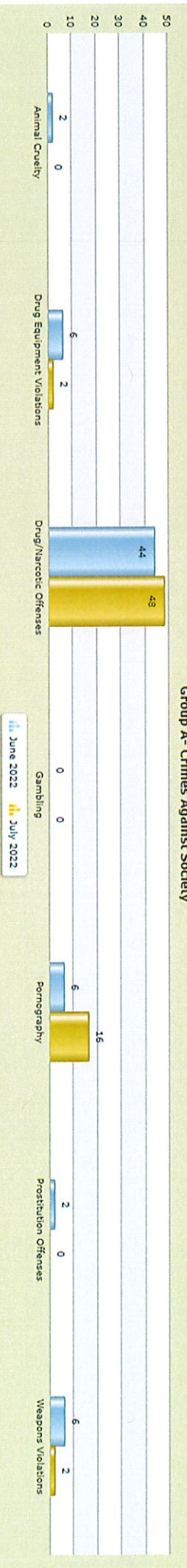

Chart: Period Differences

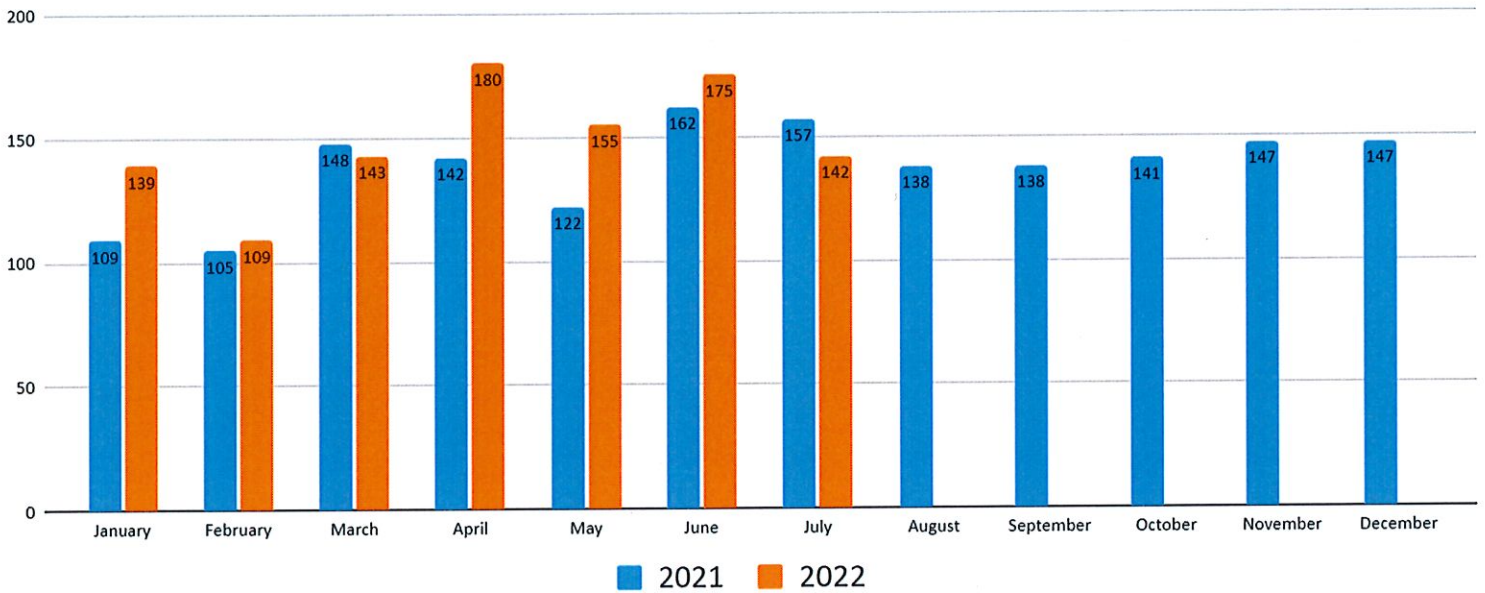

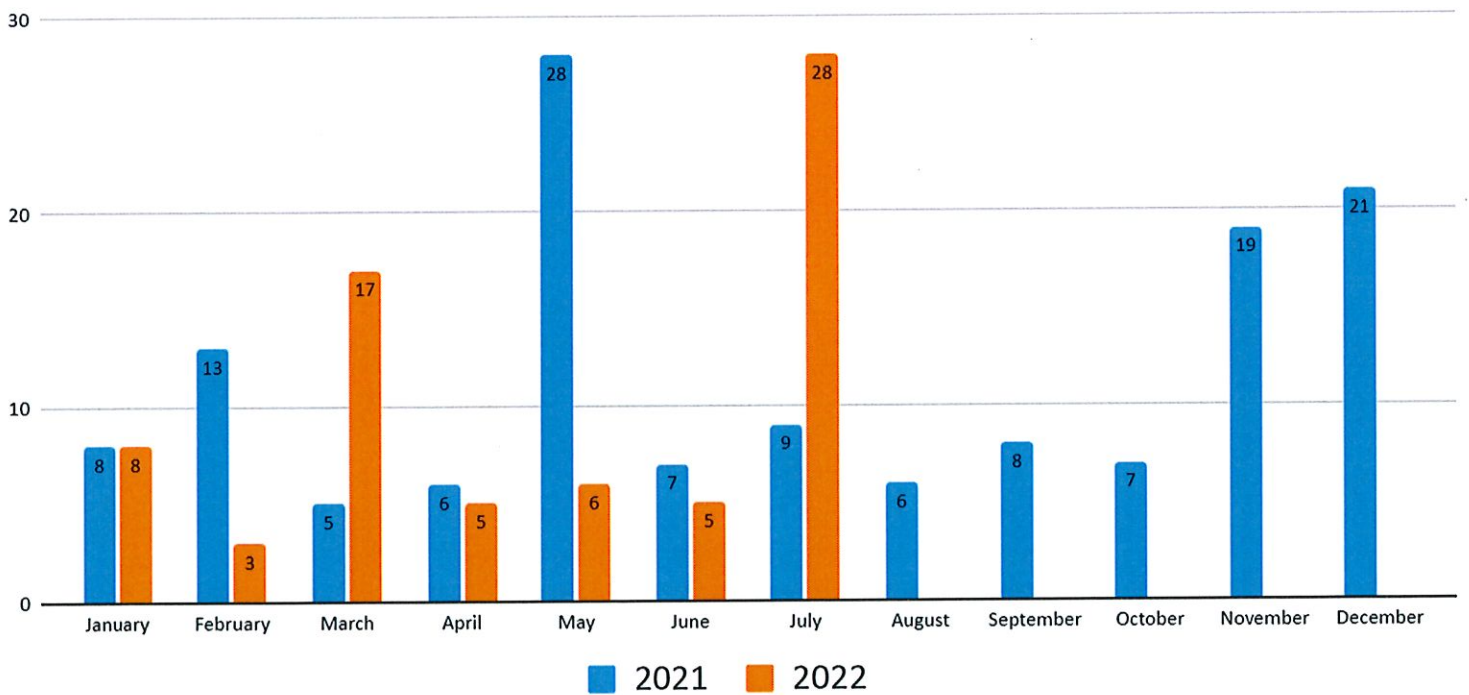

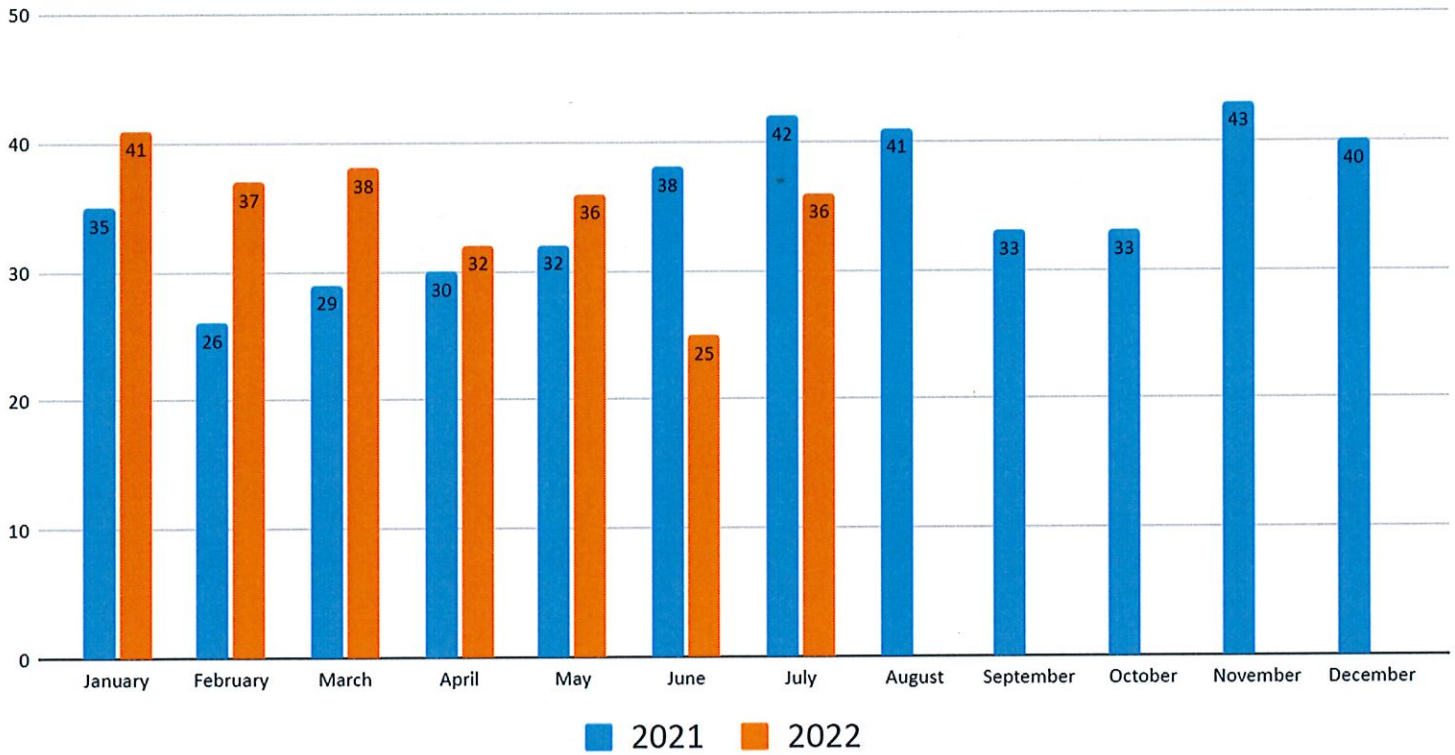
### 2021-2022 Adult Arrests

-Client interactions were down for the month, but it is believed that this is due to several vacation days that were taken by Social Workers during the month.

### Summary:

1. PSW taught an 11 year-old and father coping skills for anger to improve the child's ability to cope with emotions.
  2. PSW connected a visually impaired client to Pantry 279 for their permanent food delivery program.
  3. PSW connected a client to their therapist to assist with obtaining a medicine appointment, and the client is now successfully medicated.

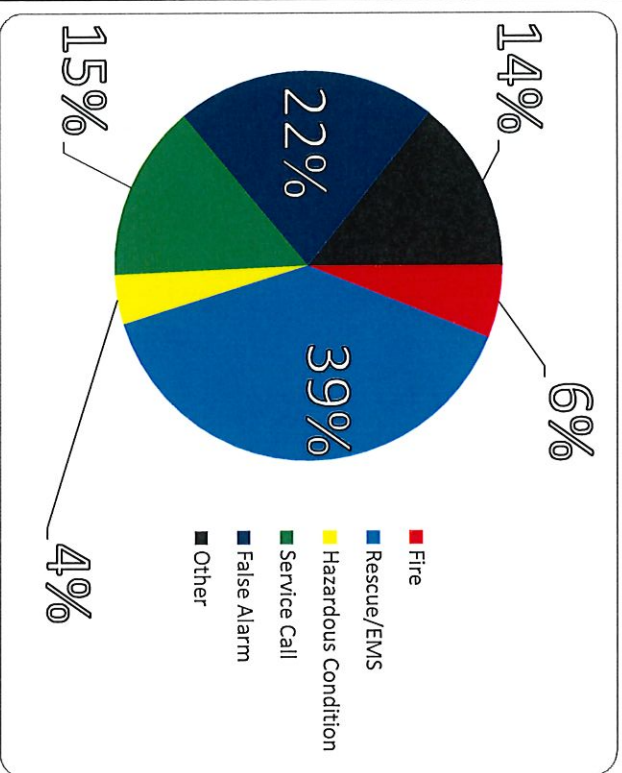

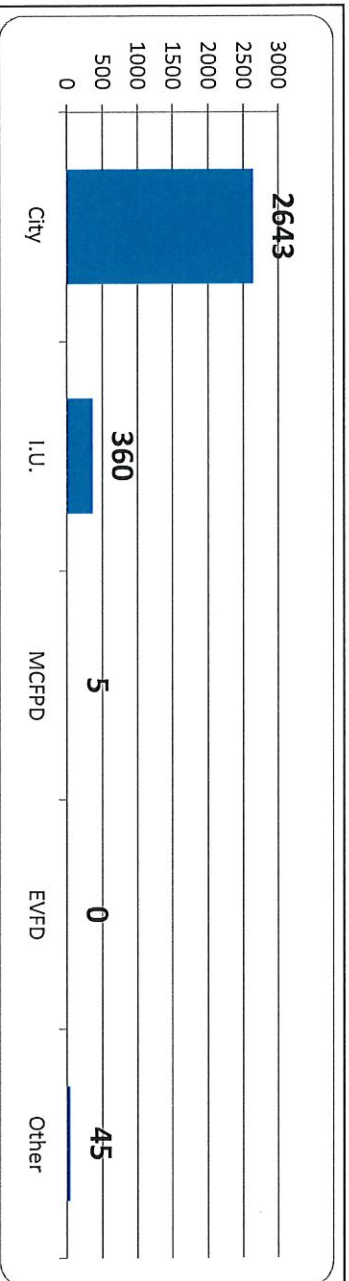

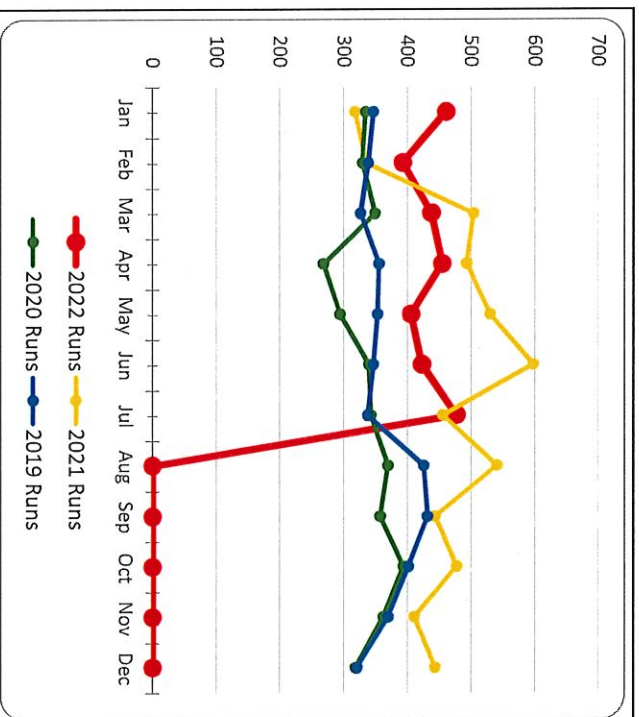
# Operational Statistics



YTD Percentage of Incident Types

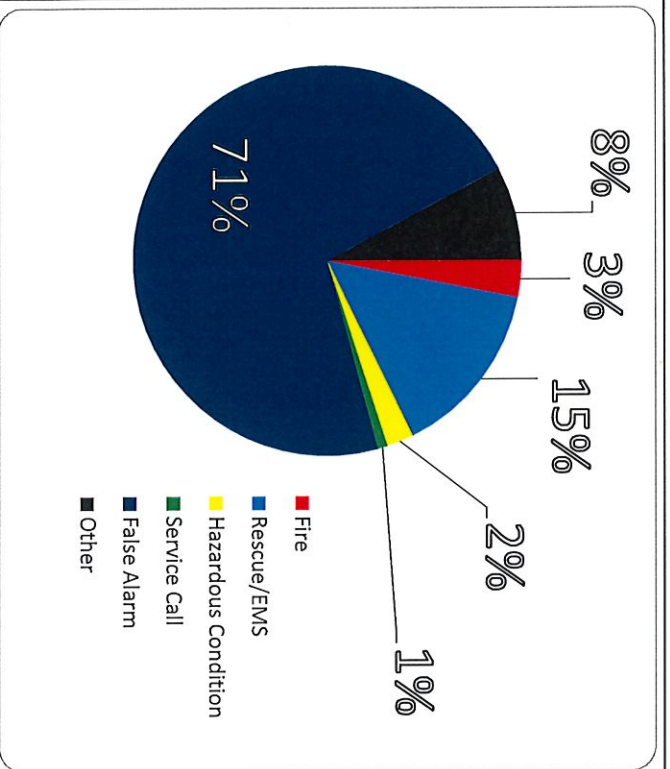


YTD Location of Incident

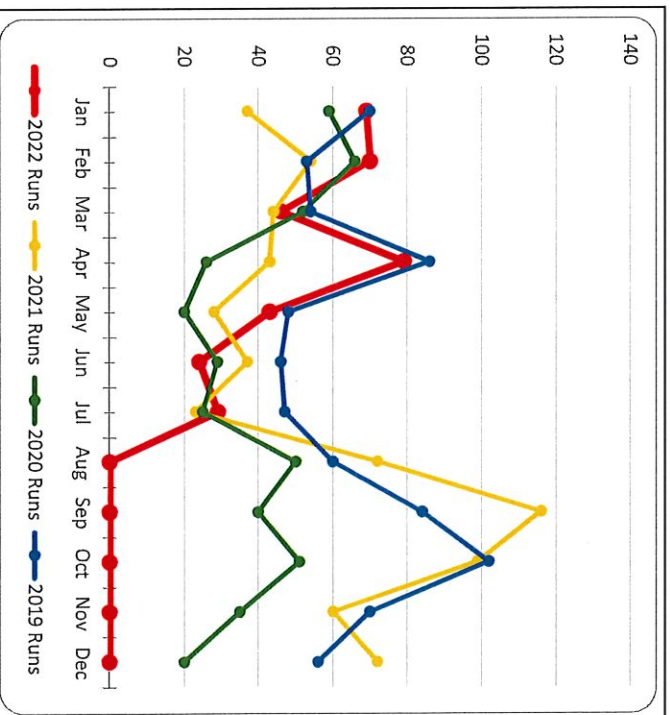


Year to Year Trend of Total Incidents

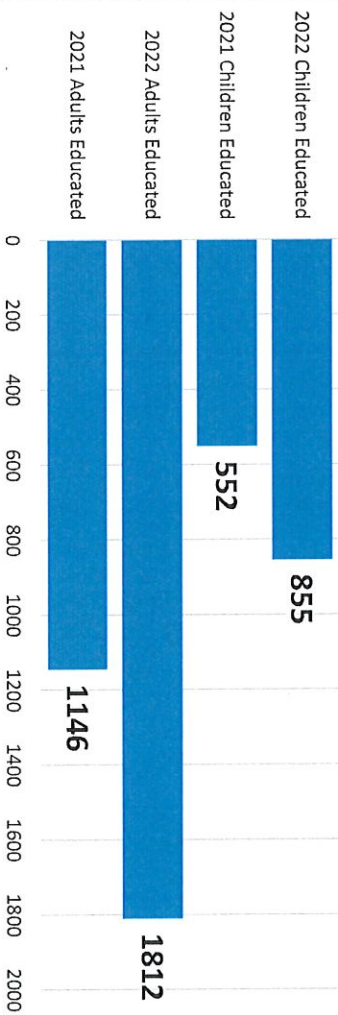

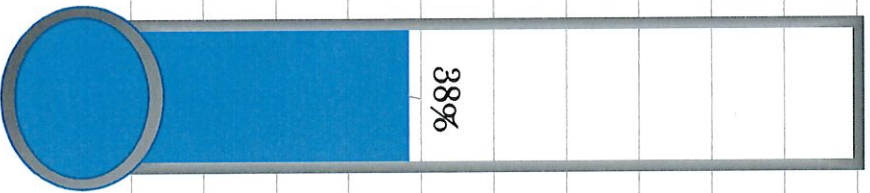

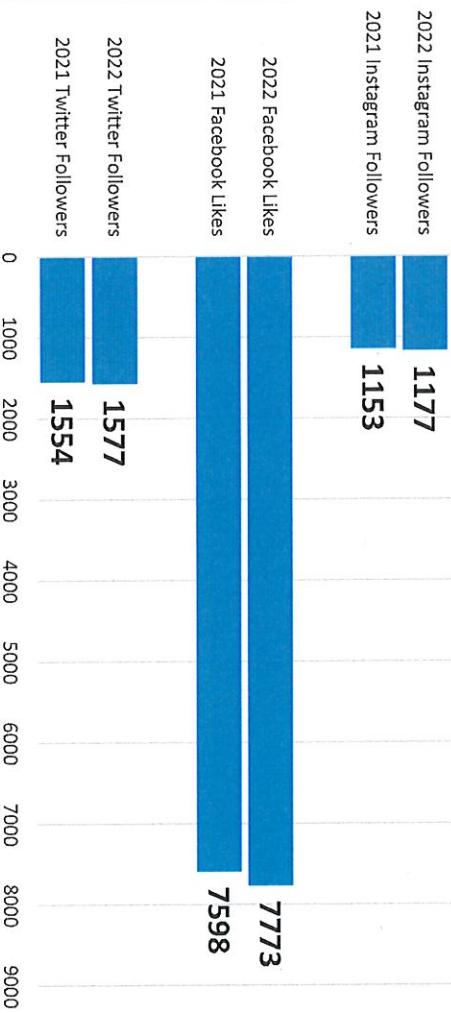

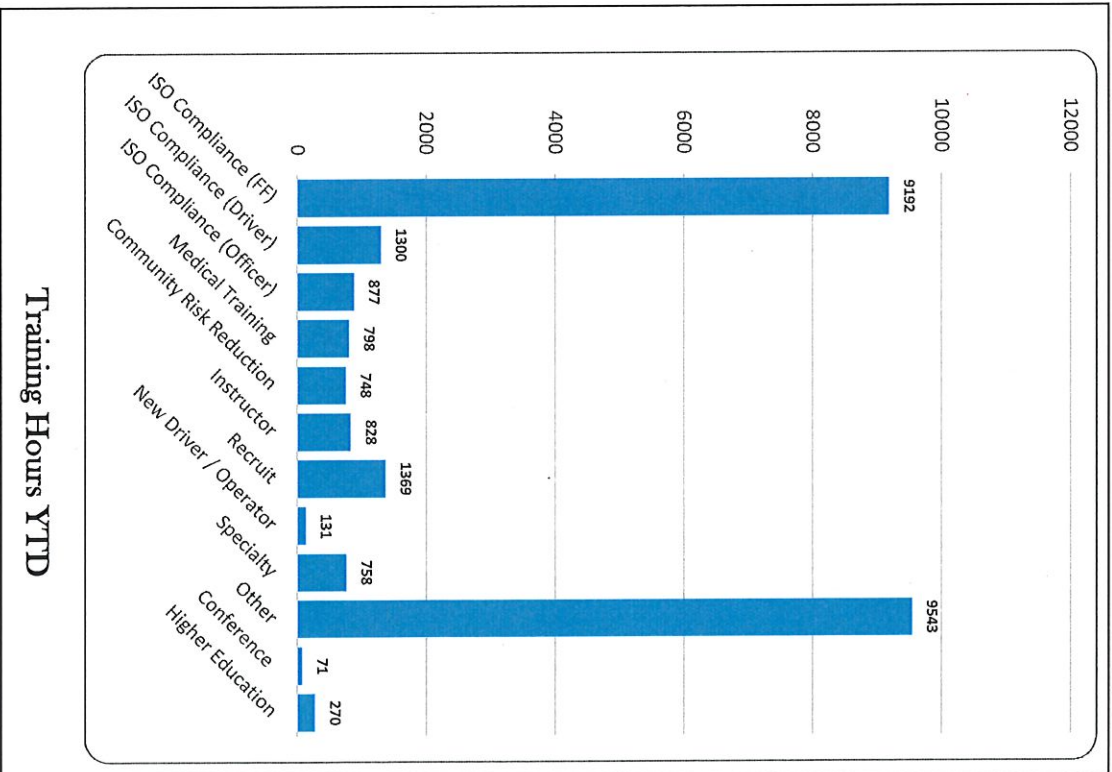
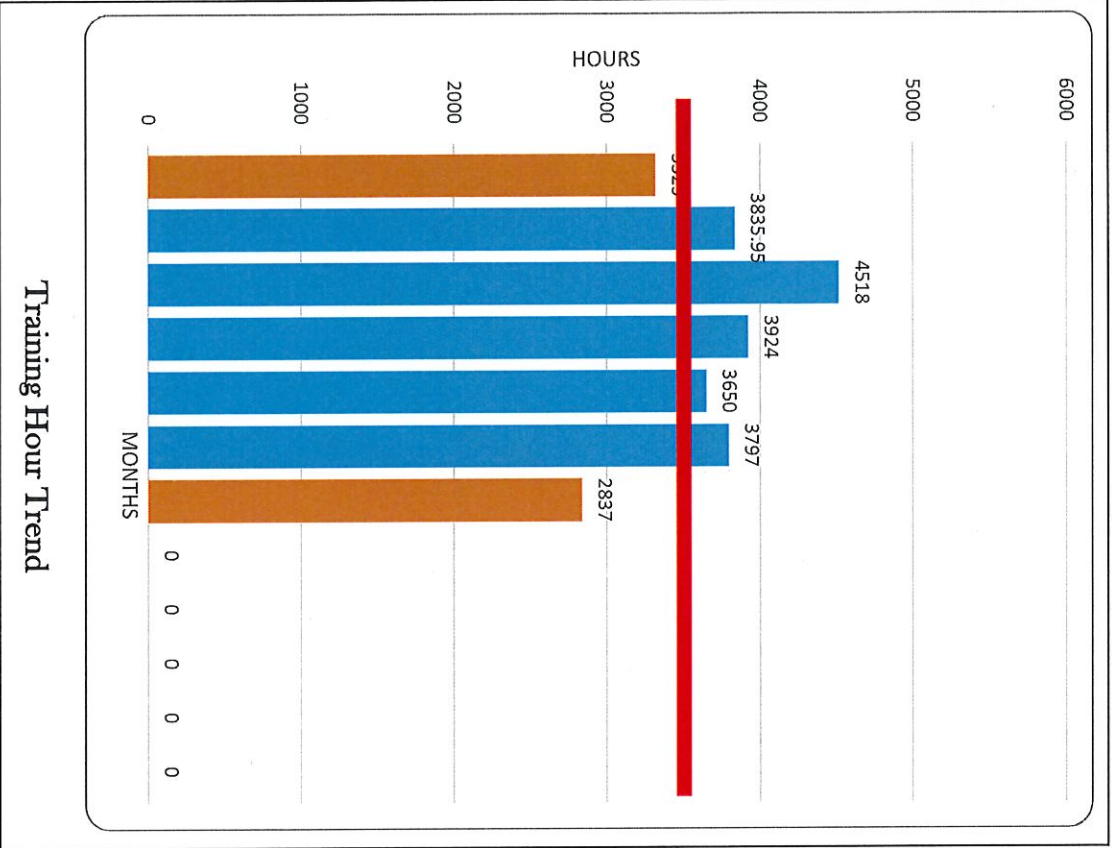
Inspection Goal Progress
