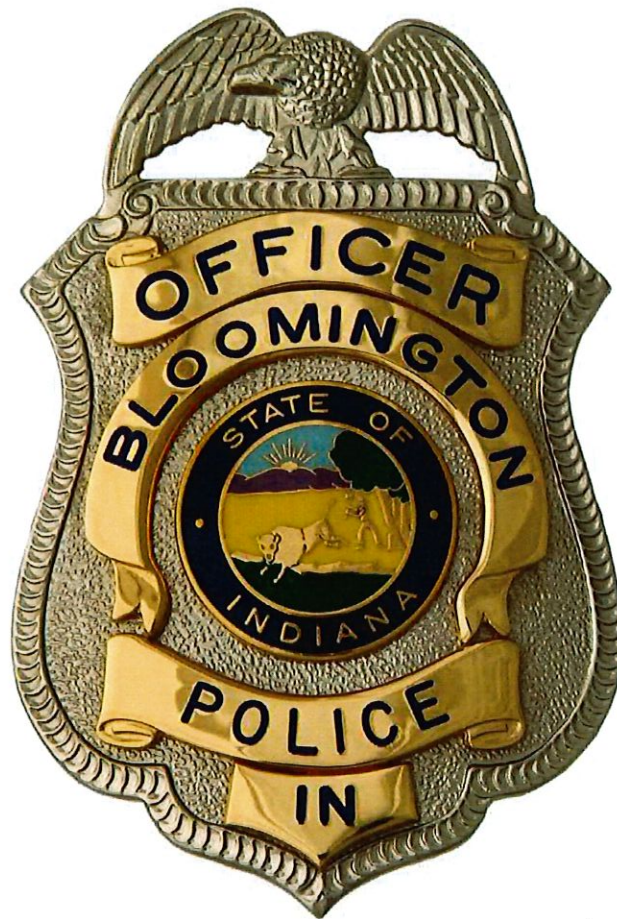

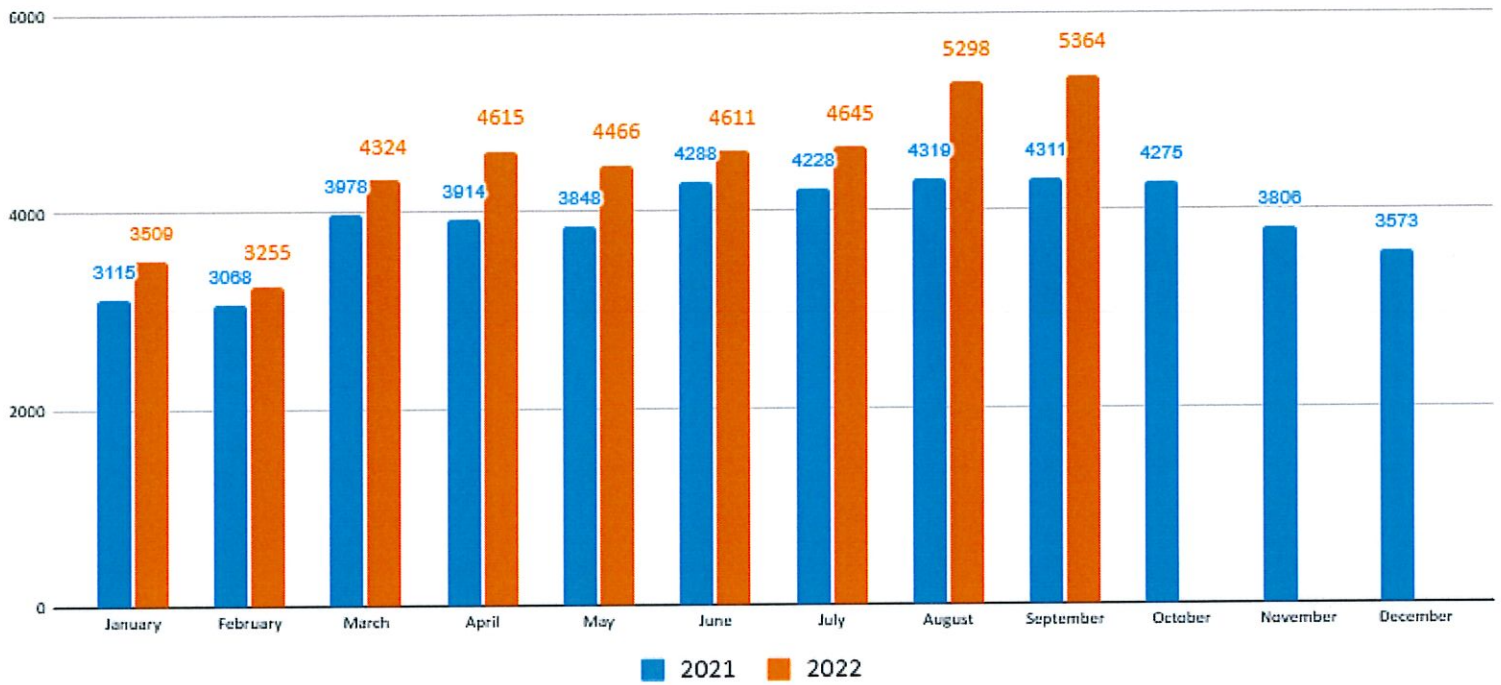

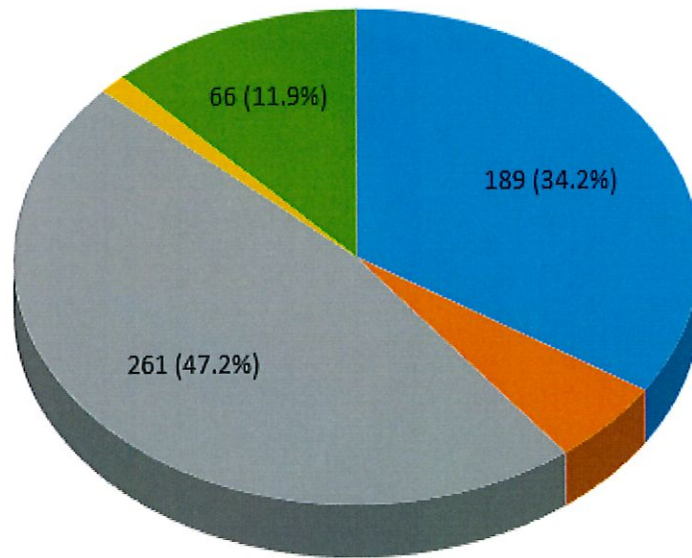

2021-2022 Calls For Service Totals

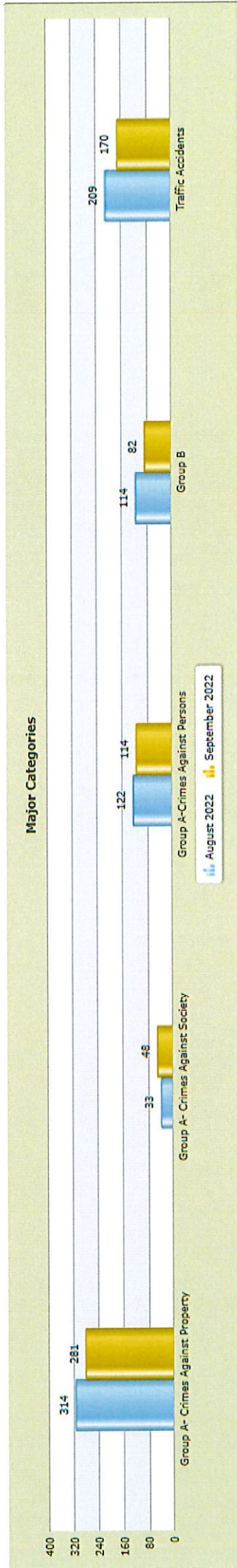


September 2022 Nuisance Calls for Service

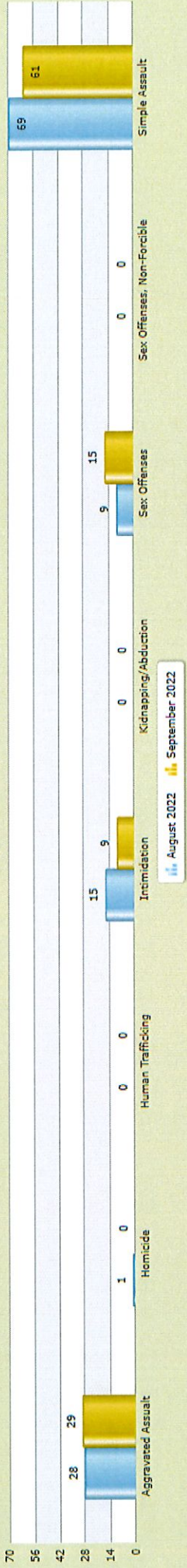

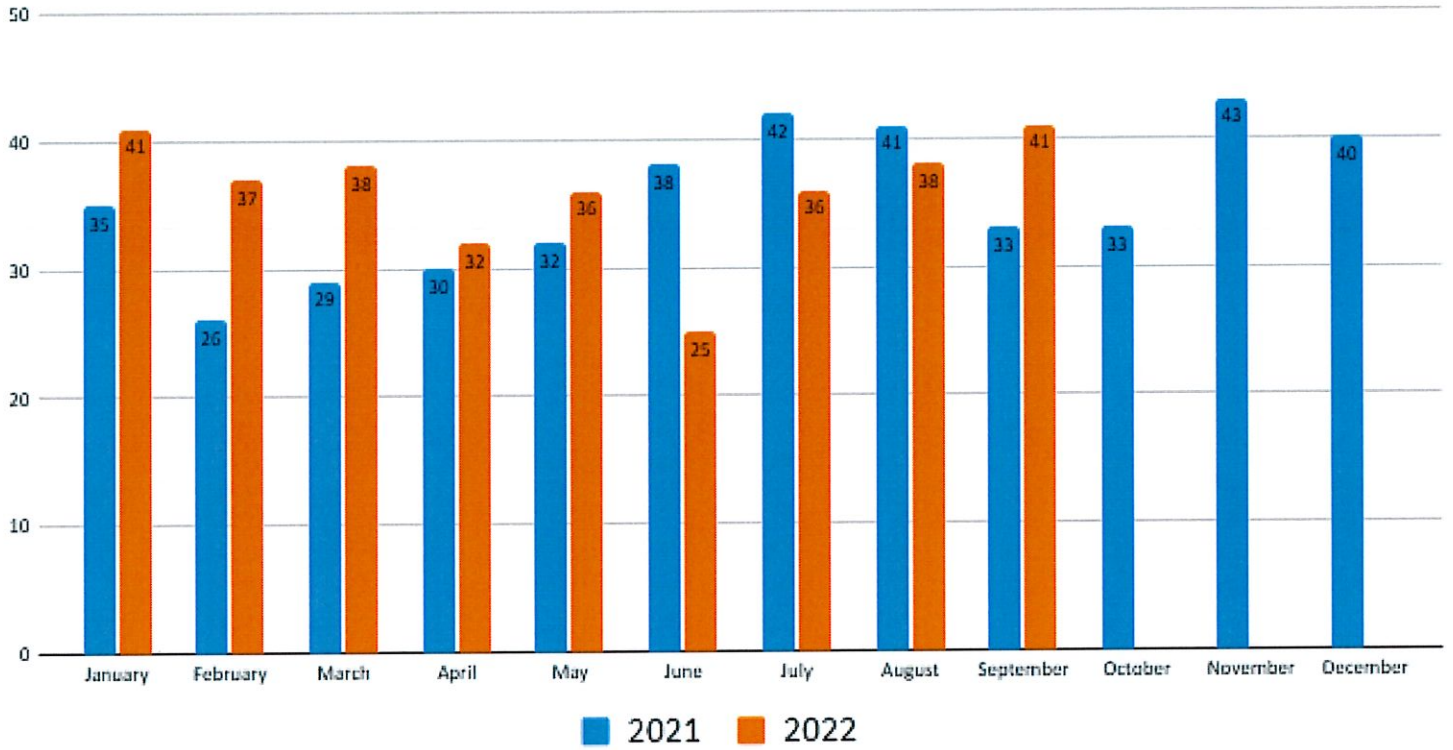
2021-2022 Adult Arrests

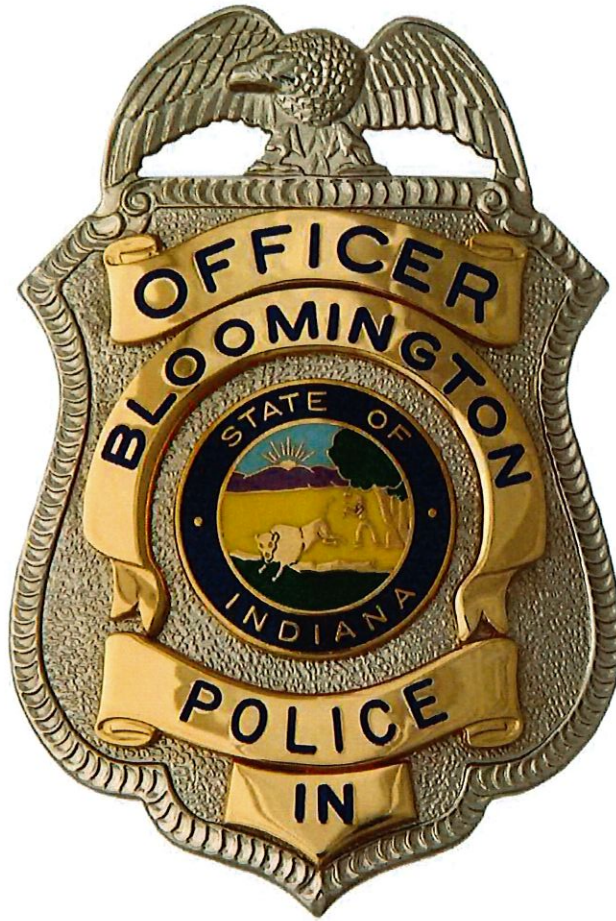

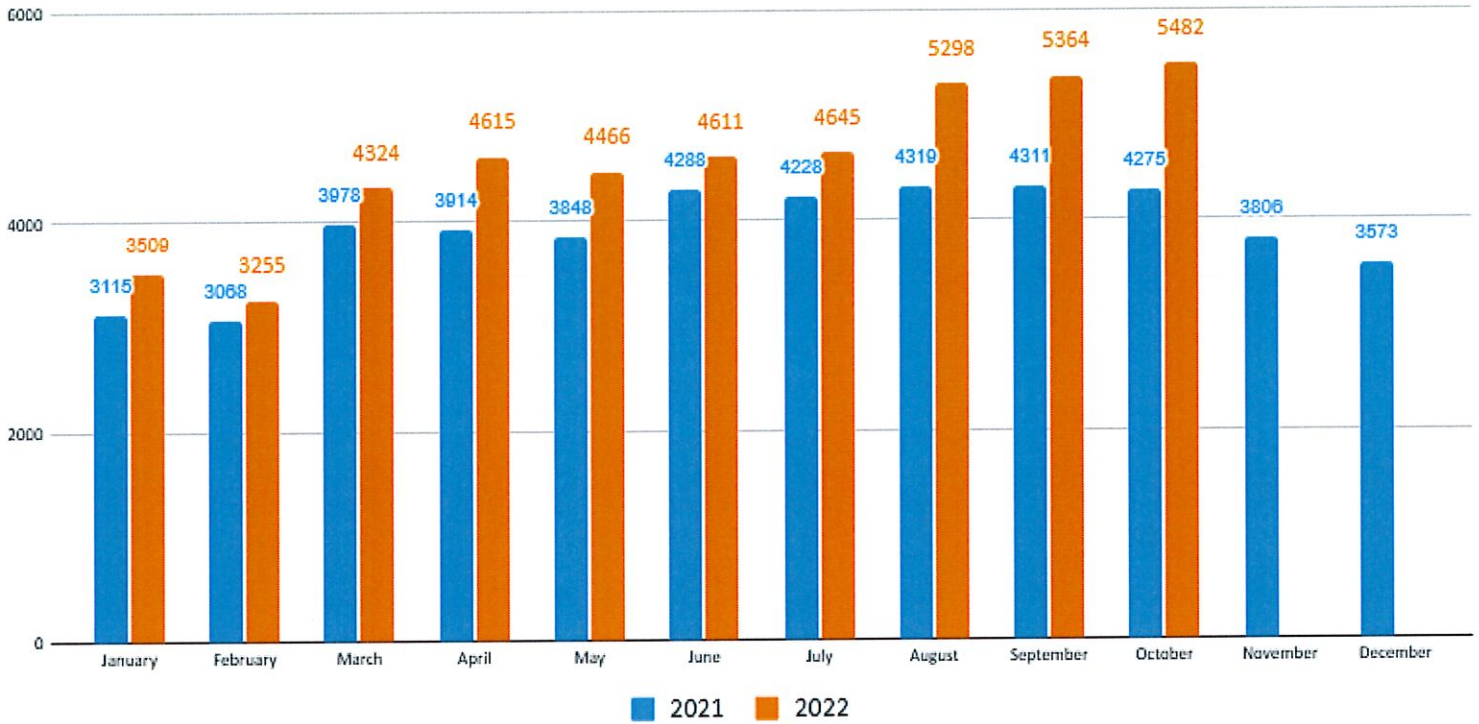

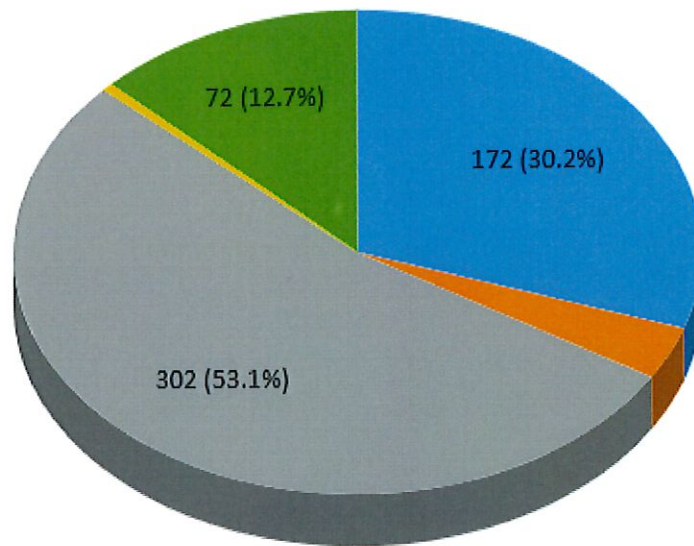

2021-2022 Calls For Service Totals



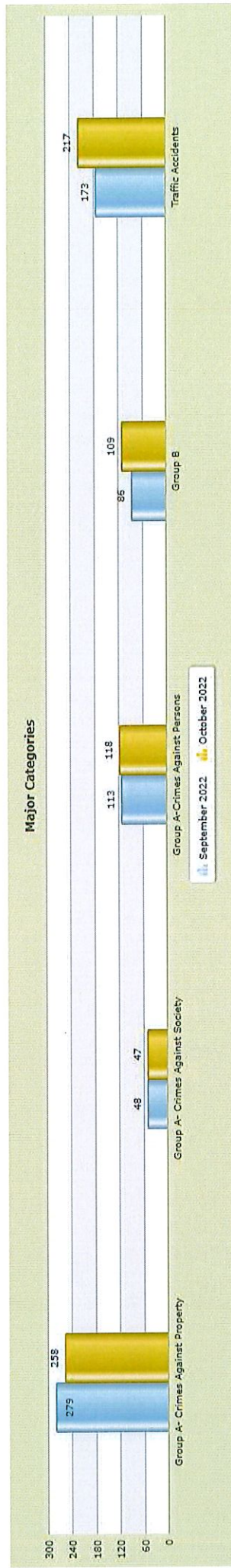
October 2022 Nuisance Calls for Service



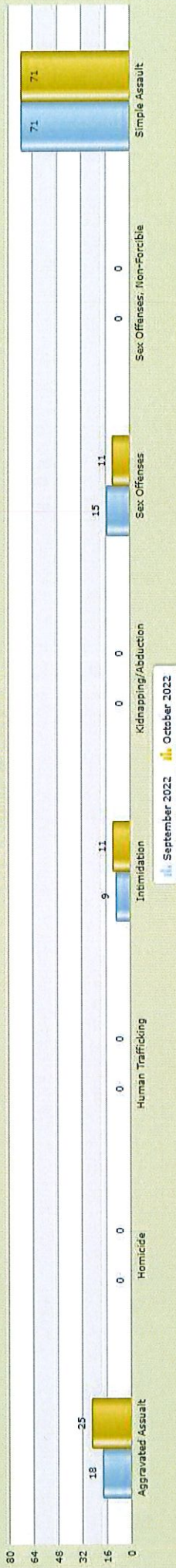

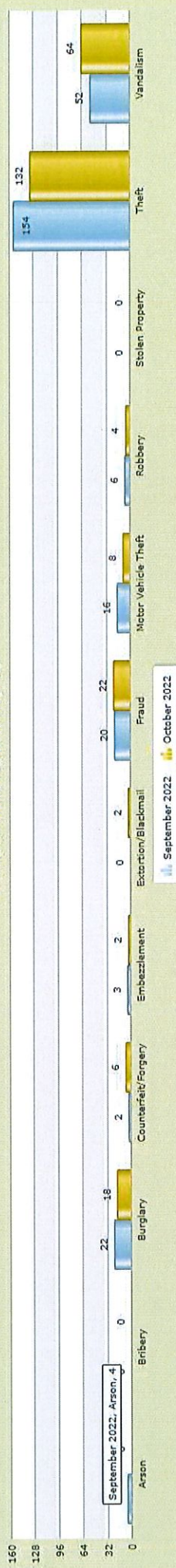

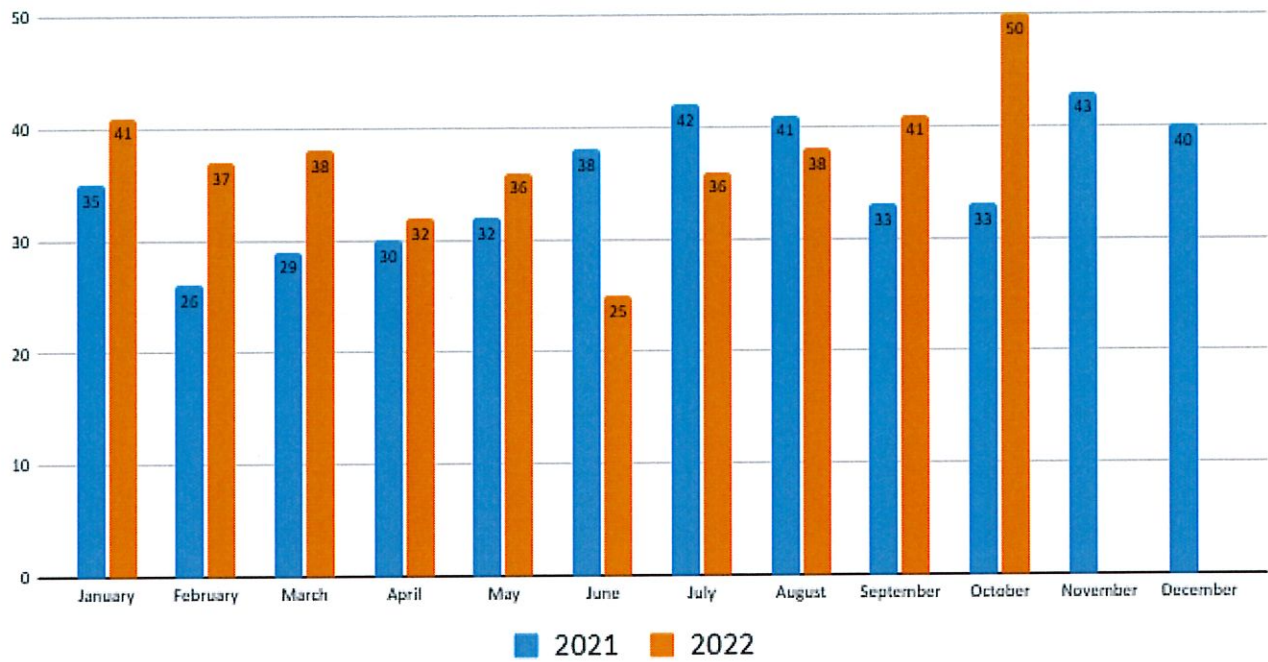
2021-2022 Adult Arrests

CRIME TRENDS/MAJOR CASES:

A SIU search warrant on Toby Magness' residence resulted in the seizure of 3.8 pounds of meth, 2 pounds of marijuana, \$4406 in currency, a .25 caliber handgun and various amounts of several other types of narcotics.

Increase in knife crimes, including two unrelated stabbings in the month of October.

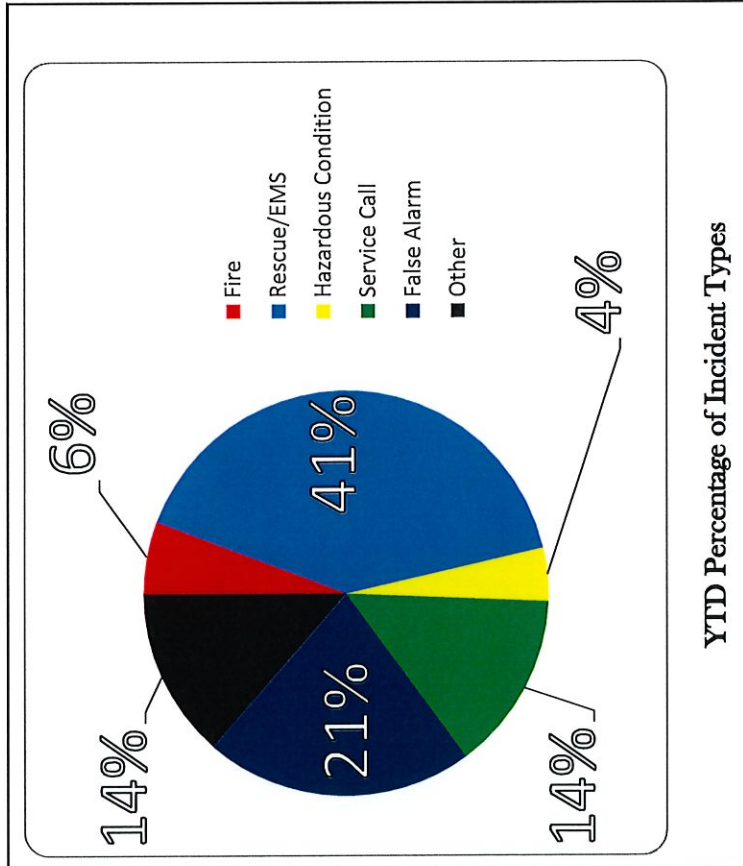

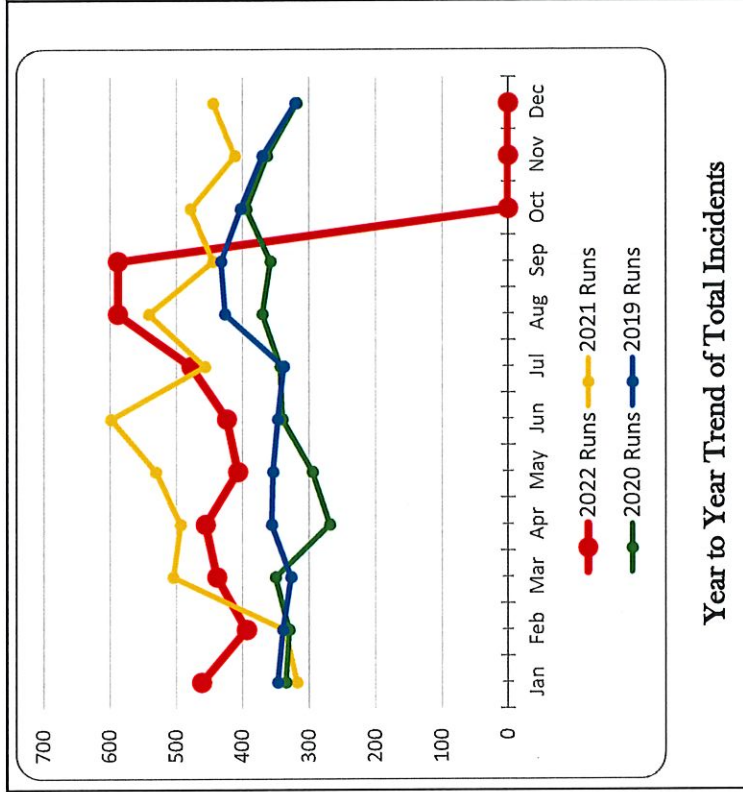

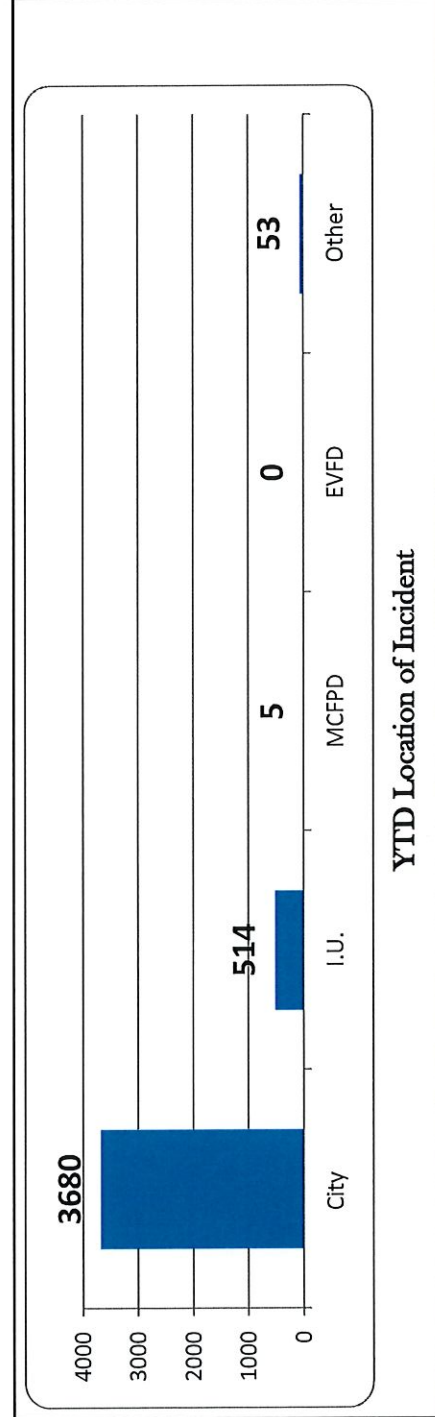
Operational Statistics



YTD Percentage of Incident Types

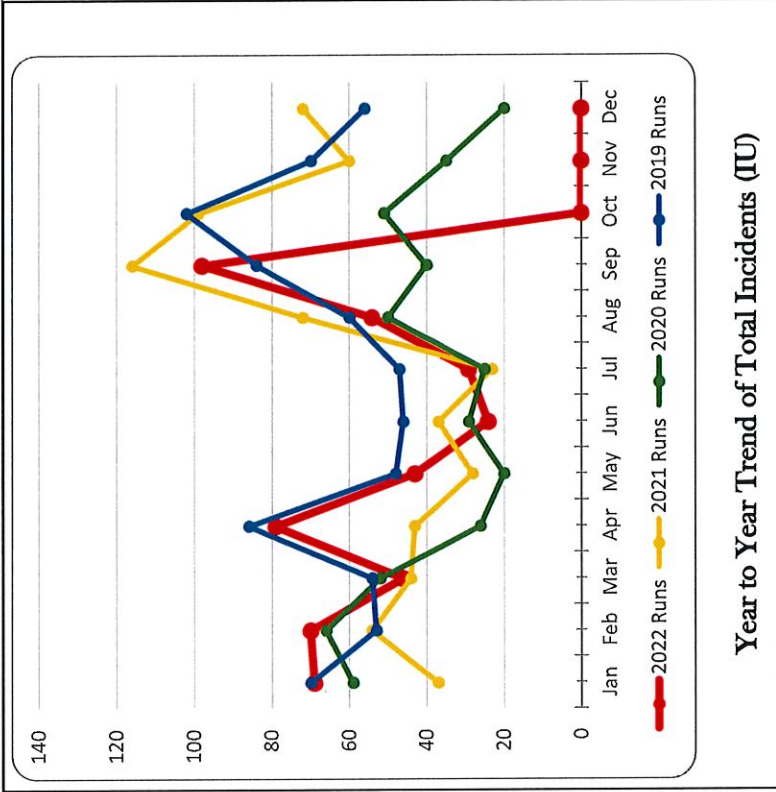
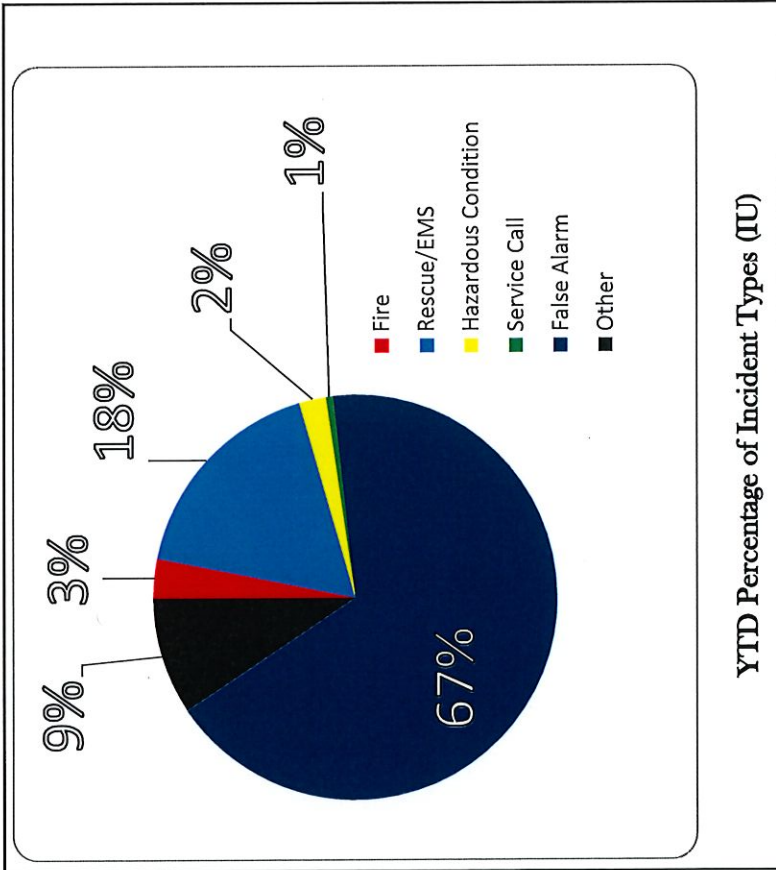


Year to Year Trend of Total Incidents
