BLOOMINGTON BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Bloomington Board of Public Safety held a Regular Session on **Tuesday, November 15, 2022, at 6:00 p.m.**, in the City of Bloomington McCloskey Conference Room located at 401 N. Morton Street, Bloomington, Indiana.

CALL TO ORDER

Board President Kim Gray called the meeting to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. Board members Maqubé Reese and Isak Nti Asare were present.

Board member Shruti Rana was present via Zoom.

Also in attendance were Board Secretaries Jazmyn Forte and Nicole DeCriscio.Bowe, Fire Deputy Chief Jayme Washel, Police Captain Ryan Pedigo, Police Lieutenant Myrick Williams, Police Chief Michael Diekhoff, and Assistant City Attorney Christopher Wheeler.

No members of the public were present.

CERTIFICATION OF EXECUTIVE SESSION

Board President Kim certified the executive session held earlier that evening.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

Board member Maqubé Reese moved to approve the meeting minutes from the September 20, 2022 regular session. Board member Isak Nti Asare seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, 4-0, through a roll call vote by Board Recording Secretary, Jazmyn Forte.

VERBAL CERTIFICATION OF PAYROLL

Police Chief Michael Diekhoff and Fire Deputy Chief Jayme Washel both affirmed the payroll claims.

POLICE DEPARTMENT BUSINESS

Report on Monthly Statistics, Training and Incident Reports:

Police Lieutenant Myrick Williams presented the monthly statistics and training.

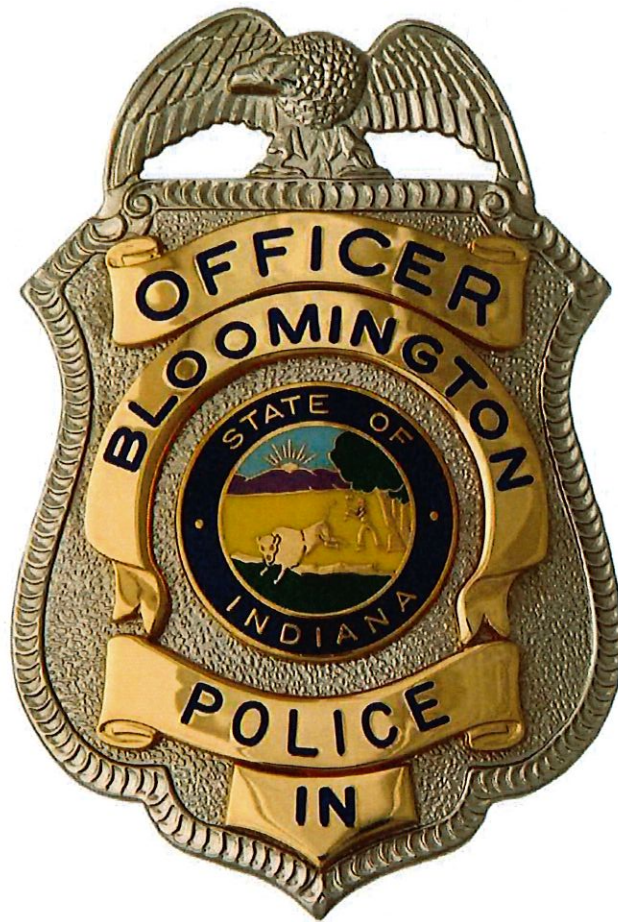

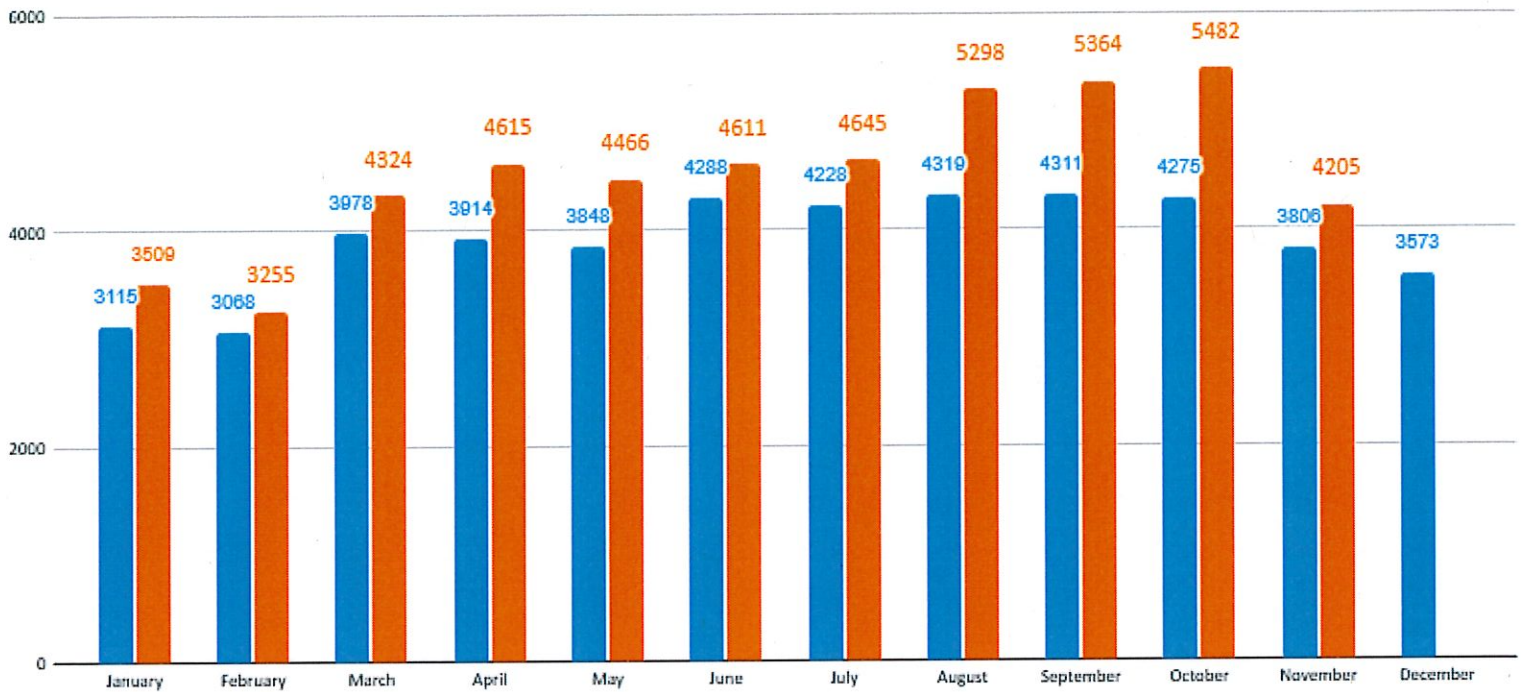

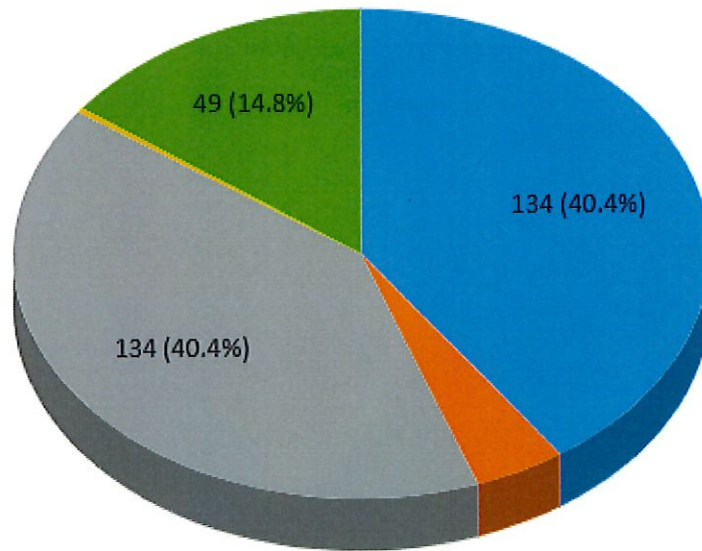

2021-2022 Calls For Service Totals



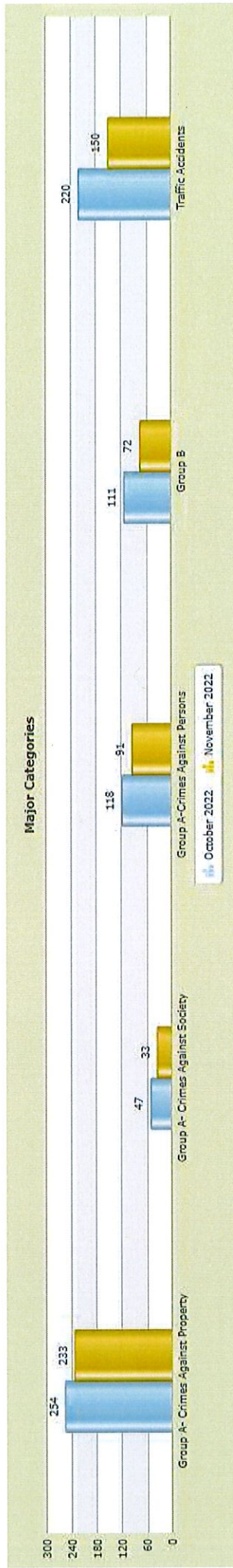
November 2022 Nuisance Calls for Service



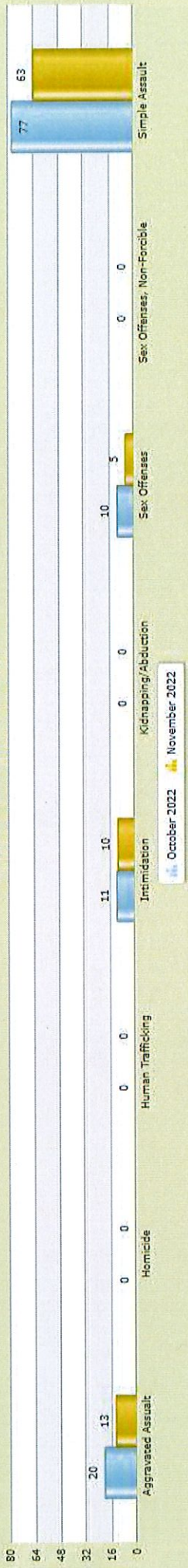

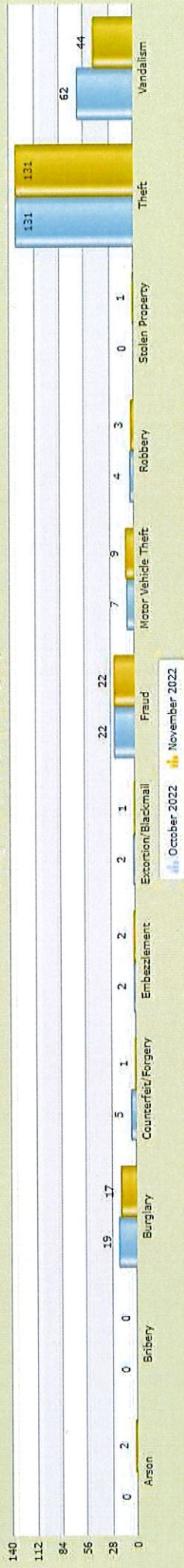

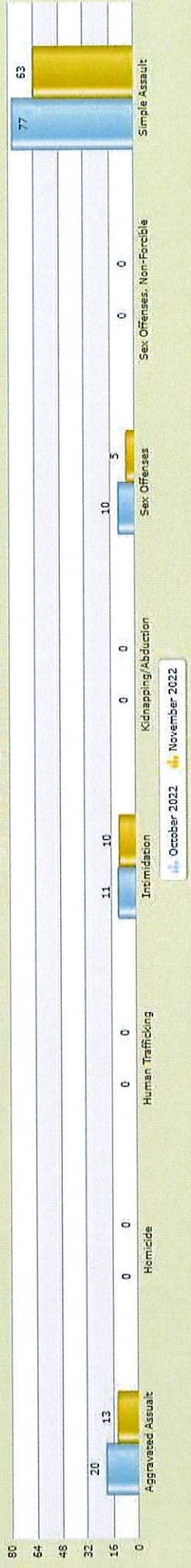

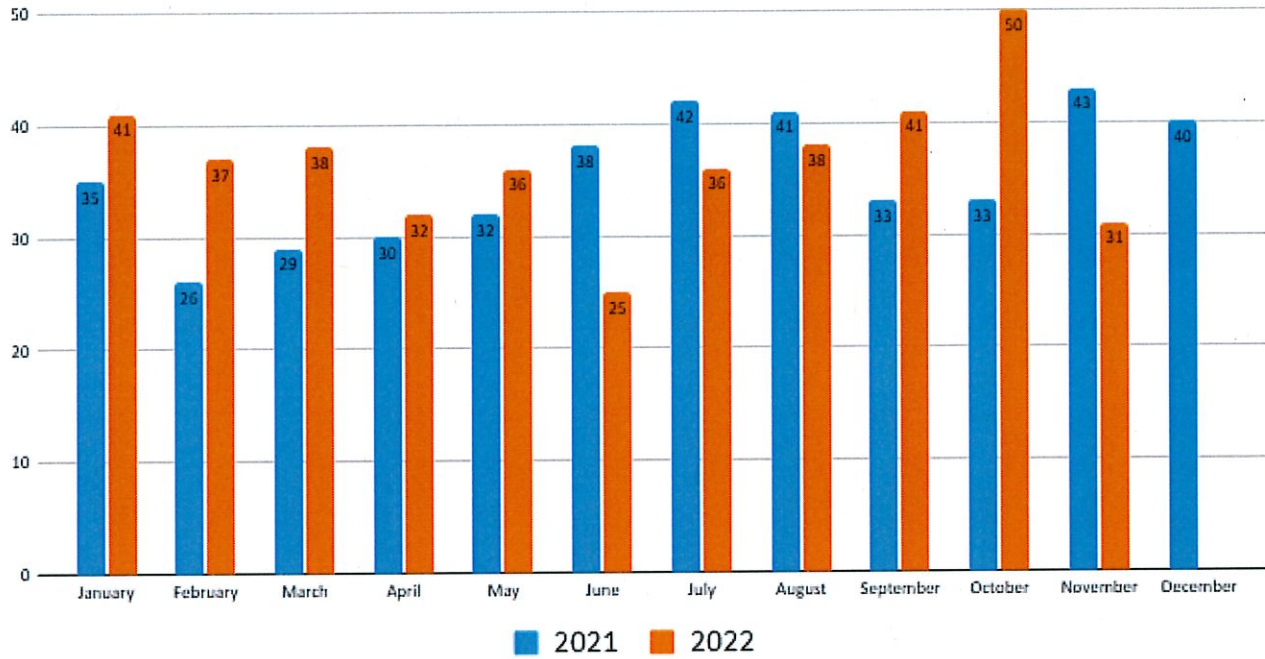
2021-2022 Adult Arrests

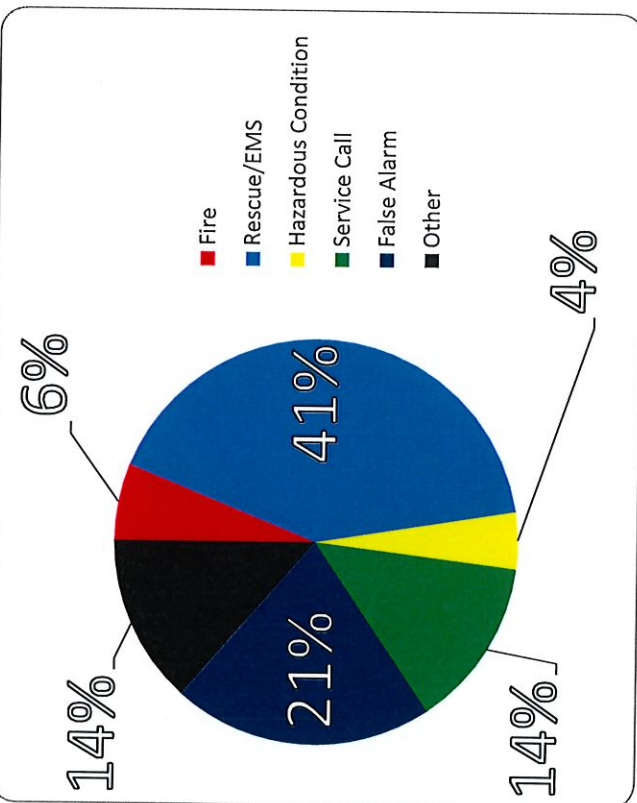

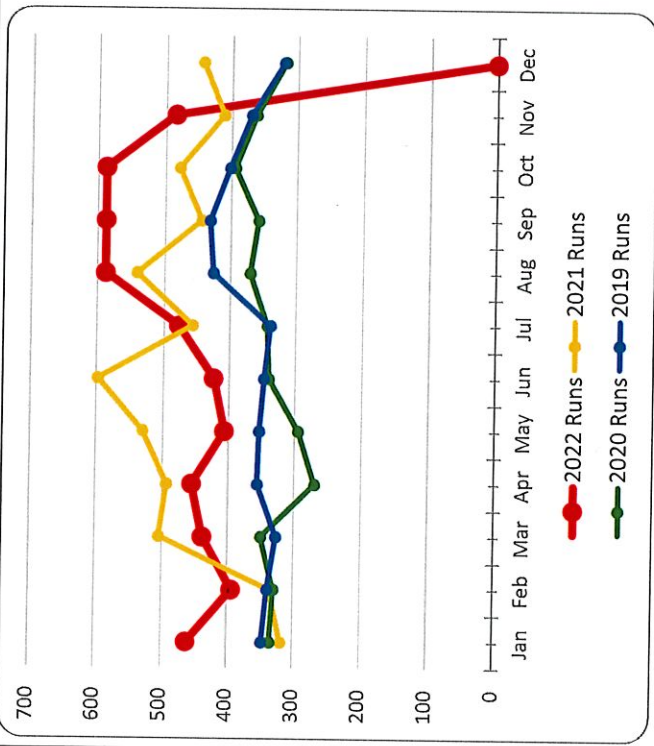

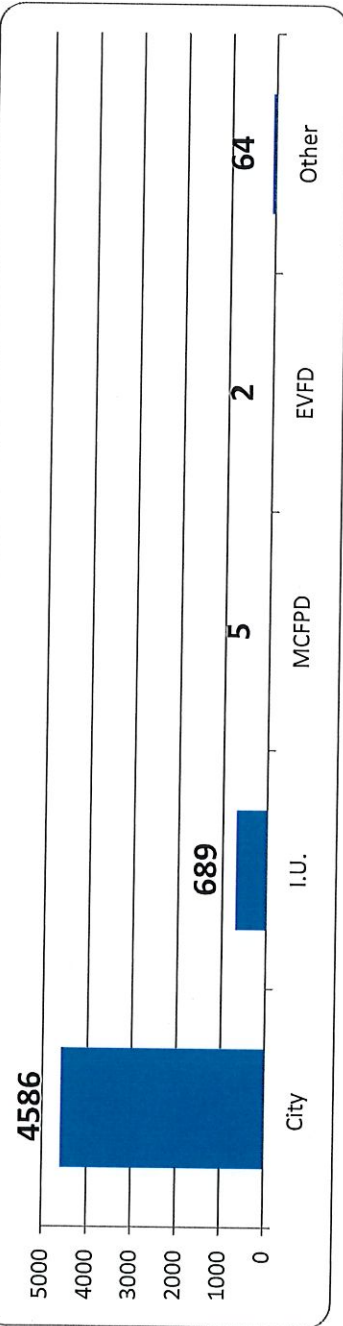
Operational Statistics



YTD Percentage of Incident Types

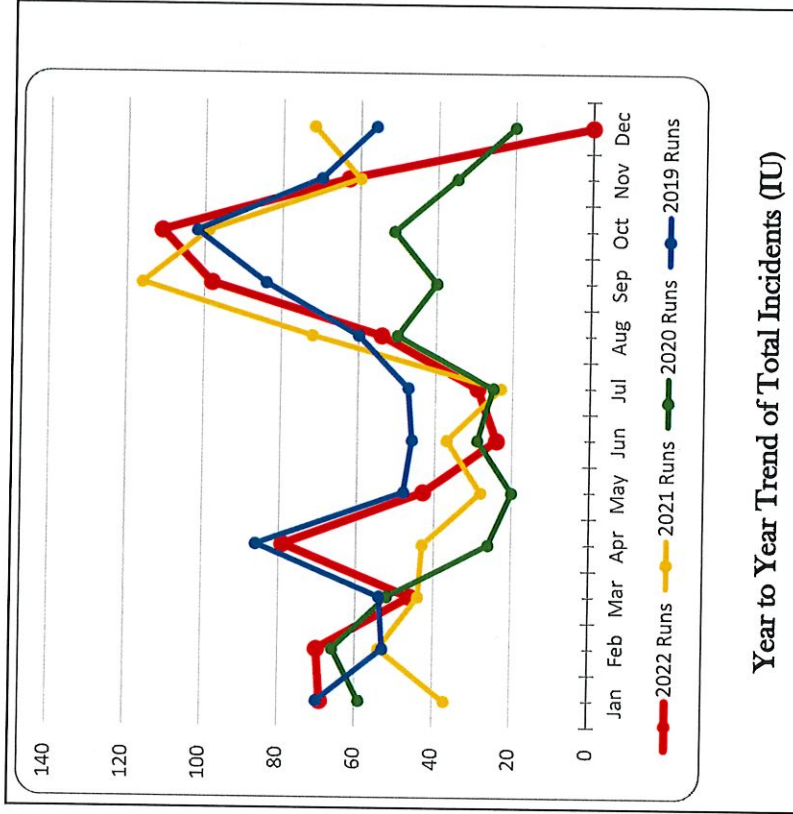
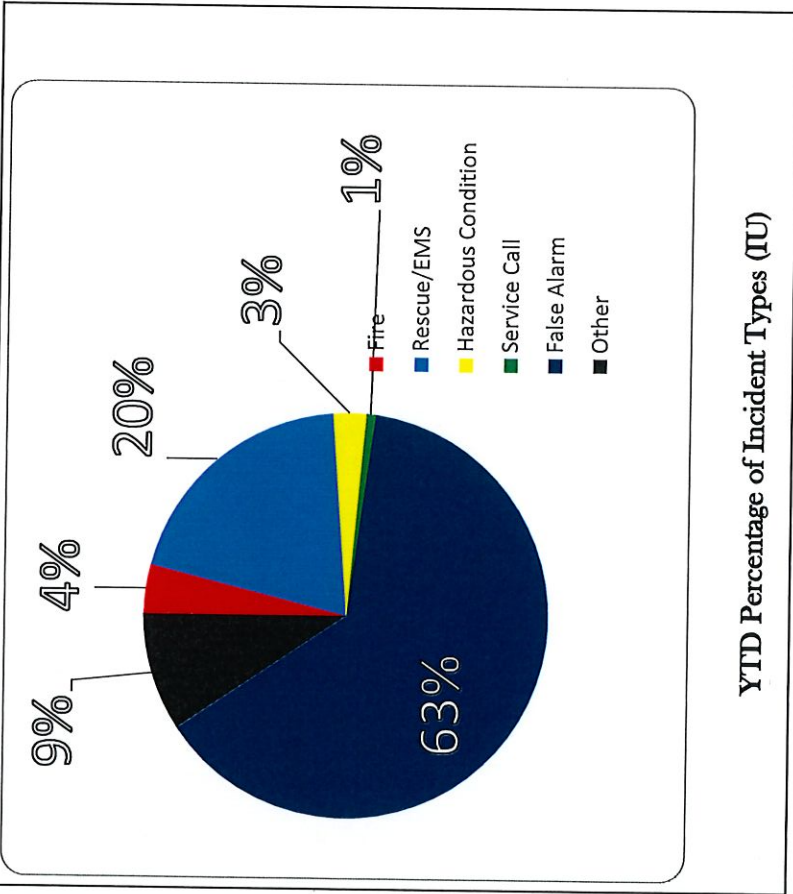


Year to Year Trend of Total Incidents

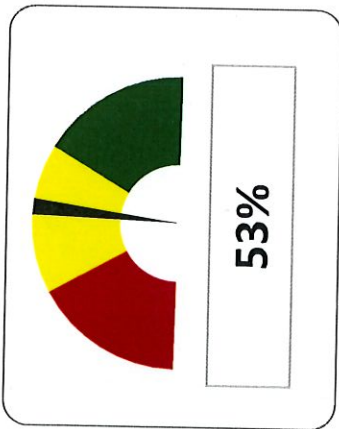

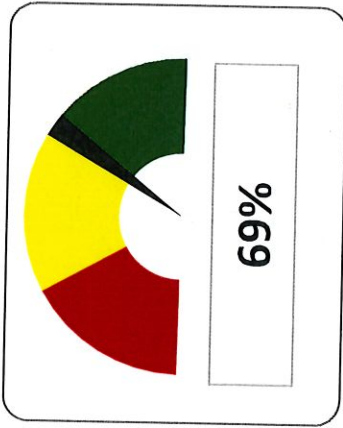

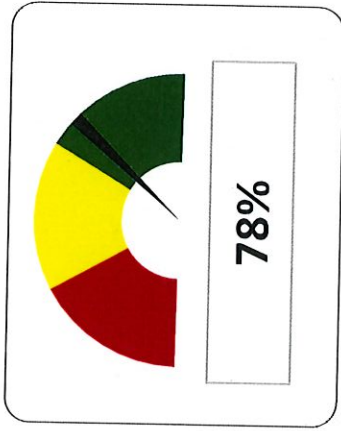
Response Times / Goals



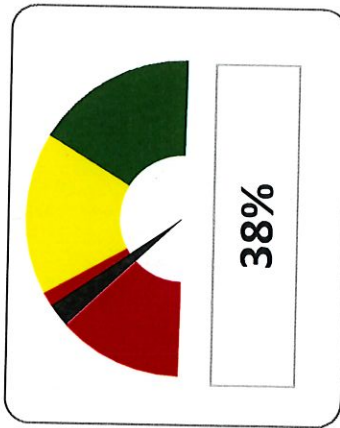
FIRE - Turnout Time



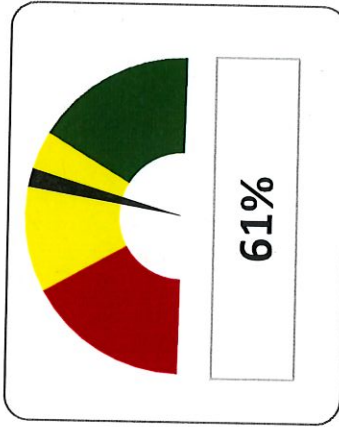
FIRE - 1st Arriving



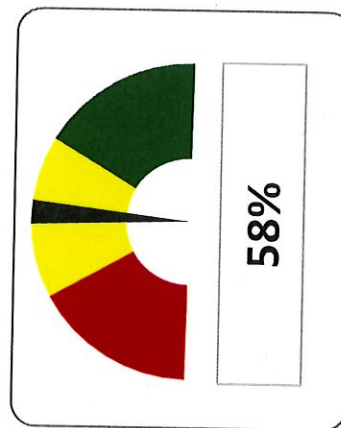
FIRE - Total Response Force



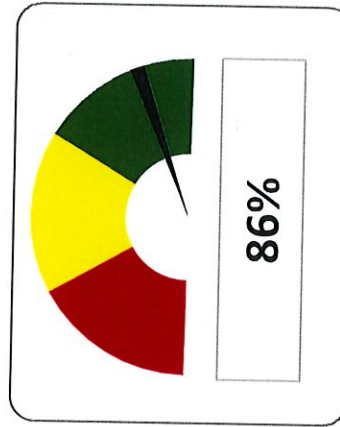
EMS - Turnout Time



EMS - 1st Arriving

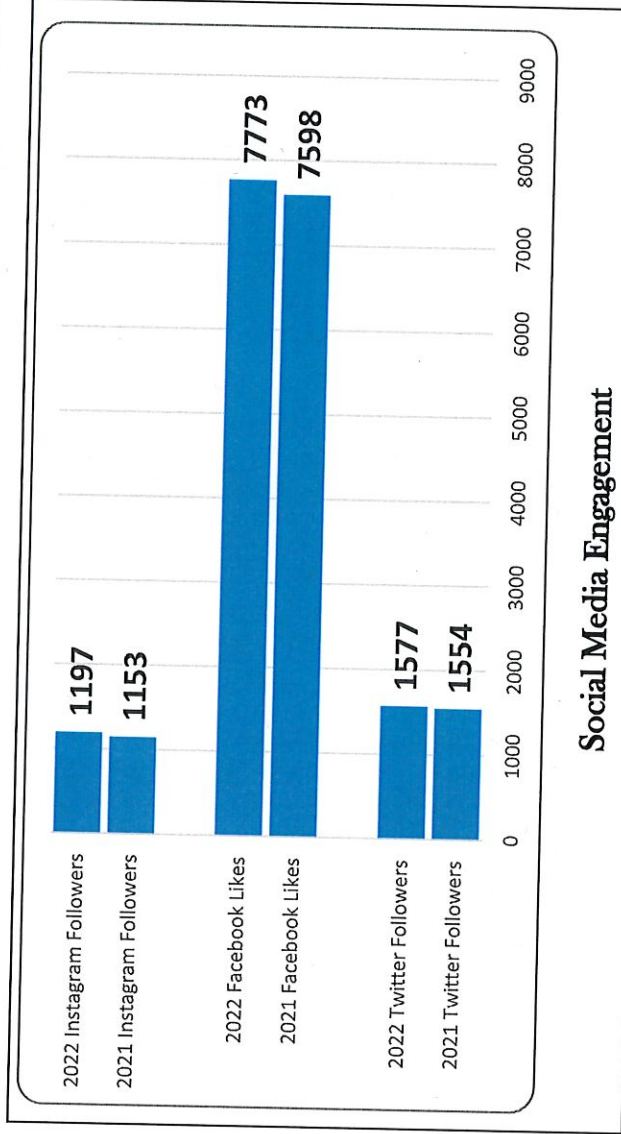
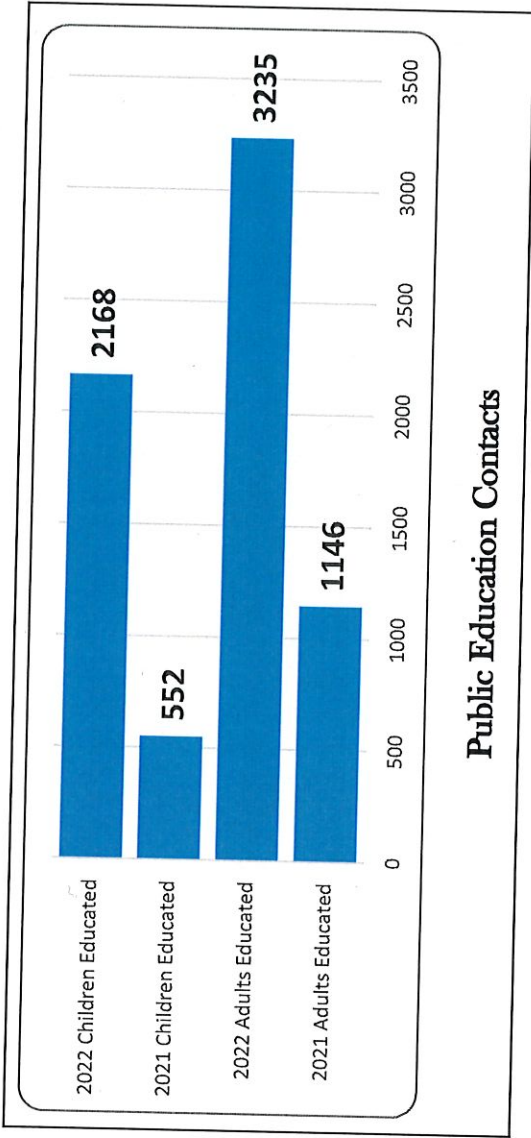
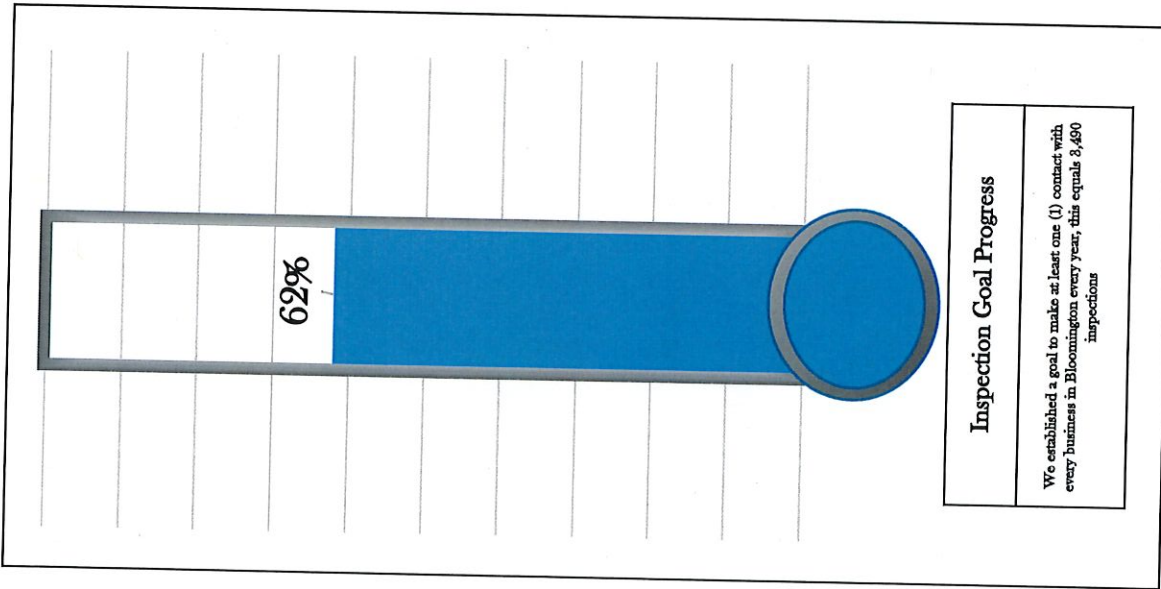


OTHER - Turnout Time

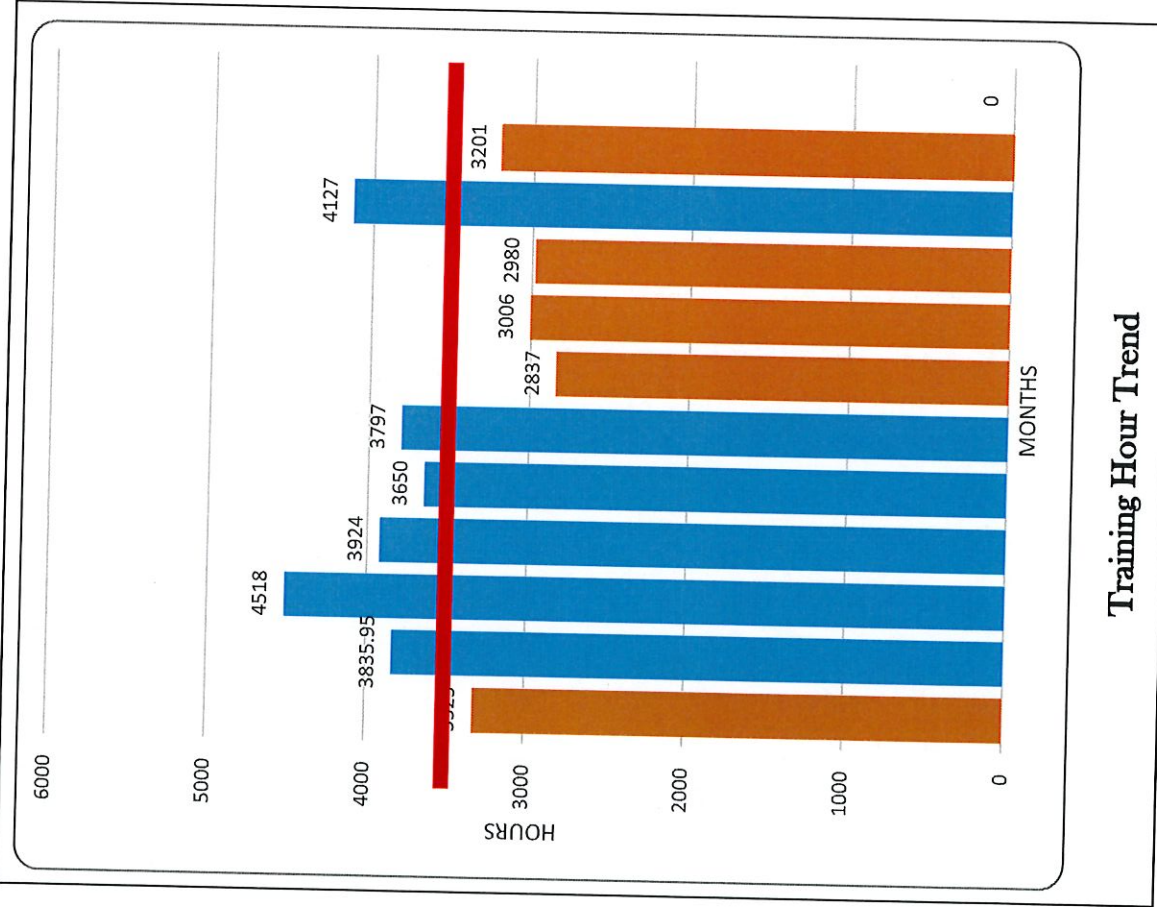

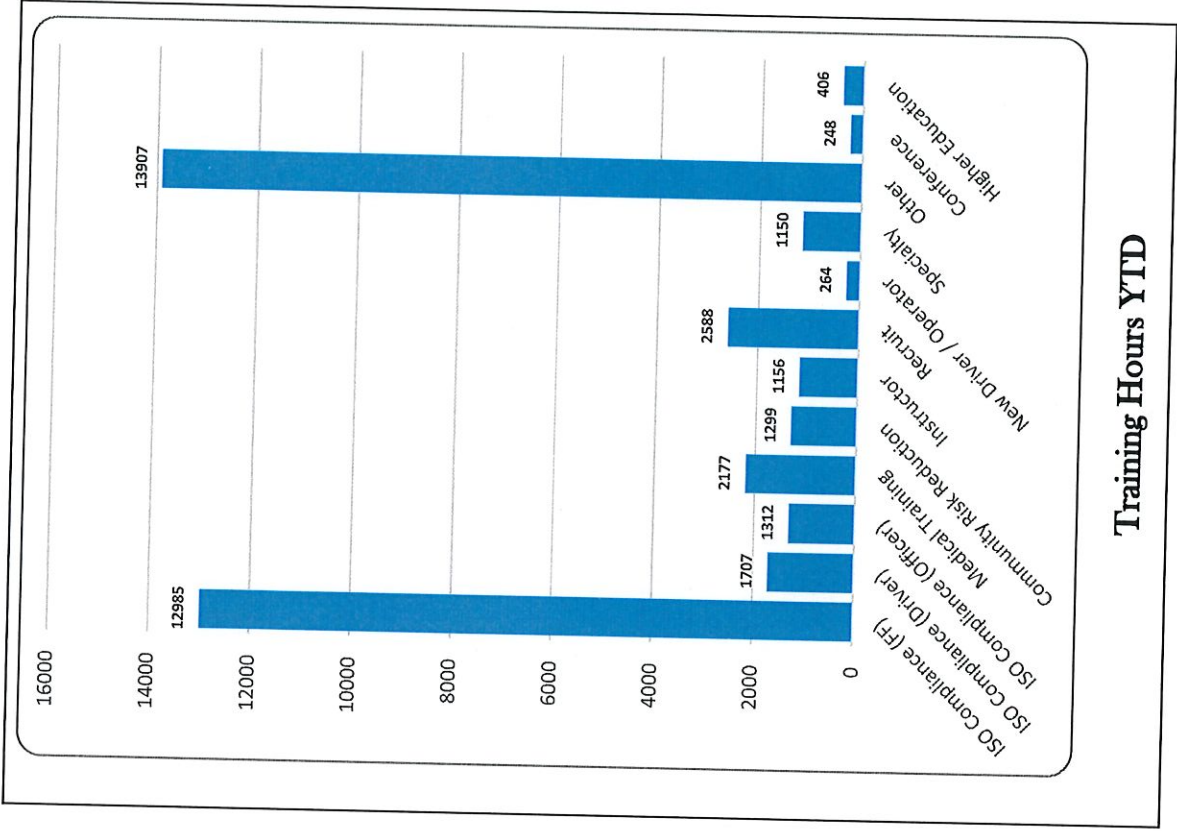

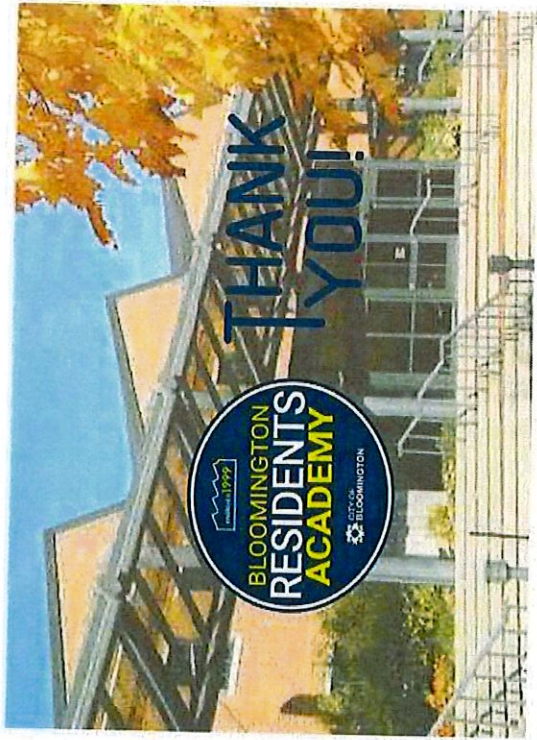
