 - a. This month- Callery Pear removals in Olcott/Jackson Creek area
 - b. Approx. 500 trees planted in 2022
 - c. New hire for laborer position (Landon)
 - d. Bicentennial Planting Round Two- 90 sites in downtown are, contract complete
 - e. On Treekeeper, with quick filter sites can be seen (Haskell emailed instructions)
