Four Items Ready for Discussion at the Committee of the Whole on Wednesday, October 29th

You may recall that the Council decided to move the second Committee of the Whole in October from the fourth to the fifth Wednesday. The four ordinances that are a ready for discussion at this meeting can be found, along with a summary and background material, in the October 15th Council Legislative Packet.

Amendments to Ord 08-19 (Omnibus Traffic Ordinance)

The Council Office has been asked to prepare five amendments to the reintroduced **Ord 08-19** (Omnibus Traffic Ordinance). Two of those have already been distributed (see above), two are going out with this packet, and one has yet to be prepared. Those amendments not previously distributed are described below:

Am 04 – This amendment will be sponsored by Councilmember Volan and will be prepared before Wednesday night. It calls for a comprehensive public parking usage report of downtown parking facilities to be submitted to the Council on a quarterly basis.

Am 05 – This amendment is sponsored by Councilmember Ruff on behalf of the Administration and lowers the escalating fine for a Class D Violation. Currently, the fine rises from \$15 to \$30 if not paid within seven calendar days. The ordinance proposes that the fine rise from \$25 to \$40 when not paid within that time frame. This amendment would change the fine so it escalates from \$20 to \$40 and is consistent with the current doubling of the fine when not paid within seven calendar days.

Am 06 - This amendment is sponsored by Councilmember Volan and brings forward one of the two changes proposed by Bloomington Transportation Options for People (BTOP). The change would increase the price for a 12 hours per day/ 5 days per week (12/5) non-reserved monthly pass from \$38 to \$46 so that it would match the former price for the 12/5 reserved monthly pass.

ORDINANCE 08-19 TO AMEND TITLE 15 OF THE BLOOMINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC"

Amendments

<u>Am 01</u> (Piedmont-Smith) - would insert a 4-way stop at the intersection of Allen and South Henderson Street (*in the October 15*th *packet*)

Am 03 (Sturbaum) – would convert some of the proposed 2-hour parking on the north side of 4th Street between Madison and Rogers Street to 1-hour parking (2 spaces on the east and 1 space on the west of the alley) and unrestricted parking (the remaining spaces west of the alley) (in the October 15th packet)

Proposed Amendment:

1. Section 56 of Ord 08-19 shall be amended by replacing the figure "\$25.00" with the figure "\$20.00" wherever it appears in the provision so that it shall now read:

SECTION 56. Subsection (d) of <u>Section 15.64.010 Violations and penalties</u> of the Bloomington Municipal Code Chapter 15.64 "Traffic Violation Schedule" shall be amended by deleting "\$15.00" after "Fine:" and replacing it with "\$20.00" and by deleting "\$30.00" in the same line and replacing it with "\$40.00" so that the phrase regarding "Fine" shall read as follows:

Fine: \$20, \$40 (depending upon when paid)

2. Section 57 of Ord 08-19 shall be amended by replacing the word "twenty-five" with the word "twenty" wherever it appears in the first sentence of the provision so that it shall now read:

SECTION 57. Subsection (d)(1) of <u>Section 15.64.010 Violations and penalties</u> of the Bloomington Municipal Code Chapter 15.64 "Traffic Violation Schedule" shall be amended by deleting the word "fifteen" as it appears in the first sentence and replacing it with "twenty" and by deleting the word "thirty" as it appears in the second sentence and replacing it with "forty" so that the provision now reads:

(d)(1) The fine for Class D Traffic Violations shall be twenty dollars, if paid within seven calendar days. The fine shall automatically increase to forty dollars if not paid within seven calendar days.

Synopsis

This amendment is sponsored by Councilmember Ruff on behalf of the Administration and would lower the increase in the escalating fine for a Class D Violation. Currently the fine rises from \$15 to \$30 if not paid within seven calendar days. The ordinance proposes that the fine rise from \$25 to \$40 when not paid in that time frame. This amendment would have that fine rise from \$20 to \$40 and be consistent with the doubling of the fine when not paid within seven calendar days.
