  - This version is made more accessible to borrowers by removing administrative burdens associated with the application process.
  - Jane highlighted the history of the BUEA's loan program, which was implemented during the pandemic's uncertainty and now faces the uncertainty of potential tariffs.
  - The Office of the Controller advised forgiving all the participants' loans and asked to pay whatever a given business can.
  - Any documentation, given the nature of the BUEA, would go into the public record. This can be restrictive when it comes to forgiving the loans of the businesses.
  - Virginia recommended that any business participating in this program, as a stipulation for converting their loan into a grant, would be unable to receive another loan for a given period.

#### BUEA Director's Report - June 2025

#### **General Updates**

#### **City Safety & Cleanliness Grant**

The Small Business Safety & Cleanliness Grant provides up to \$85,000 in total funding for Bloomington businesses during the 2025 fiscal year, with a recommended maximum award of \$5,000 per applicant. The grant supports physical improvements that enhance safety, hygiene, and exterior appearance, including crime deterrence, vandalism repair, sanitation upgrades, and accessibility improvements.

Eligible projects must address at least one priority area, such as preventing crime/theft, improving safety systems (e.g., fire suppression), enhancing entryways, and professional cleaning (e.g., power washing or graffiti removal).

Reimbursement is available for qualifying work completed within six months prior to applying, if supported by receipts, visual documentation, and a brief project summary.

Projects must be located within Bloomington city limits and completed within the grant agreement (MOU) period. Only one grant is awarded per business per year, and funds cannot be used for weapons or other ineligible items. The City reserves the right to deny funding for projects outside the program's scope.

#### Reallocation of DEI grant - 10k

Due to changes in state policy, the existing DEI grant can no longer be administered under that title or framing. As a result, staff recommends one of two options: (1) rebranding the program under a new, compliant name with a refined scope aligned to workforce access or small business support; or (2) reallocating the funds to existing grant lines that are either fully expended or projected to be exhausted before year-end. The latter would ensure full use of available resources in 2025 and support ongoing demand in high-need programs such as Safety & Security, Accessibility, or Building Improvement grants.

#### **Catalent EZID Payments**

Staff has been in discussions with Catalent's accounting firm DuCharme, McMillian and Associates. Catalent has requested payment by ACH and staff is working on the details to accept payment. The BUEA staff has written a letter to First Financial Bank for account verification as a first step

**RE:** Emergency Loan Conversion Request for PALS

#### **Purpose**

This memo requests immediate BUEA Board consideration for converting the existing Rapid Response Fund (RRF) loan issued to People & Animal Learning Services (PALS) into a grant. The organization sustained catastrophic facility damage during recent severe weather, rendering it inoperable for the foreseeable future. Given the extent of loss and the critical role PALS plays in the community, staff recommends full loan forgiveness to support their recovery and continued service to Monroe County residents.

#### **Background**

PALS is a long-standing nonprofit based in Bloomington that provides equine-assisted programming for individuals of all ages and abilities. The organization is one of the few in south-central Indiana accredited by the Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship International (PATH Intl.) and the Certified Horsemanship Association (CHA). Since its founding in 2000, PALS has delivered over 21,000 hours of therapeutic and educational programming and camps.

In 2013, PALS purchased its facility at 7644 W. Elwren Road, expanding its capacity to house therapy horses, offer summer camps, and serve more clients. This facility sustained extensive damage during the most recent storm, and the organization is uncertain when operations will resume.

#### **Loan History**

PALS currently holds an RRF loan from the BUEA. Staff has verified their standing as a current loan recipient, and all payments are up to date. The remaining balance for the PALS RRF Loan is \$7,160.01 as of June 9, 2025.

#### Recommendation

In light of the organization's immediate hardship, its documented history of community impact, and its strong track record of service delivery, the staff recommends that the Board approve full conversion of the PALS RRF loan into a grant effective immediately. This action would provide urgent relief and reflect the BUEA's commitment to supporting recovery efforts for mission-driven organizations impacted by disaster.

#### **Next Steps**

If the Board is amenable, staff will follow the established loan conversion methodology:

- 1. **Issue a Letter of Intent to Convert** to PALS, outlining the Board's decision and detailing the conversion terms.
- 2. Request Documentation from the borrower, including a brief statement of impact.
- 3. Sign a Release of Promissory Note
- 4. Execute a Loan Modification Agreement, formally converting the outstanding loan balance into a grant.
- 5. **Update Internal Records** and provide final confirmation to the borrower upon completion of the conversion process.

This action can be initiated upon Board approval at the next meeting.





#### **Grant Applications**

#### **BUEA 2025 Zone Art Grants**

The Bloomington Urban Enterprise Association (BUEA) allocated \$50,000 for Zone Arts Grants for FY 2025, administered through the Bloomington Arts Commission's (BAC) annual Arts Project Grant Cycle. These grants support arts activities within the Urban Enterprise Zone that engage residents and businesses, enhance community identity, and increase access to the arts.

Projects were evaluated on capacity and community impact by BAC members and local arts professionals. Out of 37 total applications received, 12 Zone Arts Grants are recommended for funding, totaling \$27,983

#### The Forge - Safety and Security Grant - \$19,741.50

The Mill, a non-profit center for entrepreneurship that manages The Forge in the Trades District, is requesting emergency funding to repair 14 windows at The Forge damaged by vandalism on April 2, 2025. These repairs are essential to restoring safety, maintaining the building's appearance, and ensuring uninterrupted tenant improvements during a phase when tenants are not yet paying rent. Located within the Urban Enterprise Zone, The Forge hosts several enterprise zone companies and contributes to Bloomington's innovation economy. Supporting this project aligns with BUEA's mission to foster economic development and revitalization in the zone.

#### The Warehouse - Building Improvement Grants - \$25,000

The Warehouse, operated by Realife Media, Inc., is a non-profit community center located at 1525 S. Rogers Street in Bloomington, Indiana. Since 1990, the organization has employed 24 people and provides recreational and arts programming in a safe, relationship-centered environment. The Warehouse is requesting \$25,000 through the BUEA Business Building Improvement Grant Program to upgrade its kitchen electrical system by installing a 200-amp, three-phase panel. This upgrade will support the efficient use of commercial kitchen appliances, including refrigerators, ovens, steamers, and a new coffee bar for the Tiny Tots program. The project also includes overhead power installation and, if funds allow, a commercial dishwasher, which is being partially supported by a fundraiser hosted by the Bloomington Chamber of Commerce. The organization owns its facility, has not previously received a BUEA grant, and is prepared to match up to 50% of the total project cost. The proposed project is scheduled to begin on March 10, 2025, and be completed by March 31, 2025. Supporting documentation, including contractor quotes and photos of the existing kitchen, was submitted with the application.

#### Doug Hazen Insurance - Business Building Improvement Grant - \$10,000

Doug Hazen Insurance, active in the zone, reported serving 157 families with home or auto policies and managing 222 total policies, including 33 life insurance policies. They also carry 23 general liability policies for local businesses, many participating in the farmers' market and Food Truck Friday, though some owners live outside the zone.

The applicant partners with the City's HANDS Program and Habitat for Humanity, offering insurance education and supporting fundraising efforts. They are members of both the Bloomington Chamber of Commerce and the Bloomington Board of Realtors.

They recently faced an unexpected \$98,000 expense for interior building improvements, including window replacements and a stolen air conditioning unit, both tied to security issues in the area. The applicant emphasized that an active business presence can positively impact neighborhood conditions, citing their experience with Habitat projects.

This year, the BUEA has allocated \$50,000 for Zone Arts Grants, which the Bloomington Arts Commission has been entrusted to allot as part of its annual Arts Project Grant Cycle. The BUEA Zone Arts Grants are meant to support arts activities within the boundaries of the Bloomington Urban Enterprise Zone.

Funded projects must do one or more of the following for residents and businesses within the Urban Enterprise Zone:

- Facilitate involvement in arts and cultural activities
- Provide an opportunity to participate in the creative process
- Advance the quality and availability of the arts in the Zone
- Celebrate or enhance the identity of the Zone

As part of its annual Arts Project Grant Cycle, members of the Bloomington Arts Commission, along with community readers working locally in the arts, evaluate applications according to the following criteria:

- Capacity Does the project have a clear plan and outcomes, and a plan to achieve them? Does the artist/arts group have financial resources committed to the project outside of this grant?
- Community Impact Is the project addressing a community need? Does it engage in larger community dialogues? Does it reach out to or connect with the various communities that exist in Bloomington? Is the artist/arts group partnering with other organizations?

The BAC received a total of 37 Arts Project grant applications during 2025. Based on our evaluation, we recommend that the BUEA fund the following 12 Zone Arts Grants for a total of \$27,983:


