Minutes (Not Official: No quorum was present)

Meeting called to order at 4:00 p.m.

- I. Discussion of Health Information Exchange (HIE) project with Dr Todd Rowland and Dr Mike Sullivan
 - a. Todd Rowland [TR]: There are 4 Regional Health Information Organizations (RHIOs) in Indiana now.
 - i. The HIE has three main parts
 1. Data Exchange – Web portal to review lab results, xrays, clinical data. Looking at web standards and open source technologies to get a ‘quick win’.
 - a. Mike Sullivan [MS]: The focus is on communication between medical service providers.
 - b. TR: HIE can be a good use-case for the BDU Metronet concept and the local medical community
 2. High Speed network to move multi-megabyte files
 - a. National trend in RHIOs is distributed information stores where creators of data are stewards, but data is accessible to others. This arrangement is easier politically and centralized repositories.
 - b. TR: BDU opens up additional possibilities
 - i. HIE can become a showcase for Bloomington.
 - c. TR: HIE has some funding and can contribute to economic development
 - i. Physicians Foundation – to reduce barriers to e-records adoption.
 - ii. Federal HRSA Health Resources Services Administration – to support e-records infrastructure.
 1. In 2 years Paoli will have 95% e-record penetration
 - iii. \$60k in local physician investment in HIE
 - iv. MS: Almost 100% participation by local practices in HIE
 - d. TR: There’s a nationwide information architecture being created – a network of networks
 - i. MS: NHIN – Nationwide Health Information Networks
 - ii. TR: We anticipate Bloomington will be involved in one of several NHINs in phase two of NHIN expansion.
 - e. Rick Dietz [RD]: What State support are you seeing for the HIE?
 - i. TR: IN State Informatics Commission – just getting off the ground and have a lot of learning to do.
 - ii. Indiana State Medical Association
 - iii. State Legislators – Matt Pierce and Peggy Welch are involved.
 - f. RD: We have been talking with HIE for a couple of months informally – sharing information and maps.
 - i. The City is supportive of this project and will do what we can to help.
- II. City Network Upgrade
 - a. Rick Dietz: We are moving forward with a network upgrade plan with a probable final vote at the end of June.
 - b. Rick Routon: Buildout plan includes:
 - i. Connecting 4 City facilities to nearby existing BDU infrastructure
 - ii. New and relocated point to point wireless
 - iii. Upgrade to DSL for several facilities
 - c. Master BDU Map discussion
 - i. RR: City uses no aerial fiber
 - ii. RD: Few city facilities to the north, some prospects to the South and Utilities water treatments plants are further out still.

- iii. RD: Proposed Conduit on map largely follows future road and sidewalk projects.
- iv. RR: County conduit is investment with same philosophy and standards as City.
- v. Mark Bruhn: IU may have an interest in getting to Ivy Tech with I-Light
- vi. MB: IU will be running fiber from Fee Lane / HPER building to Telecom Hotel
- d. HIE Map Discussion
 - i. RD: BDU is nearby many health facilities; some are on the ring and many are nearby on 2nd Street.
- e. RD: we are working to operationalize Strategic Plan recommendations, including making the BDU available to 3rd parties beyond the County and MCCSC.
