**Notice of the Rescheduling of the next Regular Session (to March 23rd) and
Committee of the Whole (to March 30th)**

No Meeting on March 16th – Spring Break

The Council moved the Regular Session from next week (March 16th) to the following week (March 23rd) because some of you and members of the public will be gone or busy with families over Spring Break. Also, please note that the Council moved the Committee of the Whole from March 23rd to March 30th.

Ord 05-08 will greet you on your return with additional amendments beyond those submitted by Councilmember Mayer. At this point, it appears the amendments, which may be combined, will address the following issues. Please let me know if there are other issues you also feel need to be addressed.

- Section 3 – Assistance - Clarify that “interlocal agreements” are excluded from this ordinance and, perhaps combine subsidies that fall below the \$25,000 monetary threshold when they have been separated without a legitimate and compelling business or public purpose;
- Section 4 – Amount of the Living Wage - Clarify that each year of the two-year phase-in for not-for-profits is triggered by awards over the \$25,000 monetary threshold for coverage under this ordinance;
- Section 6 – Obligations of Covered Employers – modify the records employers must keep in order to protect personal information, comply with federal medical privacy standards, and address general privacy concerns;
- Section 8 – Waivers – clarify that the waiver for tax abatement recipients applies when the estimated value of the tax deduction is significantly higher than the tax deduction the recipient is eligible to receive (rather than actually receives);
- Section 9 – Annual Reports – perhaps modify the reporting requirement based upon a weighing of the costs of gathering and the benefits of receiving the information;
- Section 11 – Effective Date – make the ordinance effective on January 1, 2006 in its entirety (not merely the Assistance).
