Council President Ruff gave the Agenda Summation.

AGENDA SUMMATION

It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes from December 7, 2016 and December 14, 2016.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The motion to approve the minutes was approved by voice vote.

REPORTS

Councilmember Dave Rollo spoke about the effects and current state of climate change, and stressed the importance of taking action.

- COUNCIL MEMBERS

Councilmember Isabel Piedmont-Smith spoke about the upcoming inauguration, and encouraged people to look at the website [inauguratetherevolution.com](http://inauguratetherevolution.com). She provided details about an upcoming march and rally, noting that the events would be a chance to stand together for social justice, inclusion, and peace.

Councilmember Steve Volan talked about parliamentary procedure and the structure of the organizational meeting. He encouraged those people who wanted to speak to speak during the public comment portion of the meeting.

Councilmember Dorothy Granger wished everyone a Happy New Year and said that she hoped for peace.

Councilmember Tim Mayer said Happy New Year and hoped that 2017 would be better than the previous year.

Councilmember Susan Sandberg commented that there were many opportunities for citizen involvement, and noted a march on Washington that she planned to attend on January 21, 2017. She encouraged others to do the same and reminded folks to be active and to be vocal.

Ruff thanked all of his council colleagues for their support during his tenure as president over the last year. He thanked the Clerk's office, the Mayor's office, and the Council staff as well.

Bethany Emenheiser, HAND, informed the Council that the Matlock Heights Conservation District had held its vote recently, and would elevate to a historic district in February.

- The MAYOR AND CITY OFFICES

The Council opened two proposals regarding conservation measures through a Guaranteed Savings Contract from Johnson Controls and Energy System Group.

Several members of the public (Penny Caudill, Claire Detrich, Alicia Sweet, Sarah Cahillane, Jackie Warren, Chris Abert, Steven Leszyk, and Shelia Evans) spoke about the Indiana Recovery Alliance (IRA), which was a harm reduction project aimed toward protecting people from the negative effects of addiction, homelessness, incarceration, sex work, and mental health issues.
